Teacher's Special Instructions

We start with a lesson on the Hebrew language. We will both write and speak Hebrew. We do this for two reasons:

- 1) All students are at the same level in learning a new language, and they enjoy it.
- 2) It gives the students a chance to learn biblical truths embedded in the original language of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). Start by pointing out they are used to reading from left to right, but Hebrew reads from right to left. They also will need to write Hebrew from right to left.

Materials and Vocabulary:

- a. White board, black board or large easel and paper
- b. Markers
- c. Handouts or writing paper for the students
- d. Pens or pencils for the students

e. The words used on their Hebrew writing pages are all words that are related to each individual lesson. Generally, a Hebrew word is chosen from the lesson and emphasized each week, both to teach character and increase understanding of the concepts being taught. New words will be in the box on the upper right of this page. Various names of God will also be taught in Hebrew.

Preparation:

- a. Choose 2 or 3 Hebrew words from the Hebrew writing page(s). On the board, write the words in English and in the transliterated form given in the left column of the Hebrew writing page(s).
- b. Leave space to write the word in Hebrew.
- c. Explain that the letters they see on the page are written in book print like they might see on a sign, or that they would print themselves.

Procedure:

- a. Demonstrate the writing procedure of two or three Hebrew words on the board. Have the students follow your directions on their work pages. Be sure to point out the special features of each letter.
- b. Then have the students try a few words on their own, or complete the rest of the page. The ability to finish the whole exercise will depend on how much time you have. (2 to 5 minutes time is needed to finish the page.)

Games/Activities: Normally games are played after children's work pages are complete. Discuss why we need to know who our God is and go over that page first. See: 13 Attributes of God "Find the Transliteration" on page 63.



Bo – Come ►13 Exodus. 10:1-13:16; Jeremiah. 46:13-28; John1:29&3:1; I John 1:14

Last week we saw seven plagues that God had brought on Egypt. He wanted His people released so they could serve him. But Pharaoh resisted God and would not let God's people go.

God wanted Moses to tell his son and his grandchildren all that He had done, so that people would know that He is LORD! Do you ever talk about the great things God has done? You know --- you can begin to practice doing that even today!

And now we will see that the plagues are not over. Moses and Aaron again went into Pharaoh saying, Let My people go, that they may serve Me, or I will send so many locusts they will cover the earth and eat all that is left. Pharaoh tried to discourage them by saying, The LORD had better be with you when I let you and your children go, for evil is ahead of you! Then he added that he would only allow the men to go and have a feast to the LORD. Sometimes there may be people who want to discourage you or make you fearful, but don't worry about them. Do what Moses did and keep doing what God tells you to do. (Ex.10:3-11)

After Pharaoh said these things Moses stretched out his rod over the land, and God sent so many locusts they covered the land just as He had warned. This plague was so terrible, Pharaoh begged Aaron and Moses to pray for God to forgive him, and they did pray. God heard them and caused a wind to blow all the locusts into the sea. But again Pharaoh's heart was hard, and he did not let God's people go! (Ex. 10:12-20)



So God sent the 9th plague of darkness – darkness so thick and black it could be **felt!** No one in Egypt left their house for 3 days because <u>they couldn't see</u> through this terrible darkness, BUT there was light in the houses of the children of Israel. At this point, Pharaoh decided that Moses could also take the children to worship the LORD, but he said they must leave their livestock. Moses said – NO WAY! The cows and the sheep and the donkeys must go with us. Pharaoh sharply replied, Get away from me. If you ever see my face again, you will die. Moses replied, I will never see your face again. (Ex. 10:21-29)

God told Moses that He would bring one more plague called the Passover. But before Passover came He wanted the Israelites to ask their Egyptian neighbors for silver and gold. God knew that they would need this later.

Passover was to take place in the first month of the year. On the 10th of this month, a lamb without any blemish at all was to be brought into each house. After 4 days, on the 14th, all of the Israelites were to <u>kill their lambs</u> at twilight and put the **blood of the lamb** on their doorposts and lintels of their houses. Then they were to roast the lamb in fire and eat it. This is called the LORD'S Passover. (Ex.12:1-11)

Life and death were in the power of the blood of the passover lamb. If the blood of the lamb was on



the doorposts, everyone inside that house would live. The blood of the lamb would save their lives! For God had warned that he would pass over Egypt and **KILL all the firstborn** – both man and beast, BUT when He saw the blood on the doorposts, he would pass over and, no one in those homes would die! And that is exactly what happened. **The children of Israel obeyed and no one died.** But NO ONE in Egypt obeyed and there was a great cry in that land because in every single house someone died! (Ex. 12:30)

Finally, Pharoah called for Moses and Aaron saying, Go – you, your children and all you have and serve the LORD. (Ex. 12:31) And it came to pass at the end of 430 years – all the **armies of the LORD** went out from the land of Egypt.

Did you notice that God called the children of Israel His army? God wanted His own people to be His army. Are you part of the LORD'S army? How do you get in His army?

God reminded Jeremiah the prophet that even great armies who have valiant men – strong, fighting men – but men in armies who are against God - they will be swept away! They will not stand because the LORD drives them away! (Jere.46:14,15,20,21) Those who go against the LORD will suffer consequences. Even Israel went into captivity because they did not obey Him. (Jere. 46:27,28) But Israel is not to fear even when God disciplines them, because God reminds them, I am with you; you shall return, have rest and be at ease; No one shall make you afraid! (Jere. 46:27,28)

Well, remember how the blood of the Passover lamb saved the children of Israel from death? In the Brit Hadashah, we learn that Yeshua is the Lamb of God. – WOW! That is really big! The blood of Yeshua, the Lamb of God, takes away your sins and gives eternal life. The Lamb of God is His Son, Yeshua. (Jn.1:29) John 3:16 says: For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have **everlasting life**!



Yeshua is the lamb of God

When you believe in Yeshua, your sins are forgiven, you have everlasting life, the Spirit of God lives in you, and you are then in God's army. You are able to fight what comes against you.

I John 1:14 says......I have written to you young men because you are strong, and the Word of God abides in you. And you have overcome the wicked one.

Ephesians 6:10,11 says: Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

When the children of Israel left Egypt, God knew that they would have battles ahead of them, but He encouraged them by calling them His Army! When we accept Yeshua as our Savior, God knows that we will have battles, but He tells us that we are strong, the Word of God lives in us, and we have already overcome the wicked one – we are able to stand against what he tries to bring against us – We belong to God! – The blood of His own Son protects us.

The Hebrew word for blood is



The dalet means door and the mem means water.

Blood is the "water" that flows through you to give you life.

When you go through the Door that is Yeshua, asking for forgiveness of sins, He forgives you, and the blood of Yeshua gives life to your spirit. The blood of the Passover Lamb gave life to those who applied it to their doorposts. Yeshua is the door!

The blood of Yeshua, the Passover Lamb, still gives life!

⁸ The meat must be eaten that same night. It must be roasted over a fire and eaten with bitter herbs and unleavened bread.

⁹ Don't eat any of it raw or boiled but roast the whole animal over a fire. ¹⁰ Don't leave any of it until morning. Anything left over in the morning must be burned up. ¹¹ This is how you should be dressed when you eat it: with your belt on, your sandals on your feet, and your shepherd's staff in your hand. You must eat it in a hurry. It is *Yahweh's* Passover.

¹² "On that same night I will go throughout Egypt and kill every firstborn male, both human and animal. I will severely punish all the gods of Egypt, because I am *Yahweh*.

But the blood on your houses will be a sign for your protection. When I see the blood,
I will pass over you. Nothing will touch or destroy you when I strike Egypt.




