TORAH PORTION

Exodus 10:1 And the LORD said unto Moses, <u>Go</u> into Pharaoh: For I have hardened his heart, and the heart of his servants, that **I might show these <u>my signs</u> before him**.

Exodus 10:2 And (in order) that you may recount in the ears of your son, and of your son's son, what things I have worked in Egypt by My signs which I have done among them, that you may know how that I am the LORD.

Exodus 10;3,4 And Moses and Aaron came in to Pharaoh, and said to him, Thus said the LORD God of the Hebrews, How long will you refuse to humble yourself before me? Let my people go, that they may serve me. Else, if you refuse to let my people go, behold, tomorrow will I bring the locusts into your coast.

Exodus 10:6 And they shall fill your houses, and the houses of all your servants, and the houses of all the Egyptians, which neither your fathers, nor your fathers fathers have seen, since the day that they were on the earth to this day. <u>And he</u> turned himself, and went out from Pharaoh.

Exodus 10;7 And Pharaoh's **servants said to him**, How long shall this man be a snare to us? <u>Let the men go</u>, that they may serve the LORD their God: Don't you know that Egypt is destroyed?

Exodus 10:8,9 And Moses and Aaron were brought again to Pharaoh: And he said to them, Go, serve the LORD your God: But who are they that shall go? **And Moses said**, We will go with our young and with our old, with our sons and with our daughters, with our flocks and with our herds will we go, for we must hold a feast to the LORD.

Genesis 50:8 And all the house of Joseph, and his brethren, and his father's house, only their little ones, and their flocks, and their herds, they left in the land of Goshen.

Exodus 10:10,11 But he said to them, The Lord be with you, if ever I let you and your little ones go! Look, you have some evil purpose in mind. No! Go, the men among you, and serve the Lord, **for that is what you are asking**. And they were driven out from Pharaoh's presence.

Exodus 10:20-23 But the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart, so that he would not let the children of Israel go. And the LORD said to Moses, Stretch out your hand toward heaven, that there may be darkness over the land of Egypt, even darkness which may be felt. And Moses stretched forth his hand toward heaven, and there was a thick darkness in all the land of Egypt three days: They saw not



one another, neither rose any from his place for three days: But all the **children of Israel had light in their dwellings**.

Exodus 11:3 And the LORD gave the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians. Moreover the man Moses was very great in the land of Egypt, in the sight of Pharaoh's servants, and in the sight of the people.

Exodus 11:4-7 So Moses said, Thus says the Lord: About **midnight** I will go out in the midst of Egypt, and <u>every firstborn</u> in the land of Egypt shall die, from <u>the firstborn</u> of Pharaoh who sits on his throne, even to <u>the firstborn</u> of the slave girl who is behind the handmill, and all <u>the firstborn</u> of the cattle. There shall be **a great cry** throughout all the land of Egypt, such as there has never been, nor ever will be again. But <u>not a dog shall growl against any of the people of Israel</u>, either man or beast, <u>that **you may know** that the Lord makes a distinction between Egypt and Israel</u>.

Exodus 11:8 And all these <u>your servants</u> shall come down **to me**, and **bow down themselves to me**, saying, Get you out, and all the people that follow you and after that I will go out. And he went out from Pharaoh in a great anger.

Exodus 12:1-3 And the LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt saying, This month shall be to you the beginning of months: <u>It shall be the first month of the year</u> to you. Speak you to all the congregation of Israel, saying, In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of their fathers, a lamb for an house.

Exodus 12:7-8 And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper doorpost of the houses, wherein they shall eat it. And they shall **eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire,** and unleavened bread, and with bitter herbs they shall eat it.

Exodus 12:12 For I will go through the land of Egypt in that night, and will smite all the first-born in the land of Egypt, both man and beast, and **against all the gods of Egypt** I will execute judgments: I am the LORD.

Exodus 12:13 And the blood shall be <u>a sign</u> for you on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I shall pass over you, and let the plague not come on you to destroy you when I smite the land of Mitsrayim.

Exodus 12:14 And this day shall be unto you for <u>a memorial</u>, and you shall keep it a feast to the LORD throughout your generations, you shall keep it a feast by an ordinance forever.



Exodus 12:29,30 And it came to pass, that **at midnight** the Lord <u>smote all the firstborn</u> in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh that sat on his throne unto the firstborn of the captive that was in the dungeon, and all the firstborn of cattle. And Pharaoh rose up in the night, he, and all his servants, and all the Egyptians, and there was a **great cry** in Egypt, for there was not a house where there was not one dead.

Job 34:20 In a moment they die, even **at midnight**, the people are shaken and pass away, and the mighty are taken away without hand.

Psalm 119:61-63 The bands of the wicked have enclosed me, but I have not forgotten Thy law. **At midnight** I will rise to give thanks unto Thee because of Thy righteous ordinances. I am a companion of all them that fear Thee, and of them that observe Thy precepts.

Judges 16:3 And Samson lay till **midnight**, and arose at midnight, and laid hold of the doors of the gate of the city, and the two posts, and plucked them up, bar and all, and put them upon his shoulders, and carried them up to the top of the mountain that is before Hebron.

Ruth 3:8 And it came to pass **at midnight**, that the man was startled, and turned himself, and, behold, a woman lay at his feet.

Matthew 25:6-8 And at midnight there was a cry made, Behold, the bridegroom cometh, go ye out to meet him. Then all those virgins arose, and trimmed their lamps. And the foolish said unto the wise, Give us of your oil, for our lamps are gone out.

Exodus 12:43-46 The LORD said to Moses and Aaron, This is the ordinance of the Passover. No foreigner shall eat of it, but every man's servant who is bought for money, when you have circumcised him, then shall he eat of it. A foreigner and a hired servant shall not eat of it. In one house shall it be eaten, you shall not carry out anything of the flesh abroad out of the house, **neither shall you break a bone of it.**

John 19:36 For these things were done, that the scripture should be fulfilled, A bone of him shall not be broken.

Exodus 13:3-5a Then Moses said to the people, **Remember this day** in which you came out from Egypt, out of the house of slavery, for by a strong hand the Lord brought you out from this place. No leavened bread shall be eaten. Today, in the month of Abib, you are going out. And when the Lord brings you into the land of the Canaanites,



Luke 22:19 And he took bread, and gave thanks, and broke it, and gave to them, saying, This is my body which is given for you: **This do in remembrance** of me.

HHBNT John 19:31-34 Because it was the day of preparation, the Jewish people did not want the bodies to remain on the cross during the day of Shabbat. After all, that Shabbat was a solemn feast day. So they asked Pilate to have the legs broken so that the bodies could be taken away. With that, the [Roman] soldiers came and broke the legs of the first man and of the other who was being crucified along with Him. When coming to Yeshua, however, since they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. Nonetheless, one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear. At once, blood and water came out.

Leviticus 23:4-6 These are the fixed feasts of the Lord, the holy days of worship which you will keep at their regular times. In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at nightfall, is the Lord's Passover, And **on the fifteenth day of the same month** is the feast of unleavened bread, for seven days let your food be unleavened bread.

Digging deeper into the Gospels

(AKJV) Mark 3:1-6 And Yeshua entered again into the synagogue, and there was a man there which had a withered hand. And they watched him, whether he would heal him on the sabbath day, that they might accuse him. And he said to the man which had the withered hand, Stand forth. And he said to them, Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath days, or to do evil? To save life, or to destroy? But they held their peace. And when he had looked round about on them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts, he said to the man, Stretch forth your hand. And he stretched it out: And his hand was restored whole as the other. And the Pharisees went forth, and straightway took counsel with the Herodians against him, how they might destroy him.

(AKJV) **Deuteronomy 11:1-4** Therefore you shall love the LORD your God, and keep his charge, and his statutes, and his judgments, and <u>his commandments</u>, always. And know you this day: For I speak not with your children which have not known, and which have not seen the chastisement of the LORD your God, his greatness, <u>his mighty hand</u>, and <u>his stretched out arm</u>, And <u>his miracles</u>, and <u>his acts</u>, which he did <u>in the middle of Egypt</u> to Pharaoh the king of Egypt, and to all his land, And what he did to the army of Egypt, to their horses, and to their chariots, <u>how he made the water of the Red sea to overflow them</u> as they pursued after you, and how the LORD has <u>destroyed them</u> to this day.

Deuteronomy 11.26-28: Behold, **I set before you this day <u>a blessing and a</u> curse:** The blessing, if you obey the commandments of the LORD your God,



which I command you this day, and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn aside from the way which I command you this day, to go after other gods which you have not known.

Deuteronomy 30:15-18 See, I have set before you this day <u>life and good, death and evil</u>. If you obey the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you this day, by loving the LORD your God, by walking in his ways, and by keeping his commandments and his statutes and his ordinances, then you shall live and multiply, and <u>the LORD your God will bless you</u> in the land which you are entering to take possession of it. But if your heart turns away, and you will not hear, but are drawn away to worship other gods and serve them, I declare to you this day, that you shall perish; <u>you shall not live</u> long in the land which you are going over the Jordan to enter and possess.

Exodus 5:1 Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Let my people go.

Exodus 7:14-16 And the LORD said unto Moses, Pharaoh's heart is hardened, he refuse to let the people go. Get thee unto Pharaoh in the morning, lo, he goes out unto the water, and thou shalt stand by the river's brink against he come, and the rod which was turned to a serpent shalt thou take in thine hand. And thou shalt say unto him, The LORD God of the Hebrews hath sent me unto thee, saying, Let my people go.

Exodus 8:1 And the LORD spoke unto Moses, Go unto Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Let my people go, that they may serve me.

Exodus 8:20 And the LORD said unto Moses, Rise up early in the morning, and stand before Pharaoh, lo, he cometh forth to the water, and say unto him, Thus saith the LORD, **Let my people go**, that they may serve me.

Exodus 9:1 Then the LORD said unto Moses, Go in unto Pharaoh, and tell him, Thus saith the LORD God of the Hebrews, **Let my people go, that they may serve me.**

Exodus 9:13 And the LORD said unto Moses, Rise up early in the morning, and stand before Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith the LORD God of the Hebrews, **Let my people go, that they may serve me.**

Exodus 10:3 And Moses and Aaron came in unto Pharaoh, and said unto him, Thus saith the LORD God of the Hebrews, How long wilt thou refuse to humble thyself before me? **Let my people go, that they may serve me.**

Exodus 14:13-18 And Moses said unto the people, Fear ye not, **stand still,** and see the salvation of the LORD, which he will shew to you today: For the



Egyptians whom ye have seen today, ye shall see them again no more forever. The LORD shall fight for you, and ye shall hold your peace. And the **Lord said unto Moses**, Wherefore criest thou unto me? Speak unto the children of Israel, that they go forward: But lift thou up thy rod, and **stretch out thine hand** over the sea, and divide it: And the children of Israel shall go on dry ground through the midst of the sea. And I, behold, I will **harden the hearts of the Egyptians**, and they shall follow them: And I will get me honor upon Pharaoh, and upon all his host, upon his chariots, and upon his horsemen. And the **Egyptians shall know** that I am the Lord, when I have gotten me honor upon Pharaoh, upon his chariots, and upon his horsemen.

Exodus 14:21 And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and the Lord caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided.

Exodus 14:25-27 And took off their chariot wheels, that they drove them heavily: so that the Egyptians said, Let us flee from the face of Israel, <u>for the Lord fighteth for them against the Egyptians</u>. And the Lord said unto Moses, <u>Stretch out thine hand</u> over the sea, that the waters may come again upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots, and upon their horsemen. <u>And Moses **stretched forth his hand**</u> over the sea, and the sea returned to his strength when the morning appeared, and the Egyptians fled against it, and the Lord overthrew the Egyptians in the midst of the sea.

Leviticus 23:6-8 And on the fifteenth day of the same month is the feast of unleavened bread unto the Lord: Seven days ye must eat unleavened bread. In the first day ye shall have an holy convocation: Ye shall do no servile work therein. But ye shall offer an offering made by fire unto the Lord seven days: In the seventh day is an holy convocation: Ye shall do no servile work therein.

Joshua 19:17,18 And the fourth lot came out to Issachar, for the children of Issachar according to their families. And their border was toward Jezreel, and Chesulloth, and **Shunem**,

- **2 Kings 4:8,9** And it fell on a day, that **Elisha passed to Shunem**, where was a great woman, and she constrained him to eat bread. And so it was, that as oft as he passed by, he turned in thither to eat bread. And she said to her husband, Behold now, I perceive that this is an holy man of God, which passes by us continually.
- **2 Kings 4:14-17** And he said, What then is to be done for her? And Gehazi answered, Truly **she has no child**, and her husband is old. And he said, Call her. And when he had called her, she stood in the door. And he said, About this season, according to the time of life, you shall embrace a son. And she said, No,



my lord, you man of God, do not lie to your handmaid. And the woman conceived, and bore a son at that season that Elisha had said to her, according to the time of life.

- **2 Kings 4:18-20** And when the child was grown, it fell on a day, that he went out to his father to the reapers. And he said to his father, My head, my head. And he said to a lad, Carry him to his mother. And when he had taken him, and brought him to his mother, he sat on her knees till noon, and then died.
- **2 Kings 4:35-37** Then he returned, and walked in the house to and fro, and went up, and stretched himself on him: And the child sneezed seven times, and the child opened his eyes. And he called Gehazi, and said, Call this **Shunammite**. So he called her. And when she was come in to him, he said, Take up your son. Then she went in, and fell at his feet, and bowed herself to the ground, and took up her son, and went out.
- **Luke 7:1-5** After he had finished speaking in the hearing of the people, he entered into Capernaum. A certain centurion's servant, who was dear to him, was sick and at the point of death. When he heard about Yeshua, he sent to him Jewish elders, asking him to come and save his servant. When they came to Yeshua, they begged him earnestly, saying, **He is worthy** for you to do this for him, for he loves our nation, and **he built our synagogue for us**.
- Luke 7:6,7 Yeshua went with them. When he was now not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to him, saying to him, Lord, don't trouble yourself, <u>for I am not worthy</u> for you to come under my roof. Therefore I didn't even think myself worthy to come to you, but say the word, and my servant will be healed.
- Luke 7:9-12 When Yeshua heard these things, he marveled at him, and turned and said to the multitude who followed him, I tell you, I have not found such great faith, no, not in Israel. Those who were sent, returning to the house, found that the servant who had been sick was well. It happened soon afterwards, that he went to a city called Nain. Many of his disciples, along with a great multitude, went with him. Now when he drew near to the gate of the city, behold, one who was dead was carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. Many people of the city were with her.
- Luke 7:13-17 When the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her, and said to her, Don't cry. He came near and touched the coffin, and the bearers stood still. He said, Young man, I tell you, arise! He who was dead sat up, and began to speak. And he gave him to his mother. Fear took hold of all, and they glorified God, saying, A great prophet has arisen among us! and, God has visited his people! This report went out concerning him in the whole of Judea, and in all the surrounding region.
