TORAH PORTION

Deuteronomy 11:26-29 <u>Behold</u>, I set before you this day a blessing and a curse: The blessing, if you shall listen to the commandments of the LORD your God, which I command you this day, and the curse, if you shall not listen to the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn aside out of the way which I command you this day, to go after other gods, which you have not known. It shall happen, when the LORD your God shall bring you into the land where you go to possess it, that you shall set the blessing on Mount Gerizim, and the curse on Mount Ebal.

Joshua 8:30 Then Joshua built an altar unto the LORD God of Israel in Mount Ebal,

Deuteronomy 11:30 Aren't they beyond the Jordan, behind the way of the going down of the sun, in the land of the Canaanites who dwell in the Arabah, over against Gilgal, beside the **oaks of Moreh**?

Genesis 12:5-7 Abram took Sarai his wife, Lot his brother's son, all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls whom they had gotten in Haran, and they went to go into the land of Canaan. Into the land of Canaan they came. Abram passed through the land to the place of Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. The Canaanite was then in the land. The LORD appeared to Abram and said, I will give this land to your seed. He built an altar there to the LORD, who appeared to him.

Deuteronomy 12:2,3 You shall utterly destroy all the places, wherein the nations which you shall possess served their gods, on the high mountains, and on the hills, and under every green tree: And you shall overthrow their altars, and break their pillars, and burn their groves with fire, and you shall hew down the graven images of their gods, and destroy the names of them out of that place.

Deuteronomy 12:5 But unto **the place** which the **LORD your God shall choose** out of all your tribes to put his name there, even unto his habitation shall ye seek, and thither thou shalt come.

Deuteronomy 12:8 You shall not do after all the things that we do here this day, every man whatever is right in his own eyes.

Deuteronomy 13:18 When you shall listen to the voice of the LORD your God, to keep all his commandments which I command you this day, to do that which is right in the eyes of the LORD your God.

Judges 21:25 In those days there was no king in Israel: Every man did that which was right in his own eyes.

Deuteronomy 12:10,11 But when you go over the Jordan and live in the land that the LORD your God is giving you to inherit, and when he gives you rest from all your enemies around, so that you live in safety, then **to the place** that the LORD your God will choose, to make his name dwell there, there you shall bring all that I command you: Your burnt offerings and your sacrifices, your tithes and the contribution that you present, and all your finest vow offerings that you vow to the LORD.

Deuteronomy 12:5 in <u>all places where I record my name</u> I will come unto thee, and I will bless thee.

Genesis 22:2,3 And he said, Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac, whom thou lovest, and get thee into the land of Moriah, and offer him there for a burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of. And Abraham rose up early in the morning, and saddled his ass, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son, and clave the wood for the burnt offering, and rose up, and went unto the place of which God had told him.

Genesis 22:4 Then on the third day Abraham lifted up his eyes, and saw the place afar off.

Genesis 22:14 And Abraham called the name **of <u>that place</u>** Jehovah Jireh יהוה יראה as it is said to this day, In the mount of the LORD it shall be **seen.**

Deuteronomy 12:28-32 Observe and hear all these words which I command you, that it may go well with you, and with your children after you forever, when you do that which is good and right in the sight of the LORD your God. When the LORD your God shall cut off the nations from before you, where you go to possess them, and you succeed them, and dwell in their land, Take heed to yourself that you be not snared by following them, after that they be destroyed from before you, and that you inquire not after their gods, saying, How did these nations serve their gods? Even so will I do likewise. You shall not do so to the LORD your God: For every abomination to the LORD, which he hates, have they done to their gods, for even their sons and their daughters they have burnt in the fire to their gods. What thing so ever I command you, observe to do it: Thou shalt not add thereto, nor diminish from it.

Deuteronomy 13:1-5 If there arise among you a prophet, or a dreamer of dreams, and giveth thee a sign or a wonder, And the sign or the wonder come to pass, whereof he spoke unto thee, saying, Let us go after other gods, which thou hast not known, and let us serve them, Thou shalt not hearken unto the words of that prophet, or that dreamer of dreams: For the LORD your God proveth you, to know whether ye love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul. Ye shall walk after the LORD your God, and fear him, and keep his commandments, and obey his voice, and ye shall serve him, and cleave unto him. And that prophet, or that dreamer of dreams, shall be put to death, because he hath spoken to turn you away from the LORD your God,

Acts 2:22 Ye men of Israel, hear these words, Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know.

Matthew 24:24 For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew <u>great signs and wonders</u>, insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect.

2 Thessalonians 2:8,9 And then shall that wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy

with the brightness of his coming: Even him, whose coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders, And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish, because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved.

Deuteronomy 14:7,8 Nevertheless these ye shall not eat of them that chew the cud, or of them that divide the cloven hoof, as the camel, and **the hare**, and the coney: For they chew the cud, but divide not the hoof, therefore they are unclean unto you. And the swine, because it divideth the hoof, yet cheweth not the cud, it is unclean unto you: Ye shall not eat of their flesh, nor touch their dead carcass.

Deuteronomy 14:11-21 Of all clean birds ye shall eat. But these are they of which ye shall not eat: The eagle, and the ossifrage, and the ospray, And the glede, and the kite, and the vulture after his kind, And every raven after his kind, And the owl, and the night hawk, and the cuckow, and the hawk after his kind, The little owl, and the great owl, and the swan, And the pelican, and the gier eagle, and the cormorant, And the stork, and the heron after her kind, and the lapwing, and the bat. And every creeping thing that flieth is unclean unto you: They shall not be eaten. But of all clean fowls ye may eat. Ye shall not eat of anything that dieth of itself: Thou shalt give it unto the stranger that is in thy gates, that he may eat it, or thou mayest sell it unto an alien: For thou art an holy people unto the LORD thy God. Thou shalt not seethe a kid in his mother's milk.

Leviticus 22:8 He shall not eat what dies of itself or is torn by beasts, and so make himself unclean by it: I am the LORD.

Deuteronomy 15:1,2 At the end of every seven years thou shalt make a release. And this is the manner of the release: Every creditor that lendeth ought unto his neighbour shall release it, he shall not exact it of his neighbour, or of his brother, because it is called the LORD's release.

Deuteronomy 15:7-9 If there be among you a poor man of one of your brothers within any of your gates in your land which the LORD your God gives you, you shall not harden your heart, nor shut your hand

from your poor brother: But you shall open your hand wide to him, and shall surely lend him sufficient for his need, in that which he wants. Beware that there be not a thought in your wicked heart, saying, The seventh year, the year of release, is at hand, and your <u>eye be evil</u> against your poor brother, and you give him nothing, and he cry to the LORD against you, and it be sin to you.

Matthew 6:22-24 The light of the body is the eye: If therefore your eye be single, your whole body shall be full of light. But <u>if your eye</u> <u>be evil</u>, your whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in you be darkness, how great is that darkness! No man can serve two masters: For either he will hate the one, and love the other, or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. <u>You cannot serve God</u> and mammon.

Proverbs 28:22 He that hastens to be rich has an <u>evil eye</u>, and considers not that poverty shall come on him.

Proverbs 22:9 He that has a <u>bountiful eye</u> shall be blessed, <u>for he gives</u> <u>of his bread to the poor.</u>

Deuteronomy 16:1-3 Observe the month of Abib, and keep the Passover unto the LORD thy God: For in the month of Abib the LORD thy God brought thee forth out of Egypt by night. And you shall offer the Passover sacrifice to the Lord your God, from the flock or the herd, at the place that the Lord will choose, to make his name dwell there. You shall eat no leavened bread with it. Seven days you shall eat it with unleavened bread, the bread of affliction—for you came out of the land of Egypt in haste—that all the days of your life you may remember the day when you came out of the land of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 16:15,16 Keep the feast to the Lord your God for seven days, in the place marked out by the Lord: Because the blessing of the Lord your God will be on all the produce of your land and all the work of your hands, and you will have nothing but joy. Three times in the year let all your males come before the Lord your God in the place named by him, at the feast of unleavened bread, the feast of weeks,

and the feast of tents: And they are not to come before the Lord with nothing in their hands.

Book of Judges

- **Judges 2:1,2** Then the Angel of the LORD came up from Gilgal to Bochim, and said: I led you up from Egypt and brought you to the land of which I swore to your fathers, and I said, I will never break My covenant with you. And you shall make no covenant with the inhabitants of this land, you shall tear down their altars. But you have not obeyed My voice. Why have you done this?
- **Judges 2:3** Wherefore I also said, I will not drive them out from before you; but they shall be as thorns in your sides, and their gods shall be a snare unto you.
- **Judges 2:4,5** So it was, when the Angel of the LORD spoke these words to all the children of Israel, that the people lifted up their voices and wept. Then they called the name of that place Bochim, and they sacrificed there to the LORD.
- **Judges 2:10** When all that generation had been gathered to their fathers, another generation arose after them who did not know the LORD nor the work which He had done for Israel.
- **Judges 2:11-13** Then the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD, and served the Baals, and they forsook the LORD God of their fathers, who had brought them out of the land of Egypt, and they followed other gods from among the gods of the people who were all around them, and they bowed down to them, and they provoked the LORD to anger. They forsook the LORD and served Baal and the Ashtoreths.
- **Judges 2:14a** And the anger of the LORD was hot against Israel. So He delivered them into the hands of plunderers who despoiled them, and He sold them into the hands of their enemies all around.

Judges 2:16,17a Nevertheless, the LORD raised up judges who delivered them out of the hand of those who plundered them. Yet they would not listen to their judges, but they played the harlot with other gods, and bowed down to them.

Judges 2:18,19a And when the LORD raised up judges for them, the LORD was with the judge and delivered them out of the hand of their enemies all the days of the judge, for the LORD was moved to pity by their groaning because of those who oppressed them and harassed them. And it came to pass, when the judge was dead, that they reverted and behaved more corruptly than their fathers, by following other gods, to serve them and bow down to them.

Judges 2:20-23 Then the anger of the LORD was hot against Israel, and He said, Because this nation has transgressed My covenant which I commanded their fathers, and has not heeded My voice, I also will no longer drive out before them any of the nations which Joshua left when he died, so that through them I may test Israel, whether they will keep the ways of the LORD, to walk in them as their fathers kept them, or not. Therefore the LORD left those nations, without driving them out immediately, nor did He deliver them into the hand of Joshua.

Judges 3:5,6 Thus the children of Israel dwelt among the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. And they took their daughters to be their wives and gave their daughters to their sons, and they served their gods.

Judges 3:8b Israel served Cushan-Rishathaim eight years.

Judges 3:9-11 When the children of Israel cried out to the LORD, the LORD raised up a deliverer for the children of Israel, who delivered them: Othniel the son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother. The Spirit of the LORD came upon him, and he judged Israel. He went out to war, and the LORD delivered Cushan-Rishathaim king of Mesopotamia into his hand, and his hand prevailed over Cushan-Rishathaim. So the land had rest for forty years. Then Othniel the son of Kenaz died.

Judges 3:12-14 And the children of Israel again did evil in the sight of the LORD. So the LORD strengthened Eglon king of Moab against Israel, because they had done evil in the sight of the LORD. Then he gathered to himself the people of Ammon and Amalek, went and defeated Israel, and took possession of the City of Palms. So the children of Israel served Eglon king of Moab eighteen years.

Judges 3:15b But when the children of Israel cried out to the LORD, the LORD raised up a deliverer for them: **Ehud** the son of Gera, the Benjamite, a left-handed man.

Judges 3:30 So Moab was subdued that day under the hand of Israel. And the land had rest for **eighty years.**

Judges 3:31 After him **was Shamgar** the son of Anath, who killed six hundred men of the Philistines with an ox goad, and he also delivered Israel.

Judges 4:1-4 When Ehud was dead, the children of Israel again did evil in the sight of the LORD. So the LORD sold them into the hand of Jabin king of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor. The commander of his army was Sisera, who dwelt in Harosheth Hagoyim. And the children of Israel cried out to the LORD, for Jabin had nine hundred chariots of iron, and for twenty years he had harshly oppressed the children of Israel. Now Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lapidoth, was judging Israel at that time.

Judges 4:17 However, Sisera had fled away on foot to the tent of Jael, the wife of Heber the Kenite, for there was peace between Jabin king of Hazor and the house of Heber the Kenite.

Judges 4:21 Then Jael, Heber's wife, took a tent peg and took a hammer in her hand, and went softly to him and drove the peg into his temple, and it went down into the ground, for he was fast asleep and weary. So he died.

Judges 5:13b-15a The LORD came down for me against the mighty. From Ephraim were those whose roots were in Amalek. After you, Benjamin, with your peoples, From Machir rulers came down, And from Zebulun those who bear the recruiter's staff. And the princes of Issachar were with Deborah.

Judges 5:15b-18 Among the divisions of Reuben There were great resolves of heart. Why did you sit among the sheepfolds, To hear the pipings for the flocks? The divisions of Reuben have great searchings of heart. Gilead stayed beyond the Jordan, And why did Dan remain on ships? Asher continued at the seashore, And stayed by his inlets. Zebulun is a people who jeopardized their lives to the point of death, Naphtali also, on the heights of the battlefield.

Judges 5:23 Curse Meroz, said the angel of the LORD, Curse its inhabitants bitterly, Because they did not come to the help of the LORD, To the help of the LORD against the mighty.

Judges 6:1,2 Then the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD. So the LORD delivered them into the hand of Midian for seven years, and the hand of Midian prevailed against Israel. Because of the Midianites, the children of Israel made for themselves the dens, the caves, and the strongholds which are in the mountains.

Judges 6:7-10 And it came to pass, when the children of Israel cried out to the LORD because of the Midianites, that the LORD sent a prophet to the children of Israel, who said to them, Thus says the LORD God of Israel: I brought you up from Egypt and brought you out of the house of bondage, and I delivered you out of the hand of the Egyptians and out of the hand of all who oppressed you, and drove them out before you and gave you their land. Also I said to you, I am the LORD your God, do not fear the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you dwell. But you have not obeyed My voice.

Judges 6:12,13 And the Angel of the LORD appeared to him, and said to him, The LORD is with you, you mighty man of valor! **Gideon** said to Him, O my lord, if the LORD is with us, why then has all this happened to us? And where are all His miracles which our fathers told

us about, saying, Did not the LORD bring us up from Egypt? But now the LORD has forsaken us and delivered us into the hands of the Midianites.

Judges 6:15-18 So he said to Him, O my Lord, how can I save Israel? Indeed my clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my father's house. And the LORD said to him, Surely I will be with you, and you shall defeat the Midianites as one man. Then he said to Him, If now I have found favor in Your sight, then show me a sign that it is You who talk with me. Do not depart from here, I pray, until I come to You and bring out my offering and set it before You. And He said, I will wait until you come back.

Judges 6:21-23 Then the Angel of the LORD put out the end of the staff that was in His hand and touched the meat and the unleavened bread, and fire rose out of the rock and consumed the meat and the unleavened bread. And the Angel of the LORD departed out of his sight. Now Gideon perceived that He was the Angel of the LORD. So Gideon said, Alas, O Lord GOD! For I have seen the Angel of the LORD face to face. Then the LORD said to him, Peace be with you, do not fear, you shall not die.

Judges 6:25-27 Now it came to pass the same night that the LORD said to him, Take your father's young bull, the second bull of seven years old, and tear down the altar of Baal that your father has, and cut down the wooden image that is beside it, and build an altar to the LORD your God on top of this rock in the proper arrangement, and take the second bull and offer a burnt sacrifice with the wood of the image which you shall cut down. So Gideon took ten men from among his servants and did as the LORD had said to him. But because he feared his father's household and the men of the city too much to do it by day, he did it by night.

Judges 6:30,31 Then the men of the city said to Joash, Bring out your son, that he may die, because he has torn down the altar of Baal, and because he has cut down the wooden image that was beside it. But Joash said to all who stood against him, Would you plead for Baal? Would you save him? Let the one who would plead for him be put to

death by morning! If he is a god, let him plead for himself, because his altar has been torn down!

Judges 6:33-35 Then all the Midianites and Amalekites, the people of the East, gathered together, and they crossed over and encamped in the Valley of Jezreel. But the Spirit of the LORD came upon Gideon, then he blew the trumpet, and the Abiezrites gathered behind him. And he sent messengers throughout all Manasseh, who also gathered behind him. He also sent messengers to Asher, Zebulun, and Naphtali, and they came up to meet them.

Judges 7:2,3 And the LORD said to Gideon, The people who are with you are too many for Me to give the Midianites into their hands, lest Israel claim glory for itself against Me, saying, My own hand has saved me. Now therefore, proclaim in the hearing of the people, saying, Whoever is fearful and afraid, let him turn and depart at once from Mount Gilead. And twenty-two thousand of the people returned, and ten thousand remained.

Judges 7:7 Then the LORD said to Gideon, By the three hundred men who lapped I will save you, and deliver the Midianites into your hand. Let all the other people go, every man to his place.

Judges 7:12 Now the Midianites and Amalekites, all the people of the East, were lying in the valley as numerous as locusts, and their camels were without number, as the sand by the seashore in multitude.

Judges 7:23-25 And the men of Israel gathered together from Naphtali, Asher, and all Manasseh, and pursued the Midianites. Then Gideon sent messengers throughout all the mountains of Ephraim, saying, Come down against the Midianites, and seize from them the watering places as far as Beth Barah and the Jordan. Then all the men of Ephraim gathered together and seized the watering places as far as Beth Barah and the Jordan. And they captured two princes of the Midianites, Oreb and Zeeb.

Judges 8:4-6 When Gideon came to the Jordan, he and the three hundred men who were with him crossed over, exhausted but still in

pursuit. Then he said to the men of Succoth, Please give loaves of bread to the people who follow me, for they are exhausted, and **I** am pursuing **Zebah and Zalmunna**, kings of Midian. And the leaders of Succoth said, Are the hands of Zebah and Zalmunna now in your hand, that we should give bread to your army?

Judges 8:8 Then he went up from there to Penuel and spoke to them in the same way. And the men of Penuel answered him as the men of Succoth had answered.

Judges 8:13,14 Then Gideon the son of Joash returned from battle, from the Ascent of Heres. And he caught a young man of the men of Succoth and interrogated him, and he wrote down for him the leaders of Succoth and its elders, seventy-seven men.

Judges 8:16,17 And he took the elders of the city, and thorns of the wilderness and briers, and with them he taught the men of Succoth. Then he tore down the tower of Penuel and killed the men of the city.

Judges 8:23 But Gideon said to them, I will not rule over you, nor shall my son rule over you, the LORD shall rule over you. Then Gideon said to them, I would like to make a request of you, that each of you would give me the earrings from his plunder.

Judges 8:27,28 Then Gideon made it into an ephod and set it up in his city, Ophrah. And all Israel played the harlot with it there. It became a snare to Gideon and to his house. Thus Midian was subdued before the children of Israel, so that they lifted their heads no more. And the country was quiet for forty years in the days of Gideon.
