TORAH PORTION

Genesis 25:7 And these are the days of the years of Abraham's life which he lived, an <u>hundred threescore and fifteen years</u>.

Genesis 25:19,20 And these are the generations of Isaac, Abraham's son: Abraham begat Isaac: And Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah to wife, the daughter of Bethuel the Syrian of Padan—aram, the sister to Laban the Syrian.

Exodus 17:3 And the people thirsted there for water, and the people murmured against Moses, and said, Wherefore is this that thou hast brought us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our cattle with thirst?

Exodus 17:6 Behold, I will stand before thee there upon the rock in Horeb, and thou shalt smite the rock, and there shall come water out of it, that the people may drink. And Moses did so in the sight of the elders of Israel.

Exodus 17:8,9a Then came Amalek, and fought with Israel in Rephidim. And Moses said unto Joshua, Choose us out men, and go out, **fight with Amalek.**

Numbers 10:11-14 In the second year, in the second month, on the twentieth day of the month, the cloud lifted from over the tabernacle of the testimony, and the people of Israel set out by stages from the wilderness of Sinai. And the cloud settled down in the wilderness of Paran. They set out for the first time at the command of the LORD by Moses. The standard of the camp of the people of Judah set out first by their companies, and over their company was Nahshon the son of Amminadab.

Numbers 11:1 And when the people complained, it displeased the LORD: And the LORD heard it, and his anger was kindled, and the fire of the LORD burnt among them, and consumed them that were in the uttermost parts of the camp. And the people cried unto Moses; and when Moses prayed unto the LORD, the fire was quenched.

Numbers 11:4 And the mixt multitude that was among them fell a lusting: And the children of Israel also wept again, and said, Who shall give us flesh to eat?

Numbers 11:19,20 Ye shall not eat one day, nor two days, nor five days, neither ten days, nor twenty days, But even a whole month, until it come out at your nostrils, and it be loathsome unto you: Because that ye have despised the LORD which is among you, and have wept before him, saying, Why came we forth out of Egypt?



Numbers 11:31 And there went forth a wind from the LORD, and brought quails from the sea, and let them fall by the camp, as it were a day's journey on this side, and as it were a day's journey on the other side, round about the camp, and as it were two cubits high upon the face of the earth.

Numbers 11:33 And while the flesh was yet between their teeth, ere it was chewed, the wrath of the LORD was kindled against the people, and the LORD smote the people with a very great plague.

Numbers 12:1 And Miriam and Aaron spoke against Moses because of the Ethiopian woman whom he had married: For he had married an Ethiopian woman.

Genesis 25:26 And after that came his brother out, and his hand took hold on Esau's heel, and his name was called Jacob: and Isaac was <u>three score years</u> <u>old</u> when she bore them.

Genesis 9:28,29 And Noah lived after the flood three hundred and fifty years. And all the days of Noah were <u>nine hundred and fifty years</u>: And he died.

Genesis 11:10,11 These are the generations of Shem: Shem was an 100 years old, and begat Arphaxad two years after the flood: And Shem lived after he begat Arphaxad five hundred years, and begat sons and daughters.

Genesis 25:21-23 Isaac entreated the LORD for his wife, because she was barren. The LORD was entreated by him, and Rebekah his wife conceived. The children struggled together within her. She said, If it be so, why do I live? She went to inquire of the LORD. The LORD said to her, Two nations are in your womb. Two peoples will be separated from your body. The one people will be stronger than the other people. The elder will serve the younger.

Genesis 25:27,28 And the boys grew: And Esau was a cunning hunter, a man of the field, and Jacob **was a plain man**, dwelling in tents. Now Isaac loved Esau, because he did eat of his venison, and Rebekah loved Jacob.

Genesis 25:31-33 And Jacob said, Sell me this day your birthright. And Esau said, Behold, I am at the point to die: And what profit shall this birthright do to me? And Jacob said, Swear to me this day, and he swore to him: And he sold his birthright to Jacob.



Genesis 25:34 Jacob gave Esau <u>bread and stew of lentils.</u> He ate and drank, rose up, and went his way. So Esau despised his birthright.

Genesis 14:18,19 And Melchizedek <u>king of Salem</u> brought forth bread and wine: And <u>he was the priest</u> of the Most High God. And he blessed him, and said, Blessed be Abram of the most high God, possessor of heaven and earth.

Exodus 19:6 And you shall be to me a <u>kingdom of priests</u>, and an holy nation. These are the words which you shall speak to the children of Israel.

Genesis 26:34 And when Esau was forty years old, he took to wife Judith the daughter of Beeri the Hittite, and Basemath the daughter of Elon the Hittite. And they were a bitterness of spirit unto Isaac and to Rebekah.

Genesis 26:1-5 And there was <u>a famine</u> in the land, beside the first famine that was in the days of Abraham. And Isaac went to Abimelech king of the Philistines to Gerar. And the LORD appeared to him, and said, <u>Go not down into Egypt</u>, dwell in the land which I shall tell you of: Sojourn in this land, and I will be with you, and will bless you, for to you, and to your seed, I will give all these countries, and <u>I will perform the oath which I swore to Abraham your father</u>; And I will make your seed to multiply as the stars of heaven, and will give to your seed all these countries, and in your seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, <u>Because that Abraham obeyed my voice</u>, and kept my charge, my commandments, my statutes, and my laws.

Genesis 26:12-15 Isaac sowed in that land, and reaped in the same year one hundred times what he planted. The LORD blessed him. The man grew great, and grew more and more until he became very great. He had possessions of flocks, possessions of herds, and a great household. The Philistines envied him. Now all the wells which his father's servants had dug in the days of Abraham his father, the Philistines had stopped, and filled with earth.

Genesis 26:16,17 Abimelech said to Isaac, <u>Go from us</u>, for you are much mightier than we. Isaac departed from there, encamped <u>in the valley of Gerar</u>, and lived there.

Genesis 26:18 <u>Isaac dug again the wells of water</u>, which they had dug in the days of Abraham his father. For the <u>Philistines had stopped them after the death of Abraham</u>. He called their names after the names by which his father had called them.

Genesis 27:1 And it came to pass, that when Isaac was old, and <u>his eyes were dim</u>, so that he could not see, he called Esau <u>his oldest</u> son, and said to him, My son: And he said to him, Behold, here am I.



Genesis 48:10 Now the eyes of Israel were dim for age, so that he could not see. And he brought them near unto him, and he kissed them, and embraced them.

Romans 11:25 For I would not, brothers, that you should be ignorant of this mystery, lest you should be wise in your own conceits, **that blindness** <u>in part</u> is happened to Israel, until the **fullness of the Gentiles** be come in.

1 Corinthians 13:12 For now we see through a glass, darkly, but then face to face: Now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known.

Matthew 7:22,23 Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? And in thy name have cast out devils? And in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, **I never knew you:** Depart from me, ye that work iniquity.

Isaiah 42:19-21 Who is blind, but my servant? Or deaf, as my messenger that I sent? Who is blind as he that is perfect, and blind as the LORD's servant? Seeing many things, but you observe not; opening the ears, but he hears not The LORD is well pleased for his righteousness' sake; he will magnify the law, and make it honorable.

Luke 24:15,16 It happened, while they talked and questioned together, that Yeshua himself came near, and went with them. But their eyes were kept from recognizing him.

Genesis 27:2-4 And he said: Behold now, I am old, I know not the day of my death. Now therefore take, I pray thee, thy weapons, thy quiver and thy bow, and go out to the field, and take me venison, and make me savory food, such as I love, and bring it to me, that I may eat; that my soul may bless thee before I die.

Genesis 27:5-10 And Rebekah heard when Isaac spoke to Esau <u>his son</u>. And Esau went to the field to hunt for venison, and to bring it. And Rebekah spoke unto Jacob <u>her son</u>, saying: Behold, I heard thy father speak unto Esau thy brother, saying: Bring me venison, and make me savory food, that I may eat, and bless thee before the LORD before my death. Now therefore, my son, hearken to my voice according to that which I command thee. Go now to the flock, and fetch me from thence two good kids of the goats; and I will make them savory food for thy father, such as he loveth, and thou shalt bring it to thy father, that he may eat, so that he may bless thee before his death.

Genesis 27:15 And Rebekah took goodly raiment of her oldest son Esau, which were with her in the house, and put them on Jacob her younger son.



Genesis 27:19 And Jacob said unto his father: I am Esau thy first-born, I have done according as thou badest me. Arise, I pray thee, sit and eat of my venison, that thy soul may bless me.

Genesis 27:27-29 And he came near, and kissed him: And he smelled the smell of his raiment, and blessed him, and said, See, the smell of my son is as the smell of a field, which the LORD has blessed: Therefore God give you of the <u>dew of heaven</u>, and the fatness of the earth, and plenty of corn and wine: Let <u>people serve you</u>, and <u>nations bow down to you</u>: be <u>lord over your brothers</u>, and let <u>your mother's sons bow down to you</u>: Cursed be every one that curses you, and blessed be he that blesses you.

Hebrews 11:20 By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning **things to come.**

Isaiah 26:19 Your dead men shall live, together with my dead body shall they arise. Awake and sing, you that dwell in dust: for your **dew** is as the dew of herbs, and the **earth shall cast out the dead.**

Genesis 27:32-34 And Isaac his father said unto him: Who art thou? And he said:'I am thy son, thy first-born, Esau' And Isaac trembled very exceedingly, and said: Who then is he that hath taken venison, and brought it me, and I have eaten of all before thou camest, and have blessed him? Yea, and he shall be blessed. When Esau heard the words of his father, he cried with an exceeding great and bitter cry, and said unto his father: Bless me, even me also, O my father.

Psalm 19:1 The heavens <u>declare the glory of God</u>, and the firmament shows His handywork.

Genesis 1:14 And God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night, and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years.

MBV Genesis 14:1 And God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night, and let them be for signs, and for the Divine appointments, for the Sabbath days, and for marking the Shemitah and Jubilee years.

Numbers 2:34 So the children of Israel did as the Lord said to Moses, so they put up their tents by their flags, and they went forward in the same order, by their families, and by their fathers' houses.

SOS 6:10 Who is she that looks forth as the morning, Fair as the moon, Clear as the sun, Terrible as an army with banners?

SOS 6:13 Return, return, O Shulamite, return, return, that we may look upon thee. What will ye see in the Shulamite? As it were the company of two armies.

2 Samuel 5:22-25 And the **Philistines** came up yet again, and spread themselves in the valley of Rephaim. And when David enquired of the LORD, he said, Thou shalt not go up, but fetch a compass behind them, and come upon them over **against the mulberry trees.** And let it be, when thou hearest the sound of a going in the **tops of the mulberry trees**, that then thou shalt bestir thyself: For then shall the LORD go out before thee, to smite the host of the **Philistines**. And David did so, as the LORD had commanded him; and smote the Philistines from Geba until thou come to Gazer.

Daniel 10:1 In the third year of Cyrus king of **Persia** a word was revealed unto Daniel, and the word was true, **even of a great warfare**, and **he gave heed to the word** and had understanding of the vision.

Daniel 10:2,3 In those days I Daniel was mourning <u>three whole weeks</u>. I ate no pleasant bread, neither came flesh nor wine in my mouth, neither did I anoint myself at all, till <u>three whole weeks</u> were fulfilled.

Daniel 10:4,5 And in the <u>four and twentieth day of the first month</u>, as I was by the side of the great river, which is Tigris, I lifted up mine eyes, and looked, and behold a man clothed in linen, whose loins were girded with fine gold of Uphaz.

Daniel 10:12-14 Then said he unto me: Fear not, Daniel, for <u>from the first day</u> that you did set your heart to understand, and to humble yourself before your God, your words were heard, and I am come <u>because of your words</u>. But the **prince of the kingdom of <u>Persia</u> withstood me <u>one and twenty days</u>; but, lo, Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, and I was left over there beside the kings of <u>Persia</u>. Now I am come to make you understand <u>what shall befall your people in the end of days.**</u>

Daniel 10:20a Then he said: Do you know why I came to you? And **now** *I* will <u>return to fight with the prince of Persia.</u>
