TORAH PORTION

Deuteronomy 1:1a These are the words which Moses spoke unto all Israel on this side Jordan in the wilderness,

John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

Proverbs 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue.

Psalm 34:12,13 Who is the man who desires life, and loves many days, that he may see good? Keep your tongue from evil, and your lips from speaking deceit.

Ephesians 4:29,31 Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice.

Deuteronomy 1:34,35 And the Lord <u>heard the voice of your words</u>, and was wroth, and sware, saying, Surely there shall not one of these men of this evil generation see that good land, which I sware to give unto your fathers.

Deuteronomy 1:2,3 (There are eleven days' journey from Horeb by the way of mount Seir unto Kadeshbarnea.) And it came to pass in the fortieth year, in the eleventh month, on the first day of the month, that Moses spoke unto the children of Israel, according unto all that the Lord had given him in commandment unto them.

Deuteronomy 4:23 Take heed unto yourselves, <u>lest ye forget</u> the covenant of the LORD your God, which he made with you, and make you a graven image, or the likeness of anything, which the LORD thy God hath forbidden thee.

Deuteronomy 4:9-13 Only take heed to thyself, and keep thy soul diligently, lest thou forget the things which thine eyes have seen, and lest they depart from thy heart all the days of thy life: But teach them thy sons, and thy sons' sons, Especially the day that thou stoodest before the LORD thy God in Horeb, when the LORD said unto me, Gather me the people together, and I will make them hear my words, that they may learn to fear me all the days that they shall live upon the earth, and that they may teach their children. And ye came near and stood under the mountain, and the mountain burned with fire unto the midst of heaven, with darkness, clouds, and thick darkness. And the LORD spoke unto you out of the midst of the fire: Ye heard the voice of the words, but saw no similitude, only ye heard a voice. And he declared unto you his covenant, which he commanded you to perform, even ten commandments; and he wrote them upon two tables of stone.

Deuteronomy 5:15 And remember that you were a servant in the land of Egypt, and that the LORD thy God brought thee out thence through a mighty hand and by a stretched out arm: Therefore the LORD thy God commanded thee to keep the sabbath day.

Deuteronomy 7:17-19 If thou shalt say in thine heart, These nations are more than I, how can I dispossess them? Thou shalt **not be afraid of them**: But **shalt well <u>remember</u> what the LORD thy God did unto Pharaoh, and unto all Egypt,** The great temptations which thine eyes saw, and the signs, and the wonders, and the mighty hand, and the stretched out arm, whereby the LORD thy God brought thee out: So shall the LORD thy God do unto all the people of whom thou art afraid.

Deuteronomy 8:2 And thou shalt <u>remember</u> all the way which the LORD thy God led thee these forty years in the wilderness, to humble thee, and to prove thee, to know what was in thine heart, whether thou would keep his commandments, or no. Deuteronomy 9:7 Remember, and forget not, how thou provoke the LORD thy God to wrath in the wilderness: From the day that thou didst depart out of the land of Egypt, until ye came unto this place, ye have been rebellious against the LORD.

Deuteronomy 24:9 Remember what the LORD thy God did unto Miriam by the way, after that ye were come forth out of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 32:7-8 Remember the days of old, consider the years of many generations: Ask thy father, and he will shew thee, thy elders, and they will tell thee. When the most High divided to the nations their inheritance, when he separated the sons of Adam, he set the bounds of the people according to the number of the children of Israel.

Deuteronomy 32:6 Is this your answer to the Lord, O foolish people and unwise? Is he not **your Father** who has given you life? He has made you and given you your place.

Deuteronomy 7:6-9 For you are an holy people unto the LORD your God: The LORD your God hath chosen you to be a special people unto himself, above all people that are upon the face of the earth. The LORD did not set his love upon you, nor choose you, because ye were more in number than any people, for ye were the fewest of all people: But because the LORD loved you, and because he would keep the oath which he had sworn unto your fathers, hath the LORD brought you out with a mighty hand, and redeemed you out of the house of bondmen, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt. Know therefore that the LORD thy God, he is God, the faithful God, which keeps covenant and mercy with them that love him and keep his commandments to a thousand generations.

Deuteronomy 1:22,23 And **you** came near to me every one of you, and said, We will send men before us, and they shall search us out the land, and bring us word again by what way we must

go up, and into what cities we shall come. And the saying pleased me well: And I took twelve men of you, one of a tribe.

Deuteronomy 1:27 And ye murmured in your tents, and said, **Because the Lord hated us,** he hath brought us forth out of the land of Egypt, to deliver us into the hand of the Amorites, to destroy us.

Matthew 25:24 Then he which had received the one talent came and said, Lord, I knew you that you are an hard man, reaping where you have not sown, and gathering where you have not strewed.

Deuteronomy 1:29,30 Then I said unto you, Dread not, neither be afraid of them. The Lord your God which goes before you, he shall fight for you, according to all that he did for you in Egypt before your eyes.

Deuteronomy 1:31 And in the wilderness, where thou hast seen how that the Lord thy God bare thee, as <u>a man doth bear his</u> <u>son</u>, in all the way that ye went, until ye came into this place. Yet in this thing ye did not believe the Lord your God,

Deuteronomy 1:32-35 Yet in this thing **you did not believe** the LORD your God, Who went in the way before you, to search you out a place to pitch your tents in, in fire by night, to show you by what way you should go, and in a cloud by day. And the LORD heard **the <u>voice</u> of your words**, and was wroth, and sware, saying, Surely there shall not one of these men of this **evil generation** see that good land, which I swore to give unto your fathers,

Deuteronomy 1:39 Moreover your little ones, that ye said should be a prey, and your children, that this day have no knowledge of good or evil, they shall go in thither, and unto them will I give it, and they shall possess it.

Deuteronomy 1:45 And ye returned and wept before the Lord, but the Lord would not hearken to your voice, nor give ear unto you.

Deuteronomy 2:4,5 And command thou the people, saying, Ye are to pass through the coast of your brethren the **children of Esau**, which dwell in Seir, and they shall be afraid of you: Take ye good heed unto yourselves therefore: **Meddle not with them**, for I will not give you of their land, no, not so much as a foot breadth, because I have given mount Seir unto Esau for a possession.

Deuteronomy 2:9 And the Lord said unto me, **Distress not** the **Moabites**, neither contend with them in battle: For I will not give thee of their land for a possession, because I have given Ar unto the children of Lot for a possession.

Deuteronomy 2:19 And when thou comes nigh over against the children of **Ammon**, **distress them not**, nor meddle with them: For I will not give thee of the land of the children of Ammon any possession, because I have given it unto the children of Lot for a possession.

Deuteronomy 2:10 The Emims dwelt therein in times past, a people great, and many, and tall, as the Anakims, Which also were accounted giants, as the Anakims, but the Moabites call them Emims.

Deuteronomy 2:12 The Horims also dwelt in Seir before time, but the children of Esau succeeded them, when they had destroyed them from before them, and dwelt in their stead, as Israel did unto the land of his possession, which the Lord gave unto them.

Deuteronomy 2:20 (That also was accounted a land of giants: Giants dwelt therein in old time, and the Ammonites call them Zamzummims, A people great, and many, and tall, as the

Anakims, but the Lord destroyed them before them, and they succeeded them, and dwelt in their stead.

Isaiah 1:1-4 The <u>vision</u> of Isaiah the son of Amoz, which he saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem, in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah. Hear, heavens, and listen, earth, for the LORD has spoken: I have nourished and brought up children, and **they have rebelled against me**. The ox knows his owner, and the donkey his master's crib, but Israel doesn't know, my people don't consider. Ah sinful nation, a people loaded with iniquity, a seed of evildoers, children who deal corruptly! They have forsaken the LORD. They have despised the Holy One of Israel. They are estranged and backward.

STUDYING THE TORAH

Genesis 7:7 And <u>Noah</u> went in, and <u>his sons</u>, and <u>his wife</u>, and his sons' <u>wives</u> with him, into the ark, because of the waters of the flood.

Genesis 8:15,16 And God spoke unto Noah, saying, Go forth of the ark, you, and your wife, and your sons, and your sons' wives with thee. Out of respect for the dying there was no cohabitation but after they would.

Genesis 11:10 These are the generations of Shem: Shem was an hundred years old, and begat Arphaxad <u>two years after</u> the flood.

Exodus 14:22 And the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea upon the dry ground: And the waters were a wall unto them on their right hand, and on their left.

Exodus 14:29 But the children of Israel <u>walked upon dry land in the midst of the sea,</u> and the waters were a wall unto them on their right hand, and on their left.

Exodus 20:12 Honor thy <u>father and thy mother</u>: That thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee.

Leviticus 19:3 You shall fear every man his <u>mother</u>, and <u>his</u> father.

Genesis 11:30 (And Sarai had no child) (she was barren)

Genesis 11:30 And Sarai was barren, she had no child.

Deuteronomy 25:5 If brothers dwell together, and one of them dies and has no son, the wife of the dead man shall not be married outside the family to a stranger. Her husband's brother shall go in to her and take her as his wife and perform the duty of a husband's brother to her.

Genesis 11:28,29 Haran died in the presence of his father Terah in the land of his kindred, in Ur of the Chaldeans. And Abram and Nahor took wives. The name of Abram's wife was Sarai, and the name of Nahor's wife, Milcah, the daughter of Haran the father of Milcah and Iscah.

Genesis 20:12 Besides, she is indeed my sister, the daughter of my father though not the daughter of my mother, and <u>she</u> became my wife.

Exodus 20:8-11 Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labor, and do all thy work, but the seventh day is a sabbath unto the LORD thy God, in it thou shalt not do any manner of work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, nor thy man-servant, nor thy maid-servant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates, for in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested on the seventh day, wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it.

Deuteronomy 5:15 And thou shalt <u>remember</u> that thou was a servant in the land of Egypt, and the LORD thy God brought thee out thence by a mighty hand and by an outstretched arm; therefore the LORD thy God <u>commanded</u> thee to keep the sabbath day.

Genesis 39:13-16 And as soon as she saw that he had left his garment in her hand and had fled out of the house, she called to the people of her household and said to them, See, he has brought among us a Hebrew man to laugh at us. He came in to me to lie with me, and I cried out with a loud voice. And as soon as he heard that I lifted up my voice and cried out, he left his garment beside me and fled and got out of the house. Then she laid up his garment by her until his master came home.

Genesis 39:17,18 And she told him the same story, saying, The Hebrew servant, whom you have brought among us, came in to me to laugh at me. But as soon as I lifted up my voice and cried, he left his garment beside me and fled out of the house.

Genesis 4:1,2a And the man knew Eve his wife, and she conceived and bore Cain, and said: I have gotten a man with the help of the LORD. And again she bore <u>his brother</u> Abel.

Genesis 4:8-11 And Cain spoke unto Abel his brother. And it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him. And the LORD said unto Cain: Where is Abel thy brother? And he said: I know not, am I my brother's keeper? And He said: What hast thou done? The voice of thy brother's blood crieth unto Me from the ground. And now cursed art thou from the ground, which hath opened her mouth to receive thy brother's blood from thy hand.

Amos 1:9 Thus saith the LORD: For three transgressions of Tyre, yea, for four, I will not reverse it: Because they delivered up a whole captivity to Edom and remembered not the **brotherly covenant.**

Genesis 25:31-34 And Jacob said: Sell me first thy birthright. And Esau said: Behold, I am at the point to die, and what profit shall the birthright do to me? And Jacob said: Swear to me first, and he swore unto him, and he sold his birthright unto Jacob. And Jacob gave Esau bread and pottage of lentils, and he did eat and drink, and rose up, and went his way. So Esau despised his birthright.

Genesis 27:19 And Jacob said unto his father: I am Esau thy first-born.

Genesis 27:32 And Isaac his father said unto him: Who art thou? And he said: I am thy son, thy first-born, Esau.

Genesis 27:36 And he said: Is not he rightly named Jacob? for he hath supplanted me these two times: He <u>took away</u> my birthright, and, behold, now he hath taken away my blessing.

Genesis 25:24-26 So when her days were fulfilled for her to give birth, indeed there were twins in her womb. And the first came out red. He was like a hairy garment all over, so they called his name Esau. Afterward his brother came out, and his hand took hold of Esau's heel, so his name was called Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when she bore them.

Genesis 25:27,28 So the boys grew. And Esau was a skillful hunter, a man of the field, but Jacob was a mild man, dwelling in tents. And Isaac loved Esau because he ate of his game, but Rebekah loved Jacob.

Genesis 25:29,30 Now Jacob cooked a stew, and Esau came in from the field, and he was weary. And Esau said to Jacob, **Please** <u>feed me</u> with that same <u>red</u> <u>stew</u>, for I am weary. Therefore, **his** name was called Edom.

Genesis 25:31,32 But Jacob said, Sell me your birthright as of this day. And Esau said, Look, I am about to die, so what is this birthright to me?

Genesis 25:33,34 Then And Jacob said, Swear to me as of this day. So he swore to him, and <u>sold</u> his birthright to Jacob. And Jacob gave Esau bread and stew of lentils, then and he ate and drank, and arose, and went his way. Therefore, Esau despised his birthright.

Genesis 26:34 Then Esau was forty years old, he took as wives Judith the daughter of Beeri the Hittite, and Basemath the daughter of Elon the Hittite. And they were a grief of mind to Isaac and Rebekah.

Genesis 28:6-9 Esau saw that Isaac had blessed Jacob and sent him away to Padan Aram to take himself a wife from there, and that as he blessed him he gave him a charge, saying, You shall not take a wife from the daughters of Canaan, and that Jacob had obeyed his father and his mother and had gone to Padan Aram. Also Esau saw that the daughters of Canaan did not please his father Isaac. So Esau went to Ishmael and took Mahalath the daughter of Ishmael, Abraham's son, the sister of Nebajoth, to be his wife in addition to the wives he had.

Genesis 25:33,34 Then And Jacob said, Swear to me as of this day. So he swore to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob. Then Jacob <u>gave</u> Esau <u>bread</u> and stew of lentils, then he ate and <u>drank</u>, arose, and went his way. Thus Esau despised his birthright.
