How This Curriculum is Designed

Vision of this Curriculum

**To encapsulate and condense prominent points of each week's Torah Portion (God's Teaching/Law), Haftarah (Prophets and Writings) and Brit Chadashah (New Testament) so they can be read and understood in just a few minutes by the young and young at heart

**To help each reader incorporate the Word they are reading into their lives

**To help each reader see how the Bible is connected from cover to cover - It is not two separate books.

**To introduce Hebrew words and understandings into each lesson and build Hebrew vocabulary.

Mission Statement

Our prayer is that the readers of this curriculum will be active participants in the process of relating the Word of God to their own lives. To assist in this process, questions are peppered throughout the "Story" to encourage all to apply and personalize the Word. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we hope each reader will be encouraged that they can read, understand and see how the Bible relates to their lives. With this purpose in mind, the Biblical text is used on the Work Pages.

Hebrew words and definitions are included in the lessons along with Hebrew writing practice to expand Hebrew vocabulary. In keeping the original language of the Bible in mind, hopefully, the Word will be seen through the Israeli-centric, Middle Eastern culture in which it was written. It is a thoroughly Jewish book.

The ultimate goal of this curriculum is to keep all involved, discovering the wonders of His Word, and that His Word will create a thirst in each one both to love Him and to walk in His ways!

Teacher's Lesson Flow Pages

You will notice that the various components making up the Teachers' Lesson Flow pages are laid out in a circle. We've adopted this circular way of teaching and thinking as it is the biblical way of teaching and thinking. In Greek thinking, time is laid out like a straight line, and events are checked off as they happen, as though they are finished and will never happen again.

But the biblical way of thinking about time is depicted in **Isaiah 46:9 and 10** where it states:

"Remember the former things of old, for I am God, and there is no other;

I am God, and there is none like Me, declaring the end from the beginning,

and from ancient times things that are not yet done;

saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure;"

The Lord declaring in Isaiah that to understand the end, it is necessary to go back to the beginning! Time is not a flat line, but rather circular in nature. Events are connected like the minutes on a clock that begin at 12:00, then second by second, or event by event during the hour, the long clock hand circles back to the beginning point at the same time moving forward one hour – each second and event connected to the previous one.

"As Yeshua (Jesus) said, "But as the days of Noah were, so shall also

the coming of the Son of Man be." Matthew 24:37

Again, we see this concept of going back to what was – in the days of Noah, - to see what will be in the future – at the Lord's return! The circular relation of time and events is portrayed.

It was with this concept in mind that the Teacher's Lesson Flow Pages were designed.

1. We begin with Praise to our God on the Praise Page as the Word says: "Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to

Him, and bless His name." Psalm 100.

- A. During this year, the students will learn 7 Hebrew Praise Words and their meanings and significance. We begin in Genesis with the Hebrew word "Hallel". If you take the Hebrew letters of the word "Hallel" individually, they mean <u>"Behold! the tongue, the tongue is made for praise."</u> To practice praising the LORD, we have the children speak out their praise and provide a space where the children can write their praise.
- B. We read and briefly discuss one of the Fruit of the Spirit using the definition provided. That specific Fruit of the Spirit can be included as it comes up in discussion regarding the lesson and as it applies to the lives of the children. To help the children apply the Fruit of the Spirit we ask questions and discuss how they will use this at home, school, during play time and with their family this week. Another way to approach learning the Fruit of the Spirit is to ask how it feels or what happens when you don't have this Fruit of the Spirit functioning in your life.

- C. Then the Life Verse is read and a song or a game can be used to practice the verse 2 or 3 times. Use any familiar "nursery rhyme song tunes" inserting the words to the Bible verse. You can also write the words of the verse on the board, have the children say all the words, then erase 1 to 3 words each time they say it, until all the words are gone and they can still say the verse.
- 2. We then move on to a Hebrew writing lesson. More thorough directions are given regarding these lessons on the Teacher's Special Instructions pages prior to each lesson.
- 3. The Story: At this point the story is read. The story is a compilation of the *Torah portion (God's Teachings / Law)*, the *Haftarah (Prophets and Writings)* and the *Brit Chadashah (New Testament)* which are woven together in story form. Seeing how the three areas of Scripture are connected is always exciting. It takes approximately 5 minutes to read the story.

You can use great flexibility in the reading of the story. You can stop at any point and discuss what the story is about, asking questions like:

*Are the people in the story doing what God has said to do?

*What are possible consequences for the actions of the people? Etc.

The questions are endless and help keep the kids drawn into the story. You may want to have them act out a scene, or maybe they could do a pantomime as the story is being read.

Give the children words to listen for as the story is read, and when they hear these word, they should STAND! Children's bodies are made to move. Physical involvement is a good thing. With physical involvement they can also practice self-control by following directions and only doing as they have been directed. Be sure to commend those following the directions given. For instance, the team following direction gets extra points on the board or extra turn or ??? You can be creative with this!

Be as creative as you would like while keeping the children involved with the story and the characters in the stories. You will note that the script also has questions woven into the story as concepts unfold.

4. Lesson Pages

- A. When you get to the quoted Scriptures in the Children's Lesson Pages, it is always important to compare the Word with the answers that were given during the story time. Of course, making any clarifications in a positive way. Only the Word contains the truth, and our great desire is to train the children to always go to God's Word for the truth, regardless of how good an answer may sound or who may have given the answer.
- B. Moving into the **Children's Work Pages**, we begin with the **Torah Portion** (God's Teachings / Law). The main points covered in the lesson are listed
- C. Following the Torah portion and connected to it is the Haftarah (Prophets and Writings). The connecting points are listed that will be addressed.
- D. The teaching concludes with the **Brit Chadashah (New Testament)**. Again, the main points to be covered are listed, and connect with the Torah portion and Haftarah portion.

Covering these three portions of Scripture shows us the *interaction of the Most High God with people* – His love, care, involvement, His correction and blessings are all woven into these stories. And they show how with unique similarities, the Word of God is amazingly woven together. We see the Old Testament and the New Testament are all one book with one message from cover to cover. It is exciting to "connect the dots" and to discover that our God does not change; He is the same yesterday, today and forever!

Games/Activities

It is important to keep the children involved in the lessons. *God's Word is not a lecture, it is alive and vibrant – full of action and mystery, battles, angels, victories, losses and love – bursting with true accounts of God interacting with people!* We want to teach this amazing Word with great excitement and enthusiasm. With this in mind, games and activities are included with each lesson both for fun and to re-enforce concepts presented. You will find general games that can be played with any lesson on pages 255-256.

It is the goal of this curriculum to pass on a love for God's Word and with the help of the Holy Spirit to create a desire in each child to keep coming back for more. With this goal in mind, we encourage you to weave games, skits, songs, flagging and various other activities into your lessons. In other words, HAVE FUN!

The more involvement the children have in the lessons, the more they will learn and love the Word!

Why We Include Hebrew


Moses used Hebrew to write the first five books of the Bible. The prophets

wrote their revelations from God in Hebrew! Hebrew is the original language of the Bible! If you want the purest meaning of a text, it is always best to read a book in the original language as every translation, regardless of how carefully it is done, will vary somewhat from the original. Why is that the case? Because words and cultures in which they are spoken will carry meaning that simply cannot be adequately conveyed in another language. In this curriculum, we go back to Hebrew to look at some of the Hebrew names of God and some of the original words used in the stories to give depth of understanding and shed light on the original words and meanings.

Hebrew helps us understand the Bible from the Hebraic, Middle Eastern perspectives and Jewish culture in which it was written. Without this understanding, we can veer off and assign understandings that were not intended. Certainly, God's Word endures to every generation and is for all people, and at the same time, it is a thoroughly Jewish book and needs to be understood through this lense. When we attempt to understand this Book through a Western/Greek mindset, problems can arise. Hebrew helps steer us in the direction of the original intention.

Every letter in Hebrew is **alive** and **loaded with meanings**! Unlike English, Hebrew letters not only make a sound, but they represent various "pictures"!

Each letter represents several pictures, and even one, 3 letter word can relate a story or concept. Let me give you an example.



when you combine the meanings of each of these letters, you see the **SIGN** would be **God nailed to the cross**!! Isn't that incredible?!! The good news in one three letter Hebrew word!

English translations of the Bible quote Jesus (Yeshua) as saying, I am the Alpha and the Omega...... Alpha and Omega represent the Greek translation and refer to the first and last letters in the Hebrew alphabet.

But in Hebrew, the letters Alpha and Omega would be Aleph and Tav!

Aleph and Tav are the first and last letters of the Hebrew alphabet.

Yeshua is saying – *I am the living Word* – every letter of the Hebrew aleph-bet *comes alive in Him*. Every word consisting of the Hebrew alphabet from the Aleph to the Tav *is about Him* – *The Word that is alive*! (John1:1, 1:14)

Your enthusiasm for learning this language will rub off on the children you teach. You will be encouraged and love seeing their joy in learning the language of the Bible.

God bless you as you teach the next generation of God's children.

Information for Teaching and Learning Hebrew

When you begin the adventure of learning Hebrew, it is important to realize that

Hebrew is rich, dynamic and alive with meaning. The Hebrew Aleph-bet differs

greatly from the English alpha-bet. In English, every letter represents a sound or possibly even two or three sounds. In English, letters only represent sounds. In English, there are consonants and vowels.

As in English, every letter of the Hebrew Aleph-bet makes a sound. The sound it makes is the first sound of its name. There are a few letters that can make two sounds. The sound changes of these letters will be the result of a "dot" located within or on top of the letter. However, in Hebrew there are no vowels. A system of vowel points is used to indicate the vowel sound that may accompany any letter.

Out of the 22 letter Hebrew Aleph-bet, there are 2 silent letters:

aleph ______ and ayin ______. These letters' sounds will vary according to the vowel points as used in individual words. As single letters though, they make no sound.

This curriculum does not address vowel points, but the word will be transliterated in the margin for your convenience. The transliteration will be the English pronunciation of the Hebrew word.

Every Hebrew letter also has a numerical value. You will find the list of the letters and their numerical value in Appendix A page 236-240 and will be applied to specific lessons.


Every Hebrew letter has a variety of pictures and meanings that it can represent. A three letter word can have a specific meaning and have a sentence to a paragraph in additional meaning within the three letters. This will be demonstrated throughout this curriculum. Basic picture meanings are listed on page 236-240.

If the Hebrew writing pages are used consistently, a recognition of the words used from week to week will occur. The children begin to recognize them quite quickly.

A Little More About Hebrew


It is good to be aware that there are a few letters in Hebrew that look very similar, but they make different sounds. So recognizing the minor differences is very important.

The following are letters that have sound changes because of a "dot":



You can see that the <u>above letters change sounds according to the position of the dot</u> in or above the letter.

There are no "capital" letters in Hebrew, but five letters have a different "Final Form" referred to as the Sofit form. This means they are the last letter in a word, their form will change. The final, or sofit forms are as follows:



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Knowing the "dots" change the sound a letter makes and recognizing the final forms of the above letters is a big step in beginning to understand Hebrew.

For beginners in Hebrew we teach the Hebrew letter, it's corresponding number and the matching commandment. The following pages show the connections. You can practice these in a number of ways.

- 1. Practice saying the letters and numbers out loud.
 - a. Boys say the Hebrew letter name and girls say the corresponding number.
 - b. Together, they say the commandment that goes with the number and letter.
- 2. Sing the 10 Commandment Song
- 3. Cut the separate components of the "10 Word" page into its separate components: letters, numbers and commandments. Mix all the above parts and have contests with teams or with individuals. The first ones to arrange the parts correctly, win.
- 3. Fill in the missing names on the "10 Word" page.
- 4. Practice all the letters on the Aleph-Bet Activity Page and learn the sound and numerical value of each letter. Be sure to practice the sound each letter makes.

Welcome to this wonderful world of getting to know the holy language!

Teacher's Instructions for the Praise Page

Beginning the teaching time with praise helps set the mood for the entire session. During this time we want to help the students develop an attitude of praise to the Lord at all times. As David said, "I will bless the LORD at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth." (Psalm 34:1) Encouraging the students to actively participate in this praise is an important role of the teacher. Praise can be quiet, while you are seated, and praise can occur all during the day while you are up and busy physically. Praise can happen in groups, and it can flow forth from you during the day when you are by yourself. Psalms 51:15 states, "And my mouth shall show forth Your praise." We are told of groups praising the LORD in II Chronicles 23:5, "...4,000 praised the Lord with musical instruments..."

Praise lifts our focus to the Lord and reminds us of His greatness and faithfulness to us. Even when we are having a "bad" day, praise lifts our spirits and our hope, for when we are praising God, our attention goes from our circumstances to the God of all hope who is loving and kind and whose mercy endures forever. Let's help our students develop an outlook that embraces and expresses praise for our awesome God!

Following are suggestions to encourage the students to become involved in their praise for the Lord:

1. <u>Practice praising</u> the Lord, yourself. When the teacher practices the habit of praising the Lord, the teaching becomes genuine!

2. Have the students stand or walk or raise their hands, etc. as you begin the lesson on praise. It is good to have organized ways for the students to move in class. Bodies are created to move, and moving helps the students pay attention as well as learn ways of expressing praise to the Lord. Praise can be quiet, or it can be buoyant in dance, flagging, singing, clapping or raising hands to the Lord.

3. A "rule" that will bring success to both teacher and students is:

If you have <u>talked for 30</u> seconds, you have talked too long! After 30 seconds of listening to someone talk, the students will begin to lose focus and their minds will wander. Keep talking time by the teacher <u>crisp and focused</u> by using as few words as possible.

4. Watch your students' eyes! If you have lost eye contact, you have lost them.

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5. Help keep the <u>students involved by giving them physical actions</u> to use with the words of praise, or by bringing in musical instruments or flags to supplement the praise times. This is a great time to <u>incorporate music</u> as a way of praise, so come ready to sing. If you don't sing, you can ask someone who does to come and help, or you can always use CD's for your music.

6. As you teach, develop the skill of keeping the attention of your students by <u>asking questions</u> that keep the students involved in the learning process. As students articulate answers to your questions, learning is occurring! Their answers will also tell you if they are understanding the lesson. If you hear confusion, this is the perfect time to re-teach and clarify.

The following are *examples of questions* that help keep students involved during the Praise time:

- 1. Teacher: Is God good? Students reply: YES!
- Teacher: Even when things aren't going your way, is God good? (This question could branch into an interesting discussion.) Students reply: YES! – God is always good!!
- 3. Teacher: So we can praise God all the time? Students: YES!

4. Do you know someone in the Bible who praised God all the time? (If they don't know, teach them a QUICK (1minute or less) story about David, and remind them that David praised the Lord all the time. In fact, he said, "I will bless the Lord at all times, His praise shall continually be in my mouth!"

5. Teacher: Let's practice thanking God by saying this week's fruit of the Spirit definition together.

6. Teacher: An example of helping the students understand the fruit of the Spirit is as follows: When doing "Peace" as the fruit of the Spirit, you could bring in pictures of a green meadow or a quiet stream, etc. and discuss with the students how these images help us understand the peace of the Holy Spirit. Your can always be creative in introducing and teaching these topics.

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7. At this point, you can have the students sit down and write a way that God has blessed them during the week or on that day.

You are on your way now. May the Lord bless you and inspire you as you Praise Him and teach the next generation of His children the beauty of praising our Lord!

Ps. 42:4b I went with them to the house of God with the voice of joy and praise with a multitude that kept a pilgrim feast.



Teacher's Special Instructions

We start with a lesson on the Hebrew language. We will both write and speak Hebrew. We do this for two reasons:

1) All students are at the same level in learning a new language, and they enjoy it.

2) It gives the students a chance to learn biblical truths embedded in the original language of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). Start by pointing out they are used to reading from left to right, but Hebrew reads from right to left.

They also will need to write Hebrew from right to left.

Materials and Vocabulary:

- a. White board, black board or large easel and paper
- b. Markers
- c. Handouts or writing paper for the students
- d. Pens or pencils for the students
- e. The words used on their Hebrew writing pages are all words that are related to each individual lesson. Generally, a Hebrew word is chosen from the lesson and emphasized each week, both to teach character and increase understanding of the concepts being taught. New words will be in the box on the upper right of this page. Various names of God will also be taught in Hebrew.

Preparation:

- a. Choose 2 or 3 Hebrew words from the Hebrew writing page(s). On the board, write the words in English and in the transliterated form given in the left column of the Hebrew writing page(s).
- b. Leave space to write the word in Hebrew.
- c. Explain that the letters they see on the page are written in book print like they might see on a sign, or that they would print themselves.

Procedure:

- a. Demonstrate the writing procedure of two or three Hebrew words on the board. Have the students follow your directions on their work pages. Be sure to point out the special features of each letter.
- b. Then have the students try a few words on their own, or complete the rest of the page. The ability to finish the whole exercise will depend on how much time you have. (2 to 5 minutes time is needed to finish the page.)

Games/Activities: Normally games are played after children's work pages are complete.





Have your mom and dad ever reminded you that your behavior matters? Do they remind you that disobedience has bad consequences and obedience has good consequences?

Well, God is our Father. He had a talk with His kids in the wilderness just before they went into the Promised Land. This is what God reminded His kids: He said, I told you to go in and possess the land (Deut.1:8) which I promised to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and their descendants. And I

multiplied you as the stars of heaven as I promised Abraham I would do. (Deut. 1:10; Gen.16:10). I told you, Don't fear or be discouraged. (1:26) But you rebelled, choosing to believe the scary report about giants in the land that the 10 spies told you. (1:28) And your hearts were discouraged. They did not believe Me even though I said, I will go before you and fight for you, and you know I show you the way to go. For you have seen the cloud by day and the fire by night! (1:33) But you did not obey. Then I was angry, so I said, None of these men will go into the promised land, only Joshua and Caleb who


believed Me. (1:34-38) I will give the land to your little ones. (1:39) So, after 38 years all those men had died without going into the promised land just as God had said. (2:16) And God said, Now begin your journey to take the land, (2:24), and I will begin to put My fear on all other nations, and they will fear you. (2:25) He also reminded Moses that because he had disobeyed, he would not go into the Promised Land, and he commanded Moses to encourage and strengthen Joshua. For Joshua would lead the people into the Promised Land just as God had said 38 years earlier. (Deut. 2:26; 3:28; Nu. 27:18,23)



How do you remember what God says and obey Him?

Hundreds of years later, had God's people learned to obey God? Listen to what God said to Isaiah the prophet.

God said, I nourished and brought up children, and they rebelled against Me. So now their country is desolate and their cities are burned and strangers devour their land. (Isa.1:2,7) I will hide my eyes from you and not hear your many prayers. (Isa.1:15) What were the consequences of their rebellion? God told them what He wanted them to do saying, These are the things you need to be doing: Make yourselves clean, put away evil, learn to do good, seek justice, rebuke the oppressor, defend the fatherless and plead for the widow. (Isa. 1:18-20) He wanted His people to do what was right and help those who needed help.



But sadly, the people's disobedience continued, and God cast them out of the land to places all over the world. And just as He said, many – 6,000,000 died just in WWII. What do we learn from all this about God's Word?

God always keeps His Word for good and for discipline. The book of Acts begins by reminding us of some of the many ways that God has kept His Word.

God told Isaiah He would send a Son – saying, Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel. (Is. 7:14) And God did send His Son who did miracles. He was crucified, and was raised from the dead. (Acts 2:22-24) God promises and God keeps His Promises. God told us that the Messiah would come from David saying, He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. (Luke 1:32)

And that is why David, though he was king, called Yeshua, Lord! Saying, The LORD said to my Lord,

Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool.

God always keeps His promises.(Ac. 2:34)


Yeshua promised to send the Holy Spirit who would give us power to be His witnesses, (Ac.1:8) and when the day of Pentecost came – sure enough...all the believers in Jerusalem were filled with the Holy Spirit. (Ac.2:4)



And just as on the first Pentecost at Mt. Sinai when 3,000 were killed

because of disobedience, (Ex.32:28) on the Pentecost when the Holy Spirit was sent, 3,000 were saved. (Ac.2:41)

God disciplines and God blesses, and God keeps His promises.



The Hebrew word M M (shemaah) sheen, mem, ayin, teaches us what we should do. Taking the meanings of the ancient Hebrew word pictures it means: See and understand, to hear and obey is to destroy chaos.

To obey God brings blessings, to disobey God brings discipline. How would you tell someone how our amazing God always keeps His Word?

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Teacher's Special Instructions

- c. Explain that the letters they see on the page are written in book print like they might see on a sign, or that they would print themselves.

Procedure:

- a. Demonstrate the writing procedure of two or three Hebrew words on the board. Have the students follow your directions on their work pages. Be sure to point out the special features of each letter. Be sure to write from right to Left.
- b. Then have the students try a few words on their own, or complete the rest of the page. The ability to finish the whole exercise will depend on how much time you have. (2 to 5 minutes time is needed to finish the page.)

Do you ever remember and just think about all the good things about God and what He has done for you?



Moses is helping the people of Israel to remember what God has done. Moses was remembering what happened when God first gave Israel the 10 Commandments saying, I was up on the mountain where God was 40 days and 40 nights, and I didn't eat or drink in all that time. The Lord gave me 2 stone tablets that He had written on with His own finger – God's own finger wrote the

commandments on the stone tablets. (Deuteronomy 7:12-9:10)

Then God said to Moses - Hurry, go down the mountain. The people are acting corruptly! God

wanted to destroy them. They had made a golden calf and were *worshipping it!* When Moses saw this he <u>threw</u> the 2 tablets down, breaking them to pieces. (What would you do if you were Moses?) Moses <u>fell on his face</u> before the LORD and <u>prayed</u> that God would forgive Aaron and the people and that God would remember his promises to Abraham Isaac and Jacob, and take these people into the Land He had promised. Moses said, Remember that these are Your people, LORD, whom You brought out of Egypt with Your mighty power.





(What did Moses remind God?)

So the Lord then said to Moses: Make 2 new tablets like the first and make an ark of wood and bring them up to Me, and I will write on the tablets the words that were on the first tablets which you broke! Moses obeyed, doing all God had said, then he came down the mountain and put the tablets in the ark just as God commanded. <u>And</u> God remembered His people and His promises to Abraham, Isaac

and Jacob. (Deuteronomy 9:11-10:5)

What do you learn in Moses' prayer for God's people?

God made promises to Jerusalem. One promise said, For God will save Zion and build the cities of Judah that they may dwell there and possess it. Also the descendants of His servants shall inherit it. And those who love his name shall dwell in it. (Psalms 69:35-36)

In another promise He said, The ransomed of the LORD **shall** return and come to Zion with singing with everlasting joy on their heads...sorrow and sighing shall flee away. (Isaiah 51:11,12)

But the prophet Isaiah also saw a time when Zion would be destroyed – oh no! And Zion talked and said, The Lord has forsaken me. And My Lord has forgotten me.

Have you ever felt lonely and forgotten? Did you remember God's Promises to you?




This is what God said to Zion: Can a woman forget her nursing child and not have compassion on the son of her womb? Yes, they may forget!

Did God remember His promises? Oh yes. In our day, He has brought His people back to Zion, and Zion has been built up - Just as God said it would be!!!



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Teacher's Special Instructions

We start with a lesson on the Hebrew language. We will both write and speak Hebrew. We do this for two reasons:

1) All students are at the same level in learning a new language, and they enjoy it.

2) It gives the students a chance to learn biblical truths embedded in the original language of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). Start by pointing out they are used to reading from left to right, but Hebrew reads from right to left. They also will need to write Hebrew from right to left.

The king shall write for himself a copy of this law in a book, and it shall be with him, and he shall read it all the days of his life, so he will learn to fear – honor – the LORD his God and be careful to observe all the words of this law and these statutes. (Deuteronomy 17:14-20) What did the LORD want the king to do with the law?

And then Moses told them something that God would do saying, The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me. God was going to send someone like Moses to lead His people. He would come from the Jewish people and the people are to hear him - you know - shemah - hear and obey! God said He will put His very own words in this prophet's mouth, and He shall speak them all that I command Him. (Deuteronmy18:15-18) Who do you think this could be?

Isaiah gives us some big clues about who God would send. Listen to these clues and see if you know who is being described: (clue #1) Listen to Me, My people; and give ear to Me, ... For law will proceed



from Me, and I will make My justice rest as a light to the peoples. My righteousness is near, My salvation has gone forth... (Isaiah 51:4,5a)

(clue #2) Therefore My people shall know My name; therefore they shall know in that day that I am He who speaks; behold, it is I. How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings **good** news, who proclaims peace, who brings glad tidings of good things, who proclaims salvation..... (Isaiah 52:6,7)

(clue #3) The Gentiles shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising. (Isaiah 60:3) Who do you think these verses are describing?


In the book of Acts, Peter was a captive – put in prison by king Herod. King Herod was harassing the church. Herod didn't want Peter to escape, so he put him <u>in chains with 4 squads of soldiers to keep him in</u> <u>prison</u>! But *constant prayer* was offered to God for Peter by the church. Suddenly an angel of the Lord stood by him, and a light shown in the prison; and he struck Peter on the side and raised him up saying, Arise quickly! And Peter's <u>chains fell off</u>! The angel told Peter to get dressed

and follow him. Peter thought he was dreaming, but the angel was real. Peter and the angel walked right past the guards, and Peter ended up at a house <u>where people were praying</u>. When Peter went into the house, **the people were astonished!** Peter told them how the Lord had brought him out of prison!

He was no longer a captive! He had been set free! (Acts 12:1-18)







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Teacher's Special Instructions

We start with a lesson on the Hebrew language. We will both write and speak Hebrew. We do this for two reasons:

1) All students are at the same level in learning a new language, and they enjoy it.

2) It gives the students a chance to learn biblical truths embedded in the original language of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). Start by pointing out they are used to reading from left to right, but Hebrew reads from right to left. They also will need to write Hebrew from right to left.

Generally, a Hebrew word is chosen from the lesson and emphasized each week, both to teach character and increase understanding of the concepts being taught. New words will be in the box on the upper right of this page. Various names of God will also be taught in Hebrew.

Preparation:

- a. Choose 2 or 3 Hebrew words from the Hebrew writing page(s). On the board, write the words in English and in the transliterated form given in the left column of the Hebrew writing page(s).
- b. Leave space to write the word in Hebrew.
- c. Explain that the letters they see on the page are written in book print like they might see on a sign, or that they would print themselves.

Procedure:

- a. Demonstrate the writing procedure of two or three Hebrew words on the board. Have the students follow your directions on their work pages. Be sure to point out the special features of each letter. Be sure to write from right to Left.
- b. Then have the students try a few words on their own, or complete the rest of the page. The ability to finish the whole exercise will depend on how much time you have. (2 to 5 minutes time is needed to finish the page.)



Have you ever gone somewhere with your family and gotten separated from them? You looked up, and they weren't there? Quickly you looked around, but you couldn't see them anywhere. You called-, and no one answered. Then that terrible feeling hit you – you were lost!! That's a scary feeling.

God cares about people that are lost, and God cares about animals that are lost. Here is what God says to do: If you see your friend's animal out wandering around away from his home, get the animal and take him home. And if you don't know whose animal it is then you should take it to your house and care for it until the owner comes looking for it. Then you will give it back to him even if you have cared for the animal for a long time. If you see a sick animal, help it. If you see a bird's nest on the

ground or in a tree with baby birds or little bird's eggs in it, and the mother bird is sitting on them, you must not take the mother with the babies. You should let the mother go and only take the young with you. When you do this, the Bible says that it will go well with you and that your days will be prolonged. (Deut.22:1-7)



God added something else too; He said don't steal someone else's identity by having a woman dress like a man or a man dress like a woman. God does not like this. He wants you to be who He made you. (Deut. 22:5)



If someone looses their clothes or their wallet or some money or jewelry or anything – you should do the same thing. If you find it, try to find the owner and give it back to them. Don't pretend that its yours.

So, return what is not yours, help when you can, be kind even to little birds, and be who God made you.

Can you say how God is showing His kind heart by teaching us to return things, care for things and by being who He made us?





The prophet Isaiah also showed us God's kind heart. He reminded women who were sad because they weren't married or because they didn't have children, that God Himself, their Maker, is their husband! – Wow! How do you think this kindness encouraged their hearts?

And what about Israel? God had to discipline Israel, and they were scattered all over the world for many years. But listen and see if you can find the kindness of God in His Words to Israel:....With great mercies I will gather you, says the LORD your Redeemer. For the mountains shall depart and the hills be removed, but My kindness

Shall not depart from you...says the LORD who has mercy on you. Do you know when God gathered His people back to their land? How did this show kindness?

(Isa 54:7b,8b,10)



From the book of Acts in our Torah portion, count more ways God has shown His kindness to His people. While in the synagogue one day, Paul stood up proclaiming, Men of Israel and you who fear God, - God chose our fathers and exalted the people when they were in Egypt, then He brought them out of Egypt with an uplifted arm. He destroyed 7 nations in the land of Canaan to give them their own land. He raised up king David for them – a man after God's own heart to lead them. And from David's family God raised up for Israel

In Hebrew the word for kindness is: (kchsed) (dalet, samech, kchet) Taking the meaning of each Hebrew letter, these letters say - Kindness is being surrounded and supported by the One who is the Door.

Do you know the One who is the Door? Listen to Yeshua's words. He said, <u>I am the door</u>. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved.



Obedience brings blessing, and disobedience brings unpleasant or even hard consequences. You know how much your parents love you and want to bless you with good things. When you choose to show your love and respect for them by obeying, your choice will bring blessing. But if you choose to disobey, punishment (consequences) can replace blessing. Did you notice how it is your choice to obey or disobey?

God is our Father and He spoke to His children in Israel just before they entered the land He had promised to give them. God told them all the blessings they would have **IF they chose** to obey Him. The Lord wanted them to do these things:

1. Obey all His Commandments (Deuteronomy 27:1)

2. Rejoice in all the Lord has given you - attitude matters!

(Deuteronomy 26:11)

3. Give to and share with the Levites, the fatherless, the stranger and the widow. (Deuteronomy 26:12)

What do you learn about God by looking at the things He asks you to do?

Listen to the blessings that would come with obedience to God: Can you pick out 3 that you think are the best?

God said, Your land will flow with milk and honey (Deuteronomy 27:3). You will be set high above all nations (Deuteronomy 26:19). You will be a holy people set apart for the LORD (Deuteronomy 26:19). Blessings will overtake you (Deuteronomy 28:2). Your children and food will be blessed (Deuteronomy 28:4,5). You will be blessed when you come in and when you go out

(Deuteronomy 28:6). Your enemies will be defeated (Deuteronomy 28:7). Your work will be blessed (Deuteronomy 28:8).



God will bless you with plenty of everything (Deuteronomy 28:11). You will be blessed with rain and have enough money to lend out Deuteronomy 28:12. God will make you the head and not the tail Deuteronomy 28:13 - IF YOU OBEY HIS COMMANDMENTS!!! But God also told His children, if you choose to disobey, the opposite of blessing will

happen. The opposite of blessing is cursing.

And He said, curses will overtake you Deuteronomy 28:15. You will have trouble in the country and in the city and trouble with your children and animals – 28:16. You will have confusion and scolding, destruction and sickness (Deuteronomy 28:20-22). There will be no rain in your land, and locusts will eat your trees.







Even though God's children did disobey Him and suffer the consequences, Isaiah the prophet tells them of the good to come. He said, God is sending the LORD to arise over them, and the Gentiles will see the glory of the LORD upon them. And the Gentiles will come to the light they see. (Isaiah 60:1-3)

Isaiah continues to tell them that even though they were hated and forsaken, God would make them an **eternal excellence and a joy!** (Isaiah 6:15) And the LORD will be to them everlasting light.

The sad days will end. Your people shall be righteous and inherit the land. And when all this begins to happen the LORD will <u>hasten it</u> – speed up the time it takes to happen. (Isaiah 60 22b) How do you see the goodness of God in Isaiah's words?

the goodness of God in Isaiah's words? What was the light that God was sending through His people that the Gentiles would come to? Yeshua answers that question. He said, Lam the Light of t

Gentiles would come to? Yeshua answers that question. He said, I am the Light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life. (Jn. 8:12)

In Hebrew the word for light is (ohr)

(reysh, vav, aleph)

Taking the Hebrew meanings of each of the letters, the word means God, the Man, is the head. He is the Light.

In the book of Acts, the apostle Paul was on a missionary trip to take the Light of the world to Gentiles in the nation of Turkey. Some people there

had accepted Yeshua as their Savior and were strengthened by keeping God's ways, and they grew in number daily. (Acts 16:4,5) On Shabbat, Paul, Timothy and Silas who were traveling together, talked with people about the Lord as they sat by the river. A lady named Lydia

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Teacher's Special Instructions

We start with a lesson on the Hebrew language. We will both write and speak Hebrew. We do this for two reasons:

1) All students are at the same level in learning a new language, and they enjoy it.

2) It gives the students a chance to learn biblical truths embedded in the original language of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). Start by pointing out they are used to reading from left to right, but Hebrew reads from right to left. They also will need to write Hebrew from right to left.

Materials and Vocabulary:

- a. White board, black board or large easel and paper
- b. Markers
- c. Handouts or writing paper for the students
- d. Pens or pencils for the students
- e. The words used on their Hebrew writing pages are all words that are related to each individual lesson. Generally, a Hebrew word is chosen from the lesson and emphasized each week, both to teach character and increase understanding of the concepts being taught. New words will be in the box on the upper right of this page. Various names of God will also be taught in Hebrew.

Preparation:

- a. Choose 2 or 3 Hebrew words from the Hebrew writing page(s). On the board, write the words in English and in the transliterated form given in the left column of the Hebrew writing page(s).
- b. Leave space to write the word in Hebrew.
- c. Explain that the letters they see on the page are written in book print like they might see on a sign, or that they would print themselves.

Procedure:

- a. Demonstrate the writing procedure of two or three Hebrew words on the board. Have the students follow your directions on their work pages. Be sure to point out the special features of each letter. Be sure to write from right to l eft
- b. Then have the students try a few words on their own, or complete the rest of the page. The ability to finish the whole exercise will depend on how much time you have. (2 to 5 minutes time is needed to finish the page.)






Today's Torah portion is about DOING! Doing means ACTION! Action is using your energy to do a task. Tasks are activities you use your energy to do.

The LORD gave His people a task to do when they were in the desert of Moab. He said, **Keep** the words of this covenant and **do them**, that you may

prosper in all you do! So God's covenant is something we use our energy to DO! (Deut 29:9) Did you find the amazing reward for keeping the covenant? Yes – Prospering – God promised doing His covenant would bring success! Everybody wants to be successful!

Then the LORD told them to <u>STAND</u> before Him. He tells us to stand too. Why stand? When you stand you are <u>ready for action</u>. When you stand you are ready to endure; you are fixed and steady – not wobbly and about to fall. You are in a position to do battle. Why do we need to be in a position to use our energy to battle? (Deut. 29:10&15)





serve other gods. You know like instead of memorizing a verse in the Bible, we play video games. Can video games be a god? If we value them more than we value God, then they can become like a god to us. Can TV be a god?

Or money or toys or clothes or gold and silver? (Deut. 29:17)





Bitterness is being mad about something that happened, and you don't want to forgive the person that did something bad to you. Bitterness is like what your face does if you take a big bite of a lemon without sugar. Bitterness can make you grumpy and sad. God knows bitterness is not good for His people, and He knows we will have to battle bitterness by forgiving when we get our feelings hurt. (Deut. 29:17)

God wants us to know **we need Him and His covenant** to be blessed. We cannot think - - Oh, I don't need to use my energy to obey God, I will just do what I want and be blessed anyway! Why do you think doing whatever we want would bring trouble? We want to think and do God's thoughts and ways because when we do our own ways, it leads to trouble. The Lord warns us not to do our own ways and worship other gods, because then bad consequences come like plagues and sicknesses and our land burning like Sodom and Gomorrah. (Deut. 29:19-28)

God doesn't want these things to happen to us – He wants to bless. He tells us to **return** to Him, obey Him with all our hearts. If we fail, God will forgive us. He wants us to return to Him.(Deut. 30:2)

When Israel disobeyed God and worshiped other gods, the Lord took them from their land and cast them into other lands. (Deut. 29:28) But He made Israel a promise saying, If any of you are driven out to the farthest parts under heaven, from there the LORD will gather you, and from there He will bring you. (Deut.30:4) And Isaiah tells us that when the LORD brings Israel back to the Land, they will **not be desolate**. For the LORD will **delight** in them , and so **God will rejoice over them**. (Isa. 62:4,5) And do you know Isaiah tells us to be **watchmen** – to pray for His

people and for the peace of Jerusalem. <u>That's a really important task, and God is giving it to us!!</u> What do you do when you are a watchman?

(Isa. 62:12)

In the book of Acts, the Apostle Paul also tells us to Watch and to Remember. What should we watch for?

Watch out for false gods and remember to worship only God!



Magic can be a false god. In Paul's day when people learned about the power of Yeshua, many who practiced magic that they learned from books, confessed and burned their books about magic. And the word of the LORD grew mightily and prevailed. (Acts 19:17-20)

What happened when the people turned from the false god of magic to the true God, Yeshua?

As watchmen, we pray, we warn when something bad is coming and we tell others about Yeshua's love. Paul did these things wherever he went. Paul got in trouble for doing these things, and he was even put in chains. Paul said, None of these things move me: nor do I count my life dear to myself, so that I may finish the race with joy and the task which I received from the LORD Yeshua to tell the good news of the grace of God! (Acts 20:22-24)







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Teacher's Special Instructions

- a. Demonstrate the writing procedure of two or three Hebrew words on the board. Have the students follow your directions on their work pages. Be sure to point out the special features of each letter. Be sure to write from right to Left.
- b. Then have the students try a few words on their own, or complete the rest of the page. The ability to finish the whole exercise will depend on how much time you have. (2 to 5 minutes time is needed to finish the page.)



Have you ever lived in a house for a long time? If you have, you know all your neighbors.

You have friends in you neighborhood, and you know all the kids at your school. You know what to expect where you live. Then one day your parents say, "We are moving to a new place – a different <u>country</u>!

Oh, my! How do you feel? Are you a little bit afraid.

In our Torah portion today, Moses is telling all Israel to be strong and have good courage. Why did he need to say that? He was telling the people that they were about to cross over into a new land – they were moving to a **new country**, and *he* would not be going with them. The people knew there were strong nations where they would be going, and they would have to fight these

strong nations. God knew they were afraid. Listen to what Moses said to them: He said, <u>The LORD your God Himself crosses over</u> before you; <u>He will destroy these nations from before you, and you shall take the land they are in</u>. <u>The LORD will give them over to you</u>. <u>Be strong and of good courage</u>. Do not fear nor be afraid of them, for the LORD your God, He is the One who goes with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you. (Deuteronomy 31:1-6) How do you think these words would help the Israelites not to be afraid?



Do you know these words are for you too?



Then Moses told the people that Joshua would be their new leader. Moses said to Joshua, Be strong and of good courage for you must go with this people to the land which the LORD promised to their fathers. And again he said, <u>And the LORD, He is the One who goes before you</u>, <u>He will be with you, He will not leave you nor forsake you. Do not fear nor be dismayed.</u> (Deuteronomy 31:7,8)

Why do you think Moses repeated these words?

How will these words help you when you are afraid?

So things were changing for Israel. They were going to have a new country and a new leader; Moses was about to die and Joshua would now lead them. They were about to leave the wilderness where God had fed them with mannah every day, and they were going to war with nations bigger and stronger than they were. But what was their attitude to be? Let's say God's words to them right outloud: (All say together)

BE STRONG AND OF GOOD COURAGE; DO NOT FEAR NOR BE DISMAYED FOR THE LORD IS THE ONE WHO GOES WITH YOU. HE WILL NOT LEAVE YOU NOR FORSAKE YOU. (Deut. 31:6,8)



Then the Lord told them some very **sad** words. Though He would not leave them <u>THEY WOULD LEAVE HIM</u>, and <u>they would worship</u> <u>idols</u>! When this happened, God's anger would be aroused, and He would allow them to be *devoured*! (Deuteronomy 31:16,17)

But God would keep His promises to them for the prophets Hosea and Micah tell us that though they did worship idols, God said these words: <u>I will heal</u> their backsliding. <u>I will love</u> them freely, for <u>My anger</u> has <u>turned away</u>. Those who live under His shadow shall <u>return and be revived</u>! (Hosea14:4,7,8)

How great is our God? Can you name all the things He would do for His people even though they had turned away from Him?

Micah proclaims, Who is a God like you? <u>You forgive</u> iniquities and Passover transgression. <u>You do</u> <u>not retain your anger</u> forever, because <u>You delight in mercy</u>!

(Micah 7:18a,19) Wow! What do you learn from this about being angry? How do you want to give God praise for His amazing love?



Many years later, Paul was chosen by God to tell people about who Yeshua is and how Yeshua loves them.

Paul was doing just what God wanted, but the people he was talking to were angry when they heard these words and wanted to kill Paul! (Acts 23:27-30) Paul was tied up and struck in the mouth; there was so much fighting about Paul's words that it was feared Paul might be <u>pulled to pieces</u>. (Acts22:25,23:2,10) Even though

they could find nothing he had done that deserved death, still there

were some who said they would neither eat nor drink til they had killed him. (Ac.23:14,21) BUT, the following night the **Lord stood by him and said**, **Be of good cheer**, **Paul**; for as you have told people about Me in Jerusalem, so you must also bear witness at Rome. (Ac. 23:11) Did God encourage Paul the same way He had encouraged His people when they were about to go to a new country?





That means God wants your full attention – He wants to speak right into your ear! He is speaking to you!

> Did you know that God wants to talk to YOU?? Yes, He does. He is saying to you – Give me your ear so I can tell you My words! All of God's Words speak to us – from Genesis to Revelation – all of God's words are for us. God's words tell us how to conduct our lives! Don't look at those around you who do whatever they want and try to be like them. Instead, be special and do what God says.


HOW do we know if God is speaking to us? Here is a way to test the words we are hearing:

1. Are the words Truth that is in the Bible?

2. Do the words Agree with the Bible?

3. Do the words Lead you to do right- to do what God says?

Like someone telling a secret, God's voice is usually quiet.







Is this true or false? It is always easy to do what God says.

Sometimes it feels hard to do what God says. So what is the SECRET to doing what God says? Deut. 32:46 God tells us the secret:



SET YOUR HEARTS ON ALL THE WORDS WHICH I TESTIFY AMONG YOU TODAY......

**SET means: cemented, glued, stuck, firm, TRAINED AND READY. When I set my heart to do God's Word, I can say NO to sin!!

If your heart is SET then you have decided that **no matter what**, you will do what God tells you to do, and He will help you!

God says 6 times in Deut. 32 that He is a Rock! (pic of a large rock drops down – thud!) What is God trying to tell you about Himself?

When you look at this rock, what words would you use to describe it?

--strong steady, solid secure immovable (not easily moved) you can build on it-

So what did God want to say about himself using this analogy?

He is saying that He is strong, steady, you can depend on Him

God's words are like this too – they are solid – you can depend on them. So HOW WILL YOU DO WHAT GOD SAYS? ((SET YOUR HEARTS TO DO HIS WORDS))

God was speaking to Israel. Did Israel do all that God told them? Listen to these verses and find the words that God used to describe Israel:

** Deut.32:15b,16 says ... Then he (Israel) forsook God who made him, and scornfully esteemed the Rock of his salvation. They provoked Him to jealousy with foreign gods; with abominations they provoked Him to anger."

Peter must have had some questions in his mind too, because he replied to Yeshua with these words:

WOW! What do Yeshua's words mean to us?







Do you love to get a blessing? – A blessing is something really good that will happen to you. Well on this day, Moses, the man of God, spoke a blessing over the children of Israel. The children of Israel were so excited to hear how they would be blessed that they sat down to hear all that Moses would say to them. (Deuteronomy 33:1,3-This is the blessing that Moses, the man of God, gave to

the people of Israel before his death: Indeed, he loves his people...all his holy ones are in his hands. They follow in his steps and accept his teaching.)

Do you ever JUST SIT and LISTEN to God? He wants to bless you!

Remember that Moses was called "the man of God", well, when Moses was finished blessing the people, he went up to Mt. Nebo across from Jericho. Now guess who came to show him something amazing – Right – **God showed him all the land of Israel** – so he could see it with his eyes because Moses would not be able to go into the land of Israel.



(Deuteronomy 34:1,4-Then Moses went up to Mount Nebo from the plains of Moab and climbed Pisgah Peak, which is across from Jericho. And the Lord showed him the whole

land, from Gilead as far as Dan;... Then the Lord said to Moses, "This is the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob when I said, 'I will give it to your descendants.' I have now allowed you to see it with your own eyes, but you will not enter the land.")

After God showed Moses the Land of Israel, he died right there in the land of Moab. And do you know who buried Moses? **God buried Moses!!!**, and nobody knows where his grave is even to this day! (Deuteronomy 34:5,6⁻ So Moses, the servant of the Lord, died there in the land of Moab, just as the Lord had said. ⁶ The Lord buried him in a valley near Beth-peor in Moab, but to this day no one knows the exact place.)



After 30 days do you know what special thing God did? God raised up a **new leader for the people**. The new leader's name is **Joshua**. God had prepared Joshua by giving him a spirit of wisdom, so he would know what to do. But did Joshua feel strong and brave? (Deuteronomy 34:9) Now Joshua son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him. So the people of Israel obeyed him, doing just as the Lord

had commanded Moses.; Joshua 1:1-3-After the death of Moses the Lord's servant, the Lord spoke to Joshua son of Nun, Moses' assistant. He said, ² "Moses my servant is dead.



Therefore, the time has come for you to lead these people, the Israelites, across the Jordan River into the land I am giving them. ³ I promise you what I promised Moses: 'Wherever you set foot, you will be on land I have given you—)

Have you ever had to do a job that just seemed to be way to big for you? If you have, then you can understand how Joshua probably felt. Joshua

remembered what a great leader Moses had been, and he probably thought he could not do what Moses had done.

Then he probably looked at all those people – millions of them - and felt a bit afraid. LEADING THIS PEOPLE WOULD BE A BIG, BIG JOB. Even though Joshua had wisdom, he felt a bit shy and shakey.

Do you think that God knows when you are afraid? Listen what God said to Joshua and think about what Joshua may have been feeling.: God said: "I will be with you. I will not leave you nor forsake you. Be strong and of good courage..." God did know just how Joshua was feeling. If you ever feel afraid, these words are for YOU TOO! (Joshua 1:5)

And God did not say this just one time! He said it again -

"Be strong and of good courage..." and again (Joshua 1:6)

"Be strong and very courageous..." and again (Joshua 1:7)

"Be strong and of good courage..." (Joshua 1:9)

And God told Joshua how to have prosperity and good success.

Do you know how? Listen:

God said: "This Book of the Law - you need to think about it day and night and DO WHAT it tells you to do!.....(Joshua 1:8)

So God told Joshua a GREAT SECRET and YOU JUST LEARNED THE SECRET!! You can think about God's word all day and all night also and you can also do what His Word tells you, because God never changes, and He loves you as He loved Joshua.

How do we know that God never changes? Well, one way we know is that hundreds of years later, **Yeshua said the same thing to the people who followed Him**.

He said: "teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you and, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matt. 28:20)



Yeshua also said that He would send the Holy Spirit to **give you power** – make you **strong** so you can do what He tells you to do!! (Luke24:49) "And now I will send the Holy Spirit, just as my Father promised. But stay here in the city until the Holy Spirit comes and fills you with power from heaven.") Pretty amazing.





So when you feel shy and afraid – you can remember these words and just like Joshua, you can be **STRONG AND COURAGEOUS BECAUSE GOD IS WITH YOU**. Now that is a BLESSING FOR YOU!

Teacher's Special Instructions

We start with a lesson on the Hebrew language. We will both write and speak Hebrew. We do this for two reasons:

1) All students are at the same level in learning a new language, and they enjoy it.

2) It gives the students a chance to learn biblical truths embedded in the original language of the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). Start by pointing out they are used to reading from left to right, but Hebrew reads from right to left. They also will need to write Hebrew from right to left.

Materials and Vocabulary:

- a. White board, black board or large easel and paper
- b. Markers
- c. Handouts or writing paper for the students
- d. Pens or pencils for the students
- e. The words used on their Hebrew writing pages are all words that are related to each individual lesson. Generally, a Hebrew word is chosen from the lesson and emphasized each week, both to teach character and increase understanding of the concepts being taught. New words will be in the box on the upper right of this page. Various names of God will also be taught in Hebrew.

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Games/Activities: Normally games are played after children's work pages are complete.



Remembering and Looking Forward with JOY in our outdoor shelters! You remember how Yom Kippur was the **most solemn**, serious day of the year because the sins of all the people of Israel had to be covered?

Well, Succot is a joyful celebration!!

This celebration begins on the 15th of Tishrei, and lasts for 7 days! Now that's a celebration. And even more fun -you get to



build a little shelter outside. This little shelter is called a Sukkah. A sukkah has 3 walls which can be made of things like twigs and branches or wood. It has a roof that is not solid so that you can see the stars through it. During the week of Sukkot, we eat our meals in the sukkah, pray in it and have guests over to enjoy eating together in the Sukkah. If the weather is good, you may even get to sleep in the Sukkah!! It is kind of like an outside party place.



Does anybody in this room like to go outside and eat in a tent and tell stories? Well, that is kind of what happens when we celebrate Sukkot. There are two very special stories we like to talk about during this great celebration.

Why do we celebrate this feast of the Lord in this way? What are the stories we like to talk about?

Let's go back in time and sit in one of the first sukkah's with a family who just came across the Red Sea with Moses and all of Israel. What story will they be telling?

Wow – what a miracle! We are not slaves in Egypt any longer. Remember how hot it was and how hard the Egyptians made us work? Yes, but then God sent Moses to be our leader, and God did so many miracles to set us free. (The father asks the kids if they have a favorite miracle?) One of the little boys says,) "I liked it when God put frogs everywhere!" (Then a little girl





says,) "I liked walking across the Red Sea and looking at the fish in the water that was all piled up on each side! That was an amazing miracle! (The mom says,) "Now we are in the wilderness living in temporary Sukkahs. We can look right through our roof and remember that God is with us just as He was when He brought us out of Egypt. He is an amazing God! He has set us FREE!

What was that family doing?

That family was telling the story of the amazing miracles God did to deliver them from slavery in Egypt. It pleases the Lord when we remember and talk about the miracles He has done. He tells us to celebrate those miracles. During Succot, we remember all that God did then, and all the miracles He has done for us.

AND WE DO SOMETHING ELSE. Does anybody know what else we do? We look forward to and celebrate what God <u>will do</u> very soon. Do you know what God will soon do? This will be amazing – What does the Bible tell us? Can you draw a picture in your mind of what this will look like?

Zech. 14:1 says: The day of the LORD is coming! Wow -

What will that be like?

It's going to start out with a BIG BATTLE. Listen and see if you can find out WHO will fight in this battle and where it will be.

Zech 14:2 tells us this: The LORD will gather all the nations to battle against Jerusalem.

Did you catch that? All the nations will be gathered to fight against who? Against Jerusalem! Now see if you can answer WHO IS GOING TO FIGHT AGAINST THOSE NATIONS....



Zech. 14:3 Then the LORD will go forth and fight against those nations. So the LORD is going to fight all the nations that come to fight Jerusalem AND HE IS GOING TO WIN.

Listen to the rest of what will happen on this amazing day.....

Zech. 14:4,5d 9 11 16 And in that day His feet will stand on the Mt. of Olives (5d) and the LORD, my God will come, and all the saints with You!

(9) And the LORD shall be King over all the earth.

(11) (Jerusalem) shall be safely inhabited.




(14)...everyone who is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall go up from year to year to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, and to keep the Feast of Tabernacles – that is the English way to say the Feast of Succot.

Feast of Tabernacles is another name for **Sukkot**! The whole world will celebrate that day when Yeshua returns and reigns as KING over all the earth. Are you picturing this in your mind?

This week, when you sit in your Sukkah, remember the miracles God did in Egypt and look forward to the day when Yeshua returns and stands on the Mt. of Olives. When this happens, He will dwell with us forever!! That is really something to celebrate!



Games and Activity suggestions (To be used with any/all lessons)

These suggestions are games which are noted in the lesson plans. You can use them as suggested or change them up to fit you, your students and your time frame. The directions are included in each game.

Tic Tack Toe is an easy to do game which reviews the lesson just taught. You will need to create the questions for the game from the lesson. This can be used either at the end of the lesson as a review or the beginning of the next lesson to remind the students of what they have learned.

Ring Toss (or ball in the basket) is fun for students and gets them moving. You will need either rings or a ball and basket for the game. You will also need to create the questions based on the lesson you are reviewing.

Each one write one is a game that works well with the older students. The students write the questions with this one and then the opposing team tries to answer them. This takes a bit of time and you may have to be ready to give some starting suggestions. You could have them make up the questions at the end of a class as a review and play the game as a start for the next class.

Scavenger Hunt is fun for all. You will need to have questions written in large letters on paper which are taped on the walls around the room and then answers on separate pieces of paper for the teams to match to the questions.

Build Bob is a game that is used to review several lessons at a time. You create the questions and the teams. You will need to have a chalkboard and chalk or large paper and marker which is posted so all can see.

Skits, this can be done with any of the lessons and the students love to act out the stories. This helps keep them active and engaged. Creating and performing the scenes allows the students to teach each other and can replace the story portion or just sections of the lesson to get students up and moving. Make sure that all students are involved in some aspect during the lesson.

GAMES AND ACTIVITIY SUGGESTIONS

It is important to keep the children involved in the lessons. God's Word is not a lecture, it is alive and vibrant – full of action and love. It is the goal of this curriculum to pass on a love and a desire to keep coming back for more of God's Word. It is with this goal in mind that we encourage you to use games, skits, songs, flagging and in general have fun. The more involved in the lessons, the more they will learn, and learn to love the Word!

The following are generic games that can be adapted to any of these lessons. Please Feel free to add to these suggestions and make them your own.

TIC TACK TOE

- 1. Compile a list of questions covering information you that the children have learned in the lesson.
- Organize teams. If you have a large number of children, you can have several Tic Tack Toe grids being played at once. If possible keep the teams small in number - 3 to 4 children on a team gives each one more opportunity to answer a question and choose a box to put their X or O in.
- 3. Have large Tic Tack Toe grids on the board or large paper at front of room.
- 4. Alternate questions by team.
- 5. If correct answer is given the child answering puts an X or an O in the box they choose until one team has 3 of the same letter in a row and wins.

RING TOSS (OR BALL IN THE BUCKET)

****For this game you will need any of the following materials:

Plastic rings to toss around bottles or pegs or cones. If you can't find plastic rings, you could use light-weight foam balls and throw them in a bucket or a box. Compile a list of questions from the lesson.

- 1. Choose teams
- 2. Kids take turns tossing the ring or the ball. If the toss is successful, they get to answer a question. Younger children should stand closer to the target.
- 3. The first team to answer 5 questions correctly wins. (Keep track of correct answer by marking lines on the board or on large paper.)

EACH ONE WRITE ONE

- 1. Form teams.
- 2. Have each team member write a question about the lesson on a 3x5 card or piece of paper. (Older children can assist younger children on their team who may need help with this.)
- 3. Pass all the questions in. The teacher reads one team's questions to the other team one member at a time answers the question.
- 4. 1,000 points is awarded for each correct answer.
- 5. The first team to have 10,000 points wins!

SCAVENGER HUNT

- 1. Divide into small teams 2 to 3 children per team. Give each team a name or number.
- 2. Around the room, have answers to questions written out on 8 1/2 by 11 paper. Use large print that is easy to read.
- 3. Tape the questions around the room on the walls or on chair backs, etc.
- 4. Write out the answers on 8 1/2 x 11 paper and hand them out. <u>No one can look at the questions or answers until you say, "Go"! (Be sure the team numbers or names are written on the back of the answers.)</u>
- 5. Each team captain has tape.
- 6. As soon as the team finds the correct answer(s) to the question(s) they have, they tape it under the question.
- 7. The first team to have the largest number of matching questions and answers wins.
