#### **Teacher's Special Instructions**

We start with a lesson on the Hebrew language. We will both write and speak Hebrew.

We do this for two reasons:

1) All students are at the same level in learning a new language, and they enjoy it.

2) It gives the students a chance to learn biblical truths embedded in the original language of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). Start by pointing out they are used to reading from left to right, but Hebrew reads from right to left.

They also will need to write Hebrew from right to left.

New Hebrew words transliterated

Re'eh (See)

Ahnahg (To take exquisite delight in)

Lamad (Teach)

#### Materials and Vocabulary:

a. White board, black board or large easel and paper

b. Markers

c. Handouts or writing paper for the students

d. Pens or pencils for the students

e. The words used on their Hebrew writing pages are all words that are related to each individual lesson. Generally, a Hebrew word is chosen from the lesson and emphasized each week, both to teach character and increase understanding of the concepts being taught. New words will be in the box on the upper right of this page. Various names of God will also be taught in Hebrew.

#### Preparation:

- a. Choose 2 or 3 Hebrew words from the Hebrew writing page(s). On the board, write the words in English and in the transliterated form given in the left column of the Hebrew writing page(s).
- b. Leave space to write the word in Hebrew.
- c. Explain that the letters they see on the page are written in book print like they might see on a sign, or that they would print themselves.

#### Procedure:

- a. Demonstrate the writing procedure of two or three Hebrew words on the board. Have the students follow your directions on their work pages. Be sure to point out the special features of each letter. Be sure to write from right to Left.
- b. Then have the students try a few words on their own, or complete the rest of the page. The ability to finish the whole exercise will depend on how much time you have. (2 to 5 minutes time is needed to finish the page.)



Some of the Lord's commandments and blessings had to do with money. God said to give Him a tithe – a tenth of all the money you make. He said to do this so we would learn to fear Him – honor and reverence him - for all we

have comes from Him. He said take care of the Levites, the children without fathers, the strangers and the women whose husbands have died. And when you give to God REJOICE! (Deut. 14:22-29) He said, The poor will always be among you, so I command you open your hand wide to your brother, to the poor and the needy in your land. Remember to release your brothers from paying you back what you have lent every 7th year, and when your servant is released in the seventh year supply him liberally – give him plenty of what the LORD HAS GIVEN YOU, and the LORD your God will bless you in all you do! (Deut.15:11-18)



The prophet Isaiah tells us why it's so important to be taught by the LORD. When we teach our children to obey the LORD, He gives us peace, He takes fear away, terror does not come near us and no weapon made to hurt you will succeed. And God gives us all good things freely! He just says, *COME*! If you have no money, just come – He will feed you and give you what you need and let your soul be delighted in


abundance! Our job is to listen and obey, and our souls shall live! (Isa. 54:13-55:3) Do you sense the joy God wants you to have?

The Hebrew word: (ahnahg) (gimmel, noon, ayin) means to



take exquisite delight in – like jumping up and down because your joy is overflowing. This comes when we understand that life comes from the Spirit of God! That is the Hebrew meaning of those 3 letters!





In the days when the church was just beginning, it was being greatly persecuted, and believers were scattered to many places. In all the places where they were scattered, they told people about Yeshua the Messiah. Philip, a believer, went down to Samaria and preached. Multitudes of people there listened and saw the miracles which He did, and they believed in Yeshua. When people understand and believe that life comes from the Spirit of God, there is exquisite delight – JOY!



# TORAH (God's Instructions/Laws) Deuteronomy 11:24-25 (NLT)

<sup>24</sup> Wherever you set foot, that land will be yours. Your frontiers will stretch from the wilderness in the south to Lebanon in the north, and from the Euphrates River in the east to the Mediterranean Sea in the west.

<sup>25</sup> No one will be able to stand against you, for the LORD your God will cause the people to fear and dread you, as he promised, wherever you go in the whole land.

# TORAH (God's Instructions/Laws) Deuteronomy 11:26-28 (NKJV)



"Behold, I set before you today a blessing and a curse: <sup>27</sup> the blessing, if you obey the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you today; <sup>28</sup> and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn aside from the way which I command you today, to go after other gods which you have not known.

## TORAH (God's Instructions/Laws) Deuteronomy 14:22-29 (NLT)

<sup>22</sup> "You shall truly tithe all the increase of your grain that the field produces year by year. <sup>23</sup> And you shall eat before the LORD your God, in the place where He chooses to make His name abide, the tithe of your grain and your new wine and your oil, of the firstborn of your herds and your flocks, that you may learn to fear the LORD your God always. <sup>24</sup> But if the journey is too long for you, so that you are not able to carry *the tithe, or* if the place where the LORD your God chooses to put His name is too far from you, when the LORD your God has blessed you, <sup>25</sup> then you shall exchange *it* for money, take the money in your hand, and go to the place which the LORD your God chooses.

<sup>26</sup> And you shall spend that money for whatever your heart desires: for oxen or sheep, for wine or similar drink, for whatever your heart desires; you shall eat there before the LORD your God, and you shall rejoice, you and your household.





<sup>12</sup> "If your brother, a Hebrew man, or a Hebrew woman, is sold to you and serves you six years, then in the seventh year you shall let him go free from you. <sup>13</sup> And when you send him away free from you, you shall not let him go away empty-handed; <sup>14</sup> you shall supply him liberally from your flock, from your threshing floor, and from your winepress. *From what* the LORD your God has blessed you with, you shall give to him.


