Teacher's Special Instructions

We start with a lesson on the Hebrew language. We will both write and speak Hebrew.

We do this for two reasons:

1) All students are at the same level in learning a new language, and they enjoy it.

2) It gives the students a chance to learn biblical truths embedded in the original language of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). Start by pointing out they are used to reading from left to right, but Hebrew reads from right to left.

They also will need to write Hebrew from right to left.

New Hebrew words transliterated

Vayak'hel (He gathered)

Pekudei (Counting)

Lev (Heart)

Kovod (Glory)

Materials and Vocabulary:

- a. White board, black board or large easel and paper
- b. Markers
- c. Handouts or writing paper for the students
- d. Pens or pencils for the students

e. The words used on their Hebrew writing pages are all words that are related to each individual lesson. Generally, a Hebrew word is chosen from the lesson and emphasized each week, both to teach character and increase understanding of the concepts being taught. New words will be in the box on the upper right of this page. Various names of God will also be taught in Hebrew.

Preparation:

- a. Choose 2 or 3 Hebrew words from the Hebrew writing page(s). On the board, write the words in English and in the transliterated form given in the left column of the Hebrew writing page(s).
- b. Leave space to write the word in Hebrew.
- c. Explain that the letters they see on the page are written in book print like they might see on a sign, or that they would print themselves.

Procedure:

- a. Demonstrate the writing procedure of two or three Hebrew words on the board. Have the students follow your directions on their work pages. Be sure to point out the special features of each letter.
- b. Then have the students try a few words on their own, or complete the rest of the page. The ability to finish the whole exercise will depend on how much time you have. (2 to 5 minutes time is needed to finish the page.)

Games/Activities: Normally games are played after children's work pages are complete.

For this lesson work on learning the Shema. You will find it on page 185.




Have you ever built or made something with your family or friends, like a model airplane, a tent, a sand castle or cupcakes? Its fun to work together and see the results when you finish your project. Well, today we're going to see that the children of Israel built a Tabernacle. When they finish, we will see something amazing happened. See if you can find what was special about the ones who helped with this project.



And the children of Israel began to build. All who had willing hearts brought all the gifts the Lord had asked for – gifts of gold, silver, skins, blue, purple and scarlet thread, linen and acacia wood and special stones. Then the LORD called for the people who had special skills to take these gifts and make the tabernacle. And He took those willing hearts and filled them with skill, so they could do all the weaving and building and sewing and engraving that needed to be done. (Ex. 35:5-10 and 35:21-35)

Do you have a heart that is willing to do work for the Lord? If you do, He will give you work and the skills to do it. What is in your heart to do for the LORD?

Then the children of Israel completed all the work just as the LORD commanded and they brought it to Moses. Moses looked at all they had done, and he blessed them, as they had done the work just as the LORD commanded them. (Ex. 39:42,43)



Now the LORD made an announcement saying, On the first day of the 1st month bring all that has been made and assemble the Tabernacle. And the people brought the boards and bars and pillars and sockets and ram skins, and put everything together. Then the furniture was set in just the right places. Then came the anointing oil, and the priests washed and put on their holy garments. And the Tabernacle was raised up! (Ex. 39:32-40:17)



Do you know what happened next? THE LORD MOVED IN!!! How do you know that is true? Well, listen and <u>imagine</u> what this looked like: Then the *cloud covered the tabernacle* and the <u>glory</u> of the LORD filled the Tabernacle. The glory of the LORD was so amazing and so powerful that Moses was not able to go in! (Ex. 40:34)

Whenever the cloud moved, the children of Israel moved where it went! When the cloud stopped, they stopped and lived at that place. Wherever they went, the cloud was with them in the day and the pillar of fire was over the Tabernacle at night. They knew that God was in the cloud and the fire, and because they could see the cloud and the fire, they knew God was always with them. (Ex. 40:34-38)

You can talk about why you think this is amazing!

But as time went on, even though God did so many amazing things for the children of Israel, they did not obey Him. They went their own way, and they polluted God's name. (Ez. 36:16-22)

What would God do about His children behaving this way?

God's love is so great that even though He did scatter His children all over the world, He also made a promise to them saying, I will take you and give you your own land, and I will clean you from all your sins, and I will give you a new heart and put My Spirit in you and cause you to do what I have taught you! Wow! What an amazing God. He would put His own Spirit in you. Why is this so important? (Ezekiel 36:24-27)

Just think about how amazing this is. When God's very own Spirit is in you, that means He is ALWAYS WITH YOU. The children of Israel had the cloud and the fire always showing them God's presence was with them. And now, when we follow Yeshua (Jesus) we have His Spirit right inside of us.



Listen to what Yeshua (Jesus) said: I am with you always, even to the end of the age! (Matthew 28:20b)

How does knowing God's Spirit is in you and that Yeshua (Jesus) will never leave you, help you feel safe? How does knowing these things about Yeshua (Jesus) help you to obey His Words?

TORAH (God's Teachings / Laws) Exodus 35:5-10 NKJV)

⁵ 'Take from among you an offering to the LORD. Whoever *is* of a willing heart, let him bring it as an offering to the LORD: gold, silver, and bronze; ⁶ blue, purple, and scarlet *thread*, fine linen, and goats' *hair;*⁷ ram skins dyed red, badger skins, and acacia wood; ⁸ oil for the light, and spices for the anointing oil and for the sweet incense; ⁹ onyx stones, and stones to be set in the ephod and in the breastplate.

- ²² They came, <u>both men and women</u>, <u>as many as had a</u> <u>willing heart</u>, <u>and</u> brought earrings and nose rings, rings and necklaces, ... *made* an offering of gold to the LORD.
- ²³ And <u>every man</u>, <u>with whom was found blue</u>, <u>purple</u>, <u>and scarlet thread</u>, fine linen, and goats' <u>hair</u>, red skins of rams, <u>and badger skins</u>, <u>brought them</u>.
- ²⁴ Everyone who offered an offering of silver or bronze brought the LORD's offering. And everyone with whom was found acacia wood for any work of the service, brought *it*.
- ²⁵ <u>All the women who were gifted artisans spun yarn with their hands</u>, and brought what they had spun, of blue, purple, *and* scarlet, and fine linen. ²⁶ <u>And all the women whose hearts stirred</u> with wisdom spun yarn of goats' *hair*.
- ²⁷ The rulers brought onyx stones, and the stones to be set in the ephod and in the breastplate, ²⁸ and spices and oil for the light, for the anointing oil, and for the sweet incense.
- ²⁹ The children of Israel brought a freewill offering to the LORD, all the men and women whose hearts were willing to bring *material* for all kinds of work which the LORD, by the hand of Moses, had commanded to be done.
- ³⁰ And Moses said to the children of Israel, "See, the LORD has called by name Bezalel the son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah; ³¹ and He has filled him with the Spirit of God, in

wisdom and understanding, in knowledge and all manner of workmanship, 32 to design artistic works, to work in gold and silver







and bronze, ³³ in cutting jewels for setting, in carving wood, and to work in all manner of artistic workmanship.

³⁴ "And <u>He has put in his heart the ability to teach</u>, *in* him and Aholiab the son of Ahisamach, of the tribe of Dan. ³⁵ <u>He has filled them with skill to do all manner of work</u> of the engraver and the designer and the tapestry maker, in blue, purple, and scarlet *thread*, and fine linen, and of the weaver—those who do every work and those who design artistic works.

TORAH: (God's Teachings / Laws) Exodus 39:42-43 (NKJV)

⁴² According to all that the LORD had commanded Moses, so the children of Israel did all the work. ⁴³ Then Moses looked over all the work, and indeed they had done it; as the LORD had commanded, just so they had done it. And Moses blessed them.
