TORAH PORTION

Genesis 20:1,2 And Abraham journeyed from thence toward the south country, and dwelled between Kadesh and Shur, and sojourned in Gerar. And Abraham said of Sarah his wife, She is my sister: And Abimelech king of Gerar sent and took Sarah.

Genesis 20:12 And, in fact, she is my sister, the daughter of my father, but not the daughter of my mother, and she became my wife.

Genesis 20:17 Then Abraham made prayer to God, and God made Abimelech well again, and his wife and his womenservants, so that they had children. For the Lord had kept all the women of the house of Abimelech from having children, because of Sarah, Abraham's wife.

Genesis 22:19 So Abraham returned to his young men, and they rose up and went together to Beersheba. Abraham lived at Beersheba.

Genesis 24:67 Then Isaac brought her into the tent of Sarah his mother and took Rebekah, and she became his wife, and he loved her. So Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.

Genesis 25:20 and Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah.

Genesis 23:1,2 Sarah lived one <u>hundred twenty-seven years</u>. This was the length of Sarah's life. <u>Sarah died in Kiriath Arba (the same is Hebron</u>), in the land of Canaan. <u>Abraham came to mourn</u> for Sarah, and to weep for her.

Genesis 14:13 And there came one that had escaped, and told Abram the Hebrew, for he dwelt in the plain of Mamre the Amorite, brother of Eshcol, and brother of Aner: And these were confederate with Abram.



Genesis 23:3,4 And Abraham stood up from before his dead, and spoke to the **sons of Heth**, saying, I am <u>a stranger and a sojourner</u> with you: Give me a possession of a <u>burial plot</u> with you, that I may bury my dead out of my sight.

Hebrews 11:13 In faith died all these, not having received the promises, but from afar having seen them, and having been persuaded, and having saluted them, and having confessed that strangers and sojourners they are upon the earth.

Ephesians 2:19 Now, therefore, you are no more <u>strangers and foreigners</u>, but fellow citizens with the saints and of the household of God,

Genesis 23:7 And Abraham stood up and bowed (prostrate) himself to the people of the land, even to the children of Heth.

Genesis 23:10-16 And Ephron עפרון dwelled among the children of Heth: And Ephron עפרון the Hittite answered Abraham in the audience of the children of Heth, even of all that went in at the gate of his city, saying, No, my lord, hear me: The field give I you, and the cave that is therein, I give it you, in the presence of the sons of my people give I it you: Bury your dead. And Abraham bowed down himself before the people of the land. And he spoke unto Ephron in the audience of the people of the land, saying, But if you will give it, I pray you, hear me: I will give you money for the field, take it of me, and I will bury my dead there. And Ephron עפרון answered Abraham, saying to him, My lord, listen to me: The land is worth four hundred shekels of silver, what is that between me and thee? Bury therefore your dead. And Abraham listened to Ephron עפרון, and Abraham weighed to Ephron עפרן the silver, which he had named in the audience of the sons of Heth, four hundred shekels of silver, current money with the merchant.

Genesis 24:3,4 And I will make you swear by the LORD, the God of heaven, and the God of the earth, that you shall <u>not take a wife to</u> my son of the daughters of the Canaanites, among whom I dwell:



But you shall go to my country, and to my kindred, and take a wife to my son Isaac.

Genesis 24:12,13 And he made the camels kneel down outside the city by the well of water at the time of evening, the time when women go out to draw water. And he said, O LORD, God of my master Abraham, please grant me success today and show steadfast love to my master Abraham.

Genesis 24:14 Let the young woman to whom I shall say, Please let down your jar that I may drink, and who shall say, Drink, and I will water your camels' let her be the one whom you have appointed for your servant Isaac. By this I shall know that you have shown steadfast love to my master.

Genesis 24:17-20 And the servant <u>ran to meet her</u>, and said, Let me, I pray you, drink a <u>little water</u> of your pitcher. And she said, Drink, my lord: **And she hurried**, and let down her pitcher on her hand, and gave him drink. And when she had done giving him drink, she said, <u>I will draw water for your camels also</u>, until they have done drinking. **And she hurried**, and emptied her pitcher into the trough, and **ran** again to the well to draw water, and drew for all his camels.

Exodus 30:12,13a When you are taking the number of the children of Israel, let every man who is numbered give to the Lord a price for his life, so that no disease may come on them when they are numbered. And this is what they are to give, let every man who is numbered give **half a shekel.**

Genesis 24:22 And it came to pass, as the camels had done drinking, that the man took a golden earring of half a shekel weight, and two bracelets for her hands of ten shekels weight of gold.

Exodus 32:19 And it came to pass, as soon as he came nigh unto the camp, that he saw the calf, and the dancing: And Moses' anger waxed hot, and he cast the tables out of his hands, and **brake them** beneath the mount.



Psalm 119:72 The law of Thy mouth is better unto me than thousands of gold and silver.

Exodus 38:25,26 And the <u>silver</u> of them that were numbered of the congregation was a hundred talents, and a thousand seven hundred and three-score and fifteen shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary: <u>A beka בקע a head</u>, that is, <u>half a shekel</u>, after the shekel of the sanctuary, for every one that passed over to them that were numbered, from twenty years old and upward, for six hundred thousand and three thousand and five hundred and fifty men.

Matthew 27:33 And when they were come unto a place called Golgotha, that is to say, a place of a skull,

Genesis 25:7-10 And these are the days of the years of Abraham's life which he lived, an hundred threescore and fifteen years. Then Abraham gave up the ghost, and died in a good old age, an old man, and full of years, and was gathered to his people. And his sons Isaac and Ishmael buried him in the cave of Machpelah, in the field of Ephron the son of Zohar the Hittite, which is before Mamre, The field which Abraham purchased of the sons of Heth: There was Abraham buried, and Sarah his wife.

Nehemiah 9:6-8a You are the LORD, even You alone, You made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth and all things that are thereon, the seas and all that is in them, and <u>You preserve them all</u>, and <u>the host of heaven worships You</u>. You are the LORD the God, who chose Abram, and brought him forth out of Ur of the Chaldees and gave him the name of Abraham, and found his heart faithful before You and made a covenant with him.

2 Samuel 7

2 Samuel 7:1-3 And it came to pass, when the king sat in his house, and the LORD had given him rest round about from all his enemies, That the king said unto Nathan the prophet, See now, I dwell in an house of cedar, but the ark of God dwelleth within curtains. And



Nathan said to the king, Go, do all that is in thine heart, for the LORD is with thee.

- **2 Samuel 7:12,13** And when thy days be fulfilled, and thou shalt sleep with thy fathers, I will set up thy seed after thee, which shall proceed out of thy bowels, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build an house for my name, and I will stablish the throne of his kingdom forever. He shall build an house for my name, and I will stablish the throne of his kingdom forever.
- **2 Samuel 7:14-16** I will be his father, and he shall be my son. If he commit iniquity, I will chasten him with the rod of men, and with the stripes of the children of men: But my mercy shall not depart away from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I put away before thee. And thine house and thy kingdom shall be established **forever** before thee: Thy throne shall be established **forever**.
- **Psalm 89:28-37** My mercy will I keep for him forevermore, and my covenant shall stand fast with him. His seed also will I make to endure forever, and his throne as the days of heaven. If his children forsake my law, and walk not in my judgments, If they break my statutes, and keep not my commandments, Then will I visit their transgression with the rod, and their iniquity with stripes. Nevertheless, my loving kindness will I not utterly take from him, nor suffer my faithfulness to fail. My covenant will I not break, nor alter the thing that is gone out of my lips. Once have I sworn by my holiness that I will not lie unto David. His seed shall endure forever, and his throne as the sun before me. It shall be established for ever as the moon, and as a faithful witness in heaven. Selah.
- **2 Samuel 8:15-18** And David reigned over all Israel, and David executed judgment and justice unto all his people. And Joab the son of Zeruiah was over the host, and Jehoshaphat the son of Ahilud was recorder, And Zadok the son of Ahitub, and Ahimelech the son of Abiathar, were the priests, and Seraiah was the scribe, And Benaiah the son of Jehoiada was over both the Cherethites and the Pelethites, and David's sons were chief rulers.



- **2 Samuel 9:1** And David said, Is there yet any that is left of the house of Saul, that I may shew him kindness for Jonathan's sake?
- **2 Samuel 9:12,13** And Mephibosheth had a young son, whose name was Micha. And all that dwelt in the house of Ziba were servants unto Mephibosheth. So Mephibosheth dwelt in Jerusalem: for he did eat continually at the king's table, and was lame on both his feet.
- **2 Samuel 10:1** And it came to pass after this, that the king of the children of Ammon died, and Hanun his son reigned in his stead. Then said David, I will shew kindness unto Hanun the son of Nahash, as his father shewed kindness unto me. And David sent to comfort him by the hand of his servants for his father.
- **2 Samuel 10:6** And when the children of Ammon saw that they stank before David, the children of Ammon sent and hired the Syrians of Bethrehob, and the Syrians of Zoba, twenty thousand footmen, and of king Maacah a thousand men, and of Ishtob twelve thousand men.
- **2 Saamuel 10:19** And when all the kings that were servants to Hadarezer saw that they were smitten before Israel, **they made peace with Israel** and served them. So the Syrians feared to help the children of Ammon anymore.
- **2 Samuel 11:1** And it came to pass, after the year was expired, at **the time when kings go forth to battle,** that David sent Joab, and his servants with him, and all Israel, and they destroyed the children of Ammon, and besieged Rabbah. But David tarried still at Jerusalem.
- **2 Samuel 11:2,3** And it came to pass in an evening tide, that David arose from off his bed, and walked upon the roof of the king's house: And from the roof he saw a woman washing herself, and the woman was very beautiful to look upon. And David sent and enquired after the woman. And one said, Is not this Bathsheba, the daughter of Eliam, the wife of Uriah the Hittite?



- **2 Samuel 11:5-7** And the woman conceived, and sent and told David, and said, I am with child. And David sent to Joab, saying, Send me Uriah the Hittite. And Joab sent Uriah to David. And when Uriah was come unto him, David demanded of him how Joab did, and how the people did, and how the war prospered.
- **2 Samuel 11:9** But Uriah slept at the door of the king's house with all the servants of his lord, and went not down to his house.
- **2 Samuel 11:14,15** And it came to pass in the morning, that David wrote a letter to Joab, and sent it by the hand of Uriah. And he wrote in the letter, saying, Set ye Uriah in the forefront of the hottest battle, and retire ye from him, that he may be smitten, and die.
- **2 Samuel 11:26** And when the wife of Uriah heard that Uriah her husband was dead, she mourned for her husband. And when the mourning was past, David sent and fetched her to his house, and she became his wife, and bare him a son. But the thing that David had done displeased the LORD.
- **2 Samuel 12:1-3** And the LORD sent Nathan unto David. And he came unto him, and said unto him, There were two men in one city, the one rich, and the other poor. The rich man had exceeding many flocks and herds: But the poor man had nothing, save one little ewe lamb, which he had bought and nourished up: And it grew up together with him, and with his children, it did eat of his own meat, and drank of his own cup, and lay in his bosom, and was unto him as a daughter.
- **2 Samuel 12:4-6** And there came a traveller unto the rich man, and he spared to take of his own flock and of his own herd, to dress for the wayfaring man that was come unto him, but took the poor man's lamb, and dressed it for the man that was come to him. And David's anger was greatly kindled against the man, and he said to Nathan, As the LORD liveth, the man that hath done this thing shall surely die: And he shall restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity.



- **2 Samuel 12:7-9** And Nathan said to David, Thou art the man. Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, I anointed thee king over Israel, and I delivered thee out of the hand of Saul, And I gave thee thy master's house, and thy master's wives into thy bosom, and gave thee the house of Israel and of Judah, and if that had been too little, I would moreover have given unto thee such and such things. Wherefore hast thou despised the commandment of the LORD, to do evil in his sight? Thou hast killed Uriah the Hittite with the sword, and hast taken his wife to be thy wife, and hast slain him with the sword of the children of Ammon.
- **2 Samuel 12:10-12** Now therefore the sword shall never depart from thine house, because thou hast despised me, and hast taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be thy wife. Thus saith the LORD, Behold, I will raise up evil against thee out of thine own house, and I will take thy wives before thine eyes, and give them unto thy neighbor, and he shall lie with thy wives in the sight of this sun. For thou didst it secretly: But I will do this thing before all Israel, and before the sun.
- **2 Samuel 12:13,14** And David said unto Nathan, I have sinned against the LORD. And Nathan said unto David, The LORD also hath put away thy sin, thou shalt not die. Howbeit, because by this deed thou hast given great occasion to the enemies of the LORD to blaspheme, the child also that is born unto thee shall surely die.
- **2 Samuel 12:24,25** And David comforted Bathsheba his wife, and went in unto her, and lay with her: And she bare a son, and he called his name Solomon: And the LORD loved him. And he sent by the hand of Nathan the prophet, and he called his name Jedidiah, because of the LORD.
- **2 Samuel 12:29,30** And David gathered all the people together, and went to Rabbah, and fought against it, and took it. And he took their king's crown from off his head, the weight whereof was a talent of gold with the precious stones: And it was set on David's head. And he brought forth the spoil of the city in great abundance.



- **2 Samuel 13:1,2** And it came to pass after this, that Absalom the son of David had a fair sister, whose name was Tamar, and Amnon the son of David loved her. And Amnon was so vexed, that he fell sick for his sister Tamar, for she was a virgin, and Amnon thought it hard for him to do anything to her.
- **2 Samuel 13:3** But Amnon had a friend, whose name was <u>Jonadab</u>, the son of Shimeah, David's brother: And Jonadab was a very subtil man.
- **2 Samuel 13:5** And Jonadab said unto him, Lay thee down on thy bed, and make thyself sick: And when thy father cometh to see thee, say unto him, I pray thee, let my sister Tamar come, and give me meat, and dress the meat in my sight, that I may see it, and eat it at her hand.
- **2 Samuel 13:14,15** Howbeit he would not hearken unto her voice: But, being stronger than she, forced her, and lay with her. Then Amnon hated her exceedingly, so that the hatred wherewith he hated her was greater than the love wherewith he had loved her. And Amnon said unto her, Arise, be gone.
- **2 Samuel 13:21,22** But when king David heard of all these things, he was very wroth. And Absalom spoke unto his brother Amnon neither good nor bad: For Absalom hated Amnon, because he had forced his sister Tamar.
- **2 Samuel 13:23** And it came to pass after two full years, that Absalom had sheepshearers in Baalhazor, which is beside Ephraim: And Absalom invited all the king's sons.
- **2 Samuel 13:28,29** Now Absalom had commanded his servants, saying, Mark ye now when Amnon's heart is merry with wine, and when I say unto you, Smite Amnon, then kill him, fear not: Have not I commanded you? Be courageous, and be valiant. And the servants of Absalom did unto Amnon as Absalom had commanded. Then all the king's sons arose, and every man gat him up upon his mule, and fled.



- **2 Samuel 13:30,31** And it came to pass, while they were in the way, that tidings came to David, saying, Absalom hath slain all the king's sons, and there is not one of them left. Then the king arose, and tare his garments, and lay on the earth, and all his servants stood by with their clothes rent.
- **2 Samuel 13:32,33** And **Jonadab**, the son of Shimeah David's brother, answered and said, Let not my lord suppose that they have slain all the young men the king's sons, for Amnon only is dead: For by the appointment of Absalom this hath been determined from the day that he forced his sister Tamar. Now therefore let not my lord the king take the thing to his heart, to think that all the king's sons are dead: For Amnon only is dead.
- 2 Samuel 13:37-39 But Absalom fled, and went to Talmai, the son of Ammihud, king of Geshur. And David mourned for his son every day. So Absalom fled, and went to Geshur, and was there three years. And the soul of king David longed to go forth unto Absalom: For he was comforted concerning Amnon, seeing he was dead.
- 2 Samuel 3:3 and the third, Absalom the son of Maacah the daughter of Talmai king of Geshur.
- **2 Samuel 14:1-3** Now Joab the son of Zeruiah perceived that the king's heart was toward Absalom. And Joab sent to Tekoah, and fetched thence a wise woman, and said unto her, I pray thee, feign thyself to be a mourner, and put on now mourning apparel, and anoint not thyself with oil, but be as a woman that had a long time mourned for the dead: And come to the king, and speak on this manner unto him. So Joab put the words in her mouth.
- **2 Samuel 14:19** And the king said, Is not the hand of Joab with thee in all this? And the woman answered and said, As thy soul liveth, my lord the king, none can turn to the right hand or to the left from ought that my lord the king hath spoken: For thy servant Joab, he bade me, and he put all these words in the mouth of thine handmaid:



- **2 Samuel 14:21,22** And the king said unto Joab, Behold now, I have done this thing: go therefore, bring the young man Absalom again. And Joab fell to the ground on his face, and bowed himself, and thanked the king: And Joab said, To day thy servant knoweth that I have found grace in thy sight, my lord, O king, in that the king hath fulfilled the request of his servant.
- **2 Samuel 14:23,24** So Joab arose and went to Geshur, and brought Absalom to Jerusalem. And the king said, Let him turn to his own house, and let him not see my face. So Absalom returned to his own house and saw not the king's face.
- **2 Samuel 14:28-30** So Absalom dwelt **two full years** in Jerusalem, and saw not the king's face. Therefore Absalom sent for Joab, to have sent him to the king, but he would not come to him: And when he sent again the second time, he would not come. Therefore he said unto his servants, See, Joab's field is near mine, and he hath barley there, go and set it on fire. And Absalom's servants set the field on fire.
- **2 Samuel 14:32,33** And Absalom answered Joab, Behold, I sent unto thee, saying, Come hither, that I may send thee to the king, to say, Wherefore am I come from Geshur? It had been good for me to have been there still: Now therefore let me see the king's face, and if there be any iniquity in me, let him kill me. So Joab came to the king, and told him: And when he had called for Absalom, he came to the king, and bowed himself on his face to the ground before the king: And the king kissed Absalom.
