## TORAH PORTION

Deuteronomy 21:10 When you go to war against your enemies.

**Deuteronomy 21:15-17** *If a man have two wives, one beloved, and another hated*, and they have born him children, both the beloved and the hated, and if the firstborn son be hers that was hated: Then it shall be, when he makes his sons to inherit that which he has, that he may not make the son of the beloved firstborn before the son of the hated, which is indeed the firstborn: But he shall acknowledge the son of the hated for the firstborn, by giving him a double portion of all that he hath for he is the beginning of his strength.

Deuteronomy 22:1-3 You shall not see <u>your brother's ox</u> or his sheep go astray, and hide yourself from them: You shall in any case bring them again to your brother. And if <u>your brother</u> be not near to you, or if <u>you know him not</u>, then you shall bring it to your own house, and it shall be with you until your brother seek after it, and you shall restore it to him again. In like manner shall you do with his ass, and <u>so shall you do with his raiment</u>, and with all lost things of your brother's, which he has lost, and you have found, shall you do likewise: you may not hide yourself.

Exodus 23:5 If you see the ass of him that hates you lying under his burden, and would forbear to help him, you shall surely help with him.

**Deuteronomy 22:4** You shall not see your brother's ass or his ox fall down by the way, and **hide yourself** from them: You **shall surely help him** to lift them up again.

**Deuteronomy 22:6,7** If a bird's nest chance to be before you in the way in any tree, or on the ground, whether they be young ones, or eggs, and the dam sitting on the young, or on the eggs, you shall not take the dam with the young: But you shall in any



wise let the dam go, and take the young to you, that it may be well with you, and **that you may prolong your days.** 

Luke 13:34,35 Jerusalem, Jerusalem, that kills the prophets, and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, like a hen gathers her own brood under her wings, and you refused! Behold, your house is left to you desolate. I tell you, you will not see me, until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

**Deuteronomy 22:8** When you build a new house, then **you shall** make a battlement for your roof, that you bring not blood on your house, if any man fall from there.

**Deuteronomy 23:7,8** You **shall <u>not abhor</u>** an **Edomite, <u>for he is your brother!</u>** You shall **not abhor an Egyptian**, because you were a stranger in his land. The children that are begotten of them shall enter into the congregation of the LORD **in their third generation.** 

**Deuteronomy 23:21–23** When you shall vow a vow to the LORD your God, you shall not slack to pay it: For the LORD your God will surely require it of you, and it would be sin in you. But if you shall forbear to vow, it shall be no sin in you. **That which is gone out of your lips you shall keep and perform**, even a freewill offering, according as you have vowed to the LORD your God, which you have promised with your mouth.

**Deuteronomy 23:24,25** When you come into your neighbor's vineyard, then you may eat grapes your fill at your own pleasure, but you shall not put any in your vessel. When you come into the standing corn of your neighbor, then you may pluck the ears with your hand, but you shall not move a sickle to your neighbor's standing corn.

Matthew 12:1,2 At that time, Yeshua went on the Sabbath day through the grain fields. His disciples were hungry and began to pluck heads of grain and to eat. But the Pharisees, when they saw



it, said to him, Behold, your disciples do what is not lawful to do on the Sabbath.

**Deuteronomy 24:9** Remember what the LORD your God did to Miriam by the way, after that you were come forth out of Egypt.

**Proverbs 18:21** Death and life are in the power of the tongue: And they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.

Proverbs 15:2-4 The tongue of the wise uses knowledge aright: but the mouth of fools pours out foolishness. The eyes of the LORD are in every place, beholding the evil and the good. A wholesome tongue is a tree of life: But perverseness therein is a breach in the spirit.

Deuteronomy 24:14,15 You shall not oppress an hired servant that is poor and needy, whether he be of your brothers, or of your strangers that are in your land within your gates: At his day you shall give him his hire, neither shall the sun go down on it, for he is poor, and sets his heart on it: Lest he cry against you to the LORD, and it be sin to you.

Deuteronomy 24:19-22 When you cut down your harvest in your field, and have forgot a sheaf in the field, you shall not go again to fetch it: It shall be for the stranger, for the fatherless, and for the widow: That the LORD your God may bless you in all the work of your hands. When you beat your olive tree, you shall not go over the boughs again: It shall be for the stranger, for the fatherless, and for the widow. When you gather the grapes of your vineyard, you shall not glean it afterward: It shall be for the stranger, for the fatherless, and for the widow. And you shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt: Therefore I command you to do this thing.

**Deuteronomy 25:4** You shall **not muzzle the ox** when he treads out the corn.

1 Timothy 5:17,18 Let the elders that rule well be counted worthy of double honor, especially they who labor in the word and doctrine. For the scripture said, You shall **not muzzle the ox that treads out the corn**. And, The laborer is worthy of his reward.

**Deuteronomy 25:15,16** You shall have a **perfect and just weight**, a perfect and just measure, **that your days may be lengthened** in the land which the LORD your God is giving you. For all who do such things, all who behave unrighteously, are an abomination to the LORD your God.

Deuteronomy 25:17-19 Remember what Amalek did to you by the way, when you were come forth out of Egypt, How he met you by the way, and smote the hindmost of you, even all that were feeble behind you, when you were faint and weary, and he feared not God. Therefore it shall be, when the LORD your God has given you rest from all your enemies round about, in the land which the LORD your God gives you for an inheritance to possess it, that you shall blot out the remembrance of Amalek from under heaven; you shall not forget it.

**Isaiah 54:1-3** Sing, O barren, you that did not bear; break forth into singing, and cry aloud, you that did not travail with child: For more are the children of the desolate than the children of the married wife, said the LORD. Enlarge the place of your tent, and let them stretch forth the curtains of your habitations: Spare not, lengthen your cords, and strengthen your stakes, For you shall break forth on the right hand and on the left, and your seed **shall inherit the Gentiles**, and make the desolate cities to be inhabited.

**Isaiah 54:5-7** For your Maker is your husband, the LORD of hosts is his name, and your Redeemer the Holy One <u>of Israel</u>, The God of the whole earth shall he be called. For the LORD has called you as a woman forsaken and grieved in spirit, and a wife of youth, when you were refused, said your God. For a small moment have I forsaken you, but <u>with great mercies will I gather you</u>.

**Isaiah 54:8-10** In a little wrath I hid my face from you for a moment, but with everlasting kindness will I have mercy on you, said the LORD your Redeemer. For this is **as the waters of Noah** to me: For as I have sworn that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth, so have I sworn that I would not be wroth with you, nor rebuke you. For the mountains shall depart, and the hills be removed, but my kindness shall not depart from you, **neither shall the covenant of my peace be removed, said the LORD that has mercy on you.** 

Malachi 3:7 Even from the days of your fathers ye are gone away from mine ordinances, and have not kept them. **Return unto me, and I will return unto you**, saith the LORD of hosts.

Matthew 24:27,28 For as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. For wheresoever the carcase is, there will the eagles be gathered together.

Matthew 24:7 For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: And there shall be famines, and pestilences, and <u>earthquakes</u>, in divers places.

Matthew 24:32-34 Now learn a parable of the fig tree, When his branch is yet tender, and putteth forth leaves, ye know that summer is nigh: So likewise ye, when ye shall see all these things, know that it is near, even at the doors. Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled.

## **JUDGES**

**Judges 11:30,31** And Jephthah vowed a vow unto the LORD, and said, If thou shalt without fail deliver the children of Ammon into mine hands, Then it shall be, that whatsoever cometh forth of the doors of my house to meet me, when I return in peace from the children of Ammon, **shall surely be the LORD's**, and I will offer it up for a burnt offering.

**Judges 11:32** So Jephthah passed over unto the children of Ammon to fight against them, and the LORD delivered them into his hands. And he smote them from Aroer, even till thou come to Minnith, even twenty cities, and unto the plain of the vineyards, with a very great slaughter. Thus the children of Ammon were subdued before the children of Israel.

Judges 11:34,35 And Jephthah came to Mizpeh unto his house, and, behold, his daughter came out to meet him with timbrels and with dances: And she was his only child, beside her he had neither son nor daughter. And it came to pass, when he saw her, that he rent his clothes, and said, Alas, my daughter! Thou hast brought me very low, and thou art one of them that trouble me: For I have opened my mouth unto the LORD, and I cannot go back.

Judges 11:36-39 So she said to him, My father, if you have given your word to the LORD, do to me according to what has gone out of your mouth, because the LORD has avenged you of your enemies, the people of Ammon. Then she said to her father, Let this thing be done for me: Let me alone for two months, that I may go and wander on the mountains and bewail my virginity, my friends and I. So he said, Go. And he sent her away for two months, and she went with her friends and bewailed her virginity on the mountains. And it was so at the end of two months that she returned to her father, and he carried out his vow with her which he had yowed. She knew no man.

Judges 12:1 And the men of Ephraim gathered themselves together, and went northward, and said to Jephthah, Why did you cross over to fight against the children of Ammon, and did not call us to go with you? We will burn your house down upon you with fire.

**Judges 12:2,3** And Jephthah said to them, My people and I were in a great struggle with the people of Ammon; And when I called you, you did not deliver me out of their hands. So when I saw that you would not deliver me, I took my life in my hands and crossed



over against the people of Ammon, and the LORD delivered them into my hand. Why then have you come up to me this day to fight against me?

Judges 12:4-6 Now Jephthah gathered together all the men of Gilead and fought against Ephraim. And the men of Gilead defeated Ephraim, because they said, You Gileadites are fugitives of Ephraim among the Ephraimites and among the Manassites. The Gileadites seized the fords of the Jordan before the Ephraimites arrived. And when any Ephraimite who escaped said, Let me cross over, the men of Gilead would say to him, Are you an Ephraimite? If he said, No, then they would say to him, Then say, Shibboleth! And he would say, Sibboleth, for he could not pronounce it right. Then they would take him and kill him at the fords of the Jordan. There fell at that time forty-two thousand Ephraimites.

**Judges 12:7** And Jephthah judged Israel six years. Then Jephthah the Gileadite died and was buried among the cities of Gilead.

Judges 12:8-15 After him, Ibzan of Bethlehem judged Israel. He had thirty sons. And he gave away thirty daughters in marriage and brought in thirty daughters from elsewhere for his sons. He judged Israel seven years. Then Ibzan died and was buried at Bethlehem. After him, Elon the Zebulunite judged Israel. He judged Israel ten years. And Elon the Zebulunite died and was buried at Aijalon in the country of Zebulun. After him, Abdon the son of Hillel the Pirathonite judged Israel. He had forty sons and thirty grandsons, who rode on seventy young donkeys. He judged Israel eight years. Then Abdon the son of Hillel the Pirathonite died and was buried in Pirathon in the land of Ephraim, in the mountains of the Amalekites.

2 Chronicles 36:20,21 And those who escaped from the sword he carried away to Babylon, where they became servants to him and his sons until the rule of the kingdom of Persia, to fulfill the word of the LORD by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had



**enjoyed her Sabbaths.** As long as she lay desolate, she kept Sabbath, **to fulfill seventy years.** 

Judges 13:1,2 Again the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD, and the LORD delivered them into the hand of the Philistines for <u>forty years</u>. Now there was a certain man from <u>Zorah</u>, of the family of the <u>Danites</u>, whose name was **Manoah**, and **his wife** was barren and had no children.

Judges 13:3-5 And the Angel of the LORD appeared to the woman and said to her, Indeed now, you are barren and have borne no children, but you shall conceive and bear a son. Now therefore, please be careful not to drink wine or similar drink, and not to eat anything unclean. For behold, you shall conceive and bear a son. And no razor shall come upon his head, for the child shall be a Nazirite to God from the womb and he shall begin to deliver Israel out of the hand of the Philistines.

**Judges 13:6,7** So **the woman** came and told her husband, saying, **A Man of God** came to me, and His countenance was like the countenance of **the Angel of God**, very awesome, but I did not ask Him where He was from, and He did not tell me His name. And He said to me, Behold, you shall conceive and bear a son. Now drink no wine or similar drink, nor eat anything unclean, for the child shall be a Nazirite to God from the womb to the day of his death.

Judges 13:8,9 Then Manoah prayed to the LORD, and said, O my Lord, please let the Man of God whom You sent come to us again and teach us what we shall do for the child who will be born. And God listened to the voice of Manoah, and the Angel of God came to the woman again as she was sitting in the field; but Manoah her husband was not with her.

Judges 13:10,11 Then the woman ran in haste and told her husband, and said to him, Look, the Man who came to me the other day has just now appeared to me! So Manoah arose and

followed his wife. When he came to the Man, he said to Him, Are You the Man who spoke to **this woman**? And He said, I am.

Judges 13:16,17 And the Angel of the LORD said to Manoah, Though you detain Me, I will not eat your food. But if you offer a burnt offering, you must offer it to the LORD. (For Manoah did not know He was the Angel of the LORD.) Then Manoah said to the Angel of the LORD, What is Your name, that when Your words come to pass we may honor You?

**John 14:28** You have heard Me say to you, I am going away and coming back to you. If you loved Me, you would rejoice because I said, I am going to the Father, for My Father is greater than I.

Judges 13:18 And the Angel of the LORD said to him, Why do you ask My name, seeing it is secret (wonderful)?

**Psalm 139:6** Such knowledge is too **wonderfu**l for me, it is high, I cannot attain unto it.

**Judges 13:19** So **Manoah** took a kid with a meat offering and offered it on a rock to the LORD: And the angel did **wondrously**, and Manoah and **his wife** looked on.

**Isaiah 9:6** For to us a child is born, to us <u>a son is given</u>: And the government shall be on his shoulder: And <u>his name shall be called</u> <u>Wonderful</u>, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

John 3:16a For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son,

Judges 13:20-22 it happened as the flame went up toward heaven from the altar the Angel of the LORD ascended in the flame of the altar! When Manoah and his wife saw this, they fell on their faces to the ground. When the Angel of the LORD appeared no more to Manoah and his wife, then Manoah knew that He was

the Angel of the LORD. And Manoah said to his wife, We shall surely die, because we have seen God!

**Judges 13:24** So the woman bore a son and called his name Samson.

1 Chronicles 4:2-4 These were the families of the **Zorathites**. These were the **sons of the father of Etam**: Jezreel, Ishma, and Idbash, and the name of their sister was **Hazelelponi**.

Judges 15:8 So he attacked them hip and thigh with a great slaughter, then he went down and dwelt in the cleft of the rock of Etam.

**Judges 14:1** Now Samson went down to Timnah and saw a woman in Timnah of the daughters of the Philistines.

Judges 14:14,15 Now for three days they could not explain the riddle. But it came to pass on the seventh day that they said to Samson's wife, Entice your husband, that he may explain the riddle to us, or else we will burn you and your father's house with fire.

Judges 14:19b,20 So his anger was aroused, and he went back up to his father's house. And Samson's wife was given to his companion, who had been his best man.

Judges 15:1,2 After a while, in the time of wheat harvest, it happened that Samson visited his wife with a young goat. And he said, Let me go in to my wife, into her room. But her father would not permit him to go in. Her father said, I really thought that you thoroughly hated her, therefore I gave her to your companion. Is not her younger sister better than she? Please, take her instead.

**Judges 15:4-6** Then Samson went and caught three hundred foxes, and he took torches, turned the foxes tail to tail, and put a torch between each pair of tails. When he had set the torches on



fire, he let the foxes go into the standing grain of the Philistines, and burned up both the shocks and the standing grain, as well as the vineyards and olive groves. Then the Philistines said, Who has done this? And they answered, Samson, the son-in-law of the Timnite, because he has taken his wife and given her to his companion. So the Philistines came up and burned her and her father with fire.

**Judges 15:9-11** Now the Philistines went up, encamped in Judah, and deployed themselves against Lehi. And the men of Judah said, Why have you come up against us? So they answered, We have come up to arrest Samson, to do to him as he has done to us. Then three thousand men of Judah went down to the cleft of the rock of Etam, and said to Samson, Do you not know that the Philistines rule over us? What is this you have done to us?

**Judges 15:15** He found a fresh jawbone of a donkey, reached out his hand and took it, and killed a thousand men with it.

**Judges 15:20** And he judged Israel **twenty years** in the days of the Philistines.

Judges 16:5 And the lords of the Philistines came up to her and said to her, Entice him, and find out where his great strength lies, and by what means we may overpower him, that we may bind him to afflict him, and every one of us will give you eleven hundred pieces of silver.

Judges 16:7-9a And Samson said to her, If they bind me with seven fresh bowstrings, not yet dried, then I shall become weak, and be like any other man. So the lords of the Philistines brought up to her seven fresh bowstrings, not yet dried, and she bound him with them. Now men were lying in wait, staying with her in the room. And she said to him, The Philistines are upon you, Samson!

Judges 16:11,12 So he said to her, If they bind me securely with new ropes that have never been used, then I shall become weak,

and be like any other man. Therefore **Delilah took new ropes** and bound him with them, and said to him, **The Philistines are** upon you, Samson! And men were lying in wait, staying in the room. But he broke them off his arms like a thread.

Judges 16:13b,14 And he said to her, If you weave the seven locks of my head into the web of the loom. So she wove it tightly with the batten of the loom, and said to him, The Philistines are upon you, Samson! But he awoke from his sleep, and pulled out the batten and the web from the loom.

Judges 16:19 Then she lulled him to sleep on her knees, and called for a man and had him shave off the seven locks of his head. Then she began to torment him, and his strength left him. And she said, The Philistines are upon you, Samson!

Judges 16:21 Then the Philistines took him and put out his eyes and brought him down to Gaza. They bound him with bronze fetters, and he became a grinder in the prison. However, the hair of his head began to grow again after it had been shaven.

**Judges 16:27** Now the temple was full of men and women. All the lords of the Philistines were there about three thousand men and women on the roof watching while Samson performed.

**Judges 16:30** Then Samson said, Let me die with the Philistines! And he pushed with all his might, and the temple fell on the lords and all the people who were in it. So the dead that he killed at his death were more than he had killed in his life.
