ויקרא פרק טז Leviticus Chapter 16

The 'seh'- lamb is a young sheep or goat. It is the most significant sacrificial animal in the Bible. It is also mentioned with another Hebrew name which is the name of the adult of this species: 'ke•ves' בֶּבֶּשׁ, sheep. In many references the 'seh' is mentioned as a 'year-old sheep.' The detailed rules of the offering ritual are found mainly in the Books of Leviticus and Numbers. Whereas the ordinary ritual requires a young lamb, the sacrificial lamb of certain holidays such as Yom Kippur (The Day of Atonement), and Passover in particular, must be 'without blemish.' The word for this phrase is 'ta•min' תְּמִים, which also means innocent or perfect: 'Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year; you shall take it out from the sheep, or from the goats;' Exodus 12:5.

This Old Testament 'seh' שָׁה mirrors the image and character of the Messiah, and indeed, He is innocent, perfect, with no blemish and He was prophesied to pay with His life for the sins of all of us: 'All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, but he humbled himself and opened not his mouth; he was brought like a lamb to the slaughter, and like a sheep, that is dumb before its shearers, he did not open his mouth.' Isaiah 53:6-7.

Laying Down the Sacrifice

What you won't see in English Bibles is the etymological source of this word. In this case, it has a deep significance because 'seh' is closely related to the ancient verb 'shutt,' 'to place,' 'to lay down.' Hence, the sacrificial attribute is inherently 'built-in' the word 'seh.' The sacrificed 'seh' is the most important metaphor in the New Testament. In Hebrew 'Seh Ha•Elohim' שֵׁה הָאֱלֹהִים, is The Lamb of God: 'The next day, he saw Jesus coming to him, and said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!' John 1:29.

Just like the 'seh' of the Old Testament, The Lamb of God fulfills the purpose of paying for the sins of others.

The Scapegoat

On Yom Kippur יוֹם כָּפוֹר, as mentioned above, the sacrifice was without blemish. Its purity was essential to contrast with the sin of others. The Hebrew idiom taken from Leviticus 16:10, 26, 'Sa•eer la•Aza•zel' שָׁעִיר לַעְיָאוֹל, is this scapegoat. Literally, it means 'a goat to Azazel.' It was the goat that was sent

to Azazel into the wilderness outside Jerusalem. The ancient Azazel was a cliff from which the scapegoat was sent to its death. The Apocrypha, on the other hand, refers to Azazel as a demonic or satanic entity.

'But the goat, on which the lot fell to be for Azazel, shall be presented alive before the Lord, to make an atonement with him, and to let him go to Azazel into the wilderness.' Leviticus 16:10.

This **scapegoat** was the Old Testament's **sacrifice** for the sins of Israel. It was sent to its death from a **cliff** named Azazel **outside** the walls of **Jerusalem**.

Compare it now to the New Testament's 'The Lamb of God' 'Seh Ha•Elohim,' Jesus, Yeshua. He was crucified on Golgotha (Calvary in Latin), which was the name of a hill and a rock, located outside the walls of Jerusalem.

With this parallel, is there any need to further explain Who is Yeshua and for what purpose He was sacrificed?
