TORAH PORTION

Exodus 10:1 And the LORD said unto Moses, **Go** into Pharaoh: For I have hardened his heart, and the heart of his servants, that **I might show these my signs before him.**

Exodus 5:2 And Pharaoh said, **Who is the LORD**, that I should obey his voice to let Israel go?

Exodus 10:2 And (in order) that you may recount in the ears of your son, and of your son's son, what things I have worked in Egypt by My signs which **I have done** among them, that you may know how that I am the LORD. **I have worked** (How I made Egypt a laughingstock), toyed with

Exodus 10;3,4 And Moses and Aaron came in to Pharaoh, and said to him, Thus said the LORD God **of the Hebrews**, How long will you refuse to humble yourself before me? Let my people go, that they may serve me. Else, if you refuse to let my people go, behold, tomorrow will I bring the locusts into your coast.

Exodus 10:6 And they shall fill your houses, and the houses of all your servants, and the houses of all the Egyptians, which neither your fathers, nor your fathers' fathers have seen, since the day that they were on the earth to this day. And he turned himself, and went out from Pharaoh.

Exodus 10;7 And Pharaoh's **servants said to him**, How long shall this man be a snare to us? Let the men go, that they may serve the LORD their God: Don't you know that Egypt is destroyed?

Exodus 10:8,9 And Moses and Aaron were brought again to Pharaoh: And he said to them, Go, serve the LORD your God: But who are they that shall go? **And Moses said**, We will go with our young and with our old, with our sons and with our daughters, with our flocks and with our herds will we go, for we must hold a feast to the LORD.

Genesis 50:8 And all the house of Joseph, and his brethren, and his father's house, only **their little ones, and their flocks, and their herds, they left in the land of Goshen.**

Exodus 10:10,11 But he said to them, The Lord be with you, if ever I let you and your little ones go! Look, you have some evil purpose in mind. No! Go, the men among you, and serve the Lord, **for that is what you are asking.** And they were driven out from Pharaoh's presence.

Exodus 10:20-23 But the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart, so that he would not let the children of Israel go. And the LORD said to Moses, **Stretch out your hand** toward heaven, that there may **be darkness** over the land of Egypt, **even darkness** which may be felt. And Moses stretched forth his hand toward heaven, and there was a **thick darkness** in all the land of Egypt **three days:** They saw not one another, neither rose any from his place for three days: But all the **children of Israel had light in their dwellings.**

Exodus 12:1-3 And the LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt saying, This month shall be to you the beginning of months: **It shall be the first month of the year** to you. Speak you to all the congregation of Israel, saying, **In the tenth day of this month** they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of their fathers, a lamb for an house.

Exodus 12:7-8 And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper doorpost of the houses, wherein they shall eat it. And they shall **eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire**, and unleavened bread, and with bitter herbs they shall eat it.

Exodus 12:12 For I will go through the land of Egypt in that night, and will smite all the first-born in the land of Egypt, both man and beast, and **against all the gods of Egypt** I will execute judgments: I am the LORD.

Exodus 12:13 And the blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I shall pass over you, and let the plague not come on you to destroy you when I smite the land of Egypt.

Exodus 12:14 And this day shall be unto you for a memorial, and you shall keep it a feast to the LORD throughout your generations, you shall keep it a feast by an ordinance forever.

Exodus 12:43-46 The LORD said to Moses and Aaron, This is the ordinance of the Passover. No foreigner shall eat of it, but every man's servant who is bought for money, when you have circumcised him, then shall he eat of it. A foreigner and a hired servant shall not eat of it. In one house shall it be eaten, you shall not carry out anything of the flesh abroad out of the house, neither shall you break a bone of it.

John 19:36 For these things were done, that the scripture should be fulfilled, A bone of him shall not be broken.

Exodus 11:1,2 And the LORD said unto Moses, Yet will I bring one plague more upon Pharaoh, and upon Egypt, afterwards he will let you go hence: When he shall let you go, he shall surely thrust you out hence altogether. Speak now in the ears of the people, and let every man borrow of his neighbor, and every woman of her neighbor, jewels of silver, and jewels of gold.

Exodus 11:3 And the LORD gave the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians. Moreover the man Moses was very great in the land of Egypt, in the sight of Pharaoh's servants, and in the sight of the people.

Exodus 11:4-7 So Moses said, Thus says the Lord: About midnight I will go out in the midst of Egypt, and every firstborn in the land of Egypt shall die, from the firstborn of Pharaoh who sits on his throne, even to the firstborn of the slave girl who is behind the handmill, and all the firstborn of the cattle. There shall be a great cry throughout all the land of Egypt, such as there has never

been, nor ever will be again. But not a dog shall growl against any of the people of Israel, either man or beast, that you may know that the Lord makes a distinction between Egypt and Israel.

Job 34:20 In a moment they die, even **at midnight**, the people are shaken and pass away, and the mighty are taken away without hand.

Psalm 119:61-63 The bands of the wicked have enclosed me, but I have not forgotten Thy law. **At midnight** I will rise to give thanks unto Thee because of Thy righteous ordinances. I am a companion of all them that fear Thee, and of them that observe Thy precepts.

Judges 16:3 And Samson lay till **midnight**, and arose at midnight, and laid hold of the doors of the gate of the city, and the two posts, and plucked them up, bar and all, and put them upon his shoulders, and carried them up to the top of the mountain that is before Hebron.

Ruth 3:8 And it came to pass **at midnight**, that the man was startled, and turned himself, and, behold, a woman lay at his feet.

Matthew 25:6-8 And **at midnight** there was a cry made, Behold, the bridegroom cometh, go ye out to meet him. Then all those virgins arose, and trimmed their lamps. And the foolish said unto the wise, Give us of your oil; for our lamps are gone out.

Moses tells pharaoh

Exodus 11:8 And all these **your servants** shall come down **to me**, and **bow down themselves to me**, saying, Get you out, and all the people that follow you and after that I will go out. And he went out from Pharaoh in a great anger.

Exodus 12:29,30 And it came to pass, that **at midnight** the Lord smote all the **firstborn** in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh that sat on his throne unto the firstborn of the captive that was in the dungeon, and all the firstborn of cattle. And Pharaoh

rose up in the night, he, and all his servants, and all the Egyptians, and there was a **great cry** in Egypt, for there was not a house where there was not one dead.

Exodus 13:3-5a Then Moses said to the people, **Remember this day** in which you came out from Egypt, out of the house of slavery, for by a strong hand the Lord brought you out from this place. **No leavened bread shall be eaten**. Today, in the month of Abib, you are going out. **And when the Lord brings you into the land of the Canaanites.**

Luke 22:19 And he took bread, and gave thanks, and broke it, and gave to them, saying, This is my body which is given for you: **This do in remembrance** of me.

Leviticus 23:4-6 These are the fixed feasts of the Lord, the holy days of worship which you will keep at their regular times. In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at nightfall, is the Lord's Passover, And **on the fifteenth day of the same month** is the feast of unleavened bread, for seven days let your food be unleavened bread.

1 KINGS 18

1 Kings 18:1,2 And it came to pass after many days, that the word of the LORD came to Elijah in the third year, saying, Go, shew thyself unto Ahab, and I will send rain upon the earth. And Elijah went to shew himself unto Ahab. And there was a sore famine in Samaria.

1 Kings 18:3,4 And Ahab called Obadiah, which was the governor of his house. (Now Obadiah feared the LORD greatly: For it was so, when Jezebel cut off the prophets of the LORD, that Obadiah took an hundred prophets, and hid them by fifty in a cave, and fed them with bread and water.)

1 Kings 18:5,6 And Ahab said unto Obadiah, Go into the land, unto all fountains of water, and unto all brooks: Peradventure we may

find grass to save the horses and mules alive, that we lose not all the beasts. So they divided the land between them to pass throughout it: Ahab went one way by himself, and Obadiah went another way by himself.

1 Kings 18:7-12 And as Obadiah was in the way, behold, Elijah met him: And he knew him, and fell on his face, and said, Art thou that my lord Elijah? And he answered him, I am: Go, tell thy lord, Behold, Elijah is here. And he said, What have I sinned, that thou wouldest deliver thy servant into the hand of Ahab, to slay me? As the LORD thy God liveth, there is no nation or kingdom, whither my lord hath not sent to seek thee: And when they said, He is not there, he took an oath of the kingdom and nation, that they found thee not. And now thou sayest, Go, tell thy lord, Behold, Elijah is here. **And it shall come to pass, as soon as I am gone from thee, that the Spirit of the LORD shall carry thee whither I know not, and so when I come and tell Ahab, and he cannot find thee, he shall slay me:** But I thy servant fear the LORD from my youth.

1 Kings 18:13-16 Was it not told my lord what I did when Jezebel slew the prophets of the LORD, how I hid an hundred men of the LORD's prophets by fifty in a cave, and fed them with bread and water? And now thou sayest, Go, tell thy lord, Behold, Elijah is here: And he shall slay me. And Elijah said, As the LORD of hosts liveth, before whom I stand, I will surely shew myself unto him to day. So Obadiah went to meet Ahab, and told him: and Ahab went to meet Elijah.

1 Kings 18:19,20 Now therefore send, and gather to me all Israel unto mount Carmel, and the prophets of Baal four hundred and fifty, and the prophets of the groves four hundred, which eat at Jezebel's table. So Ahab sent unto all the children of Israel, and gathered the prophets together unto Mount Carmel.

1 Kings 18:21-24 And Elijah came unto all the people, and said, How long halt ye between two opinions? If the LORD be God, follow him: But if Baal, then follow him. And the people answered him not a word. Then said Elijah unto the people, I, even I only,

remain a prophet of the LORD, but Baal's prophets are four hundred and fifty men. Let them therefore give us two bullocks, and let them choose one bullock for themselves, and cut it in pieces, and lay it on wood, and put no fire under: And I will dress the other bullock, and lay it on wood, and put no fire under: And call ye on the name of your gods, and I will call on the name of the LORD: And the God that answers by fire, let him be God.

1 Kings 18:26-29 And they took the bullock which was given them, and they dressed it, and called on the name of Baal from morning even until noon, saying, O Baal, hear us. But there was no voice, nor any that answered. And they leaped upon the altar which was made. And it came to pass at noon, that Elijah mocked them, and said, Cry aloud: For he is a god, either he is talking, or he is pursuing, or he is in a journey, or peradventure he sleeps, and must be awaked. And they cried aloud and cut themselves after their manner with knives and lancets, till the blood gushed out upon them. And it came to pass, when midday was past, and they prophesied until the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that there was neither voice, nor any to answer, nor any that regarded.

1 Kings 18:33-36 And he put the wood in order, and cut the bullock in pieces, and laid him on the wood, and said, Fill four barrels with water, and pour it on the burnt sacrifice, and on the wood. And he said, Do it the second time. And they did it the second time. And he said, Do it the third time. And they did it the third time. And the water ran round about the altar, and he filled the trench also with water. And it came to pass at the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that Elijah the prophet came near, and said, LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, let it be known this day that thou art God in Israel, and that I am thy servant, and that I have done all these things at thy word.

1 Kings 18:37-39 Hear me, O LORD, hear me, that this people may know that thou art the LORD God, and that thou hast turned their heart back again. Then the fire of the LORD fell, and consumed the burnt sacrifice, and the wood, and the stones, and the

dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench. And when all the people saw it, they fell on their faces: And they said, The LORD, he is the God, the LORD, he is the God.

1 Kings 18:40-46 And Elijah said unto them, Take the prophets of Baal, let not one of them escape. And they took them: And Elijah brought them down to the brook Kishon and slew them there. And Elijah said unto Ahab, Get thee up, eat and drink, for there is a sound of abundance of rain. So Ahab went up to eat and to drink. And Elijah went up to the top of Carmel, and he cast himself down upon the earth, and put his face between his knees, And said to his servant, Go up now, look toward the sea. And he went up, and looked, and said, There is nothing. And he said, Go again seven times. And it came to pass at the seventh time, that he said, Behold, there arises a little cloud out of the sea, like a man's hand. And he said, Go up, say unto Ahab, Prepare thy chariot, and get thee down, that the rain stop thee not. And it came to pass in the meanwhile, that the heaven was black with clouds and wind, and there was a great rain. And Ahab rode and went to Jezreel. And the hand of the LORD was on Elijah; and he girded up his loins and ran before Ahab to the entrance of Jezreel.

1 Kings 19:1-4 And Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and withal how he had slain all the prophets with the sword. Then Jezebel sent a messenger unto Elijah, saying, So let the gods do to me, and more also, if I make not thy life as the life of one of them by tomorrow about this time. And when he saw that, he arose, and went for his life, and came to Beersheba, which belongs to Judah, and left his servant there. But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness and came and sat down under a juniper tree: And he requested for himself that he might die, and said, It is enough, now, O LORD, take away my life, for I am not better than my fathers.

1 Kings 19:7-9 And the angel of the LORD came again the second time, and touched him, and said, Arise and eat, because the journey is too great for thee. And he arose, and did eat and drink, and went in the strength of that meat forty days and forty nights unto Horeb the mount of God. And he came thither unto a cave, and lodged

there, and, behold, the word of the LORD came to him, and he said unto him, What are you doing here, Elijah?

1 Kings 19:10 And he said, I have been very jealous for the LORD God of hosts: For the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant, thrown down thine altars, and slain thy prophets with the sword, and I, even I only, am left, and they seek my life, to take it away.

1 Kings 19:11-13 And he said, Go forth, and stand upon the mount before the LORD. And, behold, the LORD passed by, and a great and strong wind rent the mountains, and brake in pieces the rocks before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind: And after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake: And after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire: And after the fire a still small voice. And it was so, when **Elijah** heard it, that he wrapped his face in his mantle, and went out, and stood in the entering in of the cave. And behold, there came a voice unto him, and said, What are you doing here, Elijah?

1 Kings 19:15,16 And the LORD said unto him, Go, return on thy way to the wilderness of Damascus: And when thou come, anoint **Hazaël** to be king over Syria: And **Jeħu** the son of **Nimshi** shalt thou anoint to be king over Israel: And **Eliša** the son of **Šaphat** of **Abelmeholah** you shall anoint to be prophet in thy room.

1 Kings 19:18 Yet I have left me seven thousand in Israel, all the knees which have not bowed unto Baal, and every mouth which hath not kissed him.

1 Kings 19:19 So he departed thence, and found Elisha the son of Shaphat, who was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen before him, and he with the twelfth: And Elijah passed by him, and cast his mantle upon him.

1 Kings 20:1-3 And **Benhadad the king of Syria** gathered all his host together: And there were thirty and two kings with him, and horses, and chariots: And he went up and besieged Samaria and warred against it. And he sent messengers to Ahab king of Israel

into the city, and said unto him, Thus saith Benhadad, Thy silver and thy gold is mine, thy wives also and thy children, even the goodliest, are mine.

1 Kings 20:6 Yet I will send my servants unto thee tomorrow about this time, and they shall search thine house, and the houses of thy servants, and it shall be, that whatsoever is pleasant in thine eyes, they shall put it in their hand and take it away.

1 Kings 20:13 And, behold, there came a prophet unto Ahab king of Israel, saying, Thus saith the LORD, Hast thou seen all this great multitude? Behold, I will deliver it into thine hand this day, and thou shalt know that I am the LORD.

1 Kings 20:20,21 And they slew everyone his man: And the Syrians fled, and Israel pursued them: And Benhadad the king of Syria escaped on an horse with the horsemen. And the king of Israel went out, and smote the horses and chariots, and slew the Syrians with a great slaughter.

1 Kings 20:22 And the prophet came to the king of Israel, and said unto him, Go, strengthen yourself, and mark, and see what you do for at the return of the year the king of Syria will come up against you.

1 Kings 20:30 But the rest fled to Aphek, into the city, and there a wall fell upon twenty and seven thousand of the men that were left. And Benhadad fled, and came into the city, into an inner chamber.

1 Kings 20:31 And his servants said unto him, Behold now, we have heard that the kings of the house of Israel are merciful kings: Let us, I pray thee, put sackcloth on our loins, and ropes upon our heads, and go out to the king of Israel: Peradventure he will save thy life.

1 Kings 20:34 And Benhadad said unto him, The cities, which my father took from thy father, I will restore; and thou shalt make

streets for thee in Damascus, as my father made in Samaria. Then said Ahab, I will send thee away with this covenant. So, he made a covenant with him and sent him away.

1 Kings 20:42,43 And he said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Because thou hast let go out of thy hand a man whom I appointed to utter destruction, therefore thy life shall go for his life, and thy people for his people. And the king of Israel went to his house heavy and displeased and came to Samaria.

1 Kings 21:1 And it came to pass after these things, that Naboth the Jezreelite had a vineyard, which was in Jezreel, hard by the palace of Ahab king of Samaria.

1 Kings 21:10 And set two men, sons of Belial, before him, to bear witness against him, saying, Thou didst blaspheme God and the king. And then carry him out, and stone him that he may die.

1 Kings 21:22-25 And will make thine house like the house of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, and like the house of Baasha the son of Ahijah, for the provocation wherewith you have provoked me to anger and made Israel to sin. And of Jezebel also spoke the LORD, saying, The dogs shall eat Jezebel by the wall of Jezreel. Him that dies of Ahab in the city the dogs shall eat, and him that dies in the field shall the fowls of the air eat.

1 Kings 21:25 But there was none like unto Ahab, which did **sell himself to work wickedness in the sight of the LORD**, whom Jezebel his wife stirred up.

1 Kings 21:27-29 And it came to pass, when Ahab heard those words, that he rent his clothes, and put sackcloth upon his flesh, and fasted, and lay in sackcloth, and went softly. And the word of the LORD came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying, Seest thou how Ahab humbles himself before me? Because he humbles himself before me, I will not bring the evil in his days: But in his son's days will I bring the evil upon his house.

1 Kings 22:1,2 And they continued three years without war between Syria and Israel. And it came to pass **in the third year, that Jehoshaphat the king of Judah** came down to the king of Israel.

1 Kings 22:4,5 And he said unto Jehoshaphat, Wilt thou go with me to battle to Ramothgilead? And Jehoshaphat said to the king of Israel, I am as thou art, my people as thy people, my horses as thy horses. And Jehoshaphat said unto the king of Israel, Enquire, I pray thee, at the word of the LORD today.

1 Kings 22:6 Then the king of Israel gathered the prophets together, about **four hundred** men, and said unto them, Shall I go against Ramothgilead to battle, or shall I forbear? And they said, Go up, for the Lord shall deliver it into the hand of the king.

1 Kings 22:7,8 And **Jehoshaphat** said, Is there not here a prophet of the LORD besides, that we might enquire of him? And the king of Israel said unto Jehoshaphat, There is yet one man, **Micaiah** the son of Imlah, by whom we may enquire of the LORD: But I hate him, for he doth not prophesy good concerning me, but evil. And Jehoshaphat said, Let not the king say so.

1 Kings 22:10 And the king of Israel and Jehoshaphat the king of Judah sat each on his throne, having put on their robes, in a void place in the entrance of the gate of Samaria, and all the prophets prophesied before them.

1 Kings 22:14-16 And Micaiah said, As the LORD lives, what the LORD saith unto me, that will I speak. So, he came to the king. And the king said unto him, Micaiah, shall we go against Ramothgilead to battle, or shall we forbear? And he answered him, Go, and prosper for the LORD shall deliver it into the hand of the king. And the king said unto him, How many times shall I adjure thee that thou tell me nothing but that which is true in the name of the LORD?

1 Kings 22:26,27 And (Ahab) the king of Israel said, Take Micaiah, and carry him back unto Amon the governor of the city, and to Joash the king's son, And say, Thus saith the king, Put this fellow in prison and feed him with bread of affliction and with water of affliction, until I come in peace.

1 Kings 22:37,38 So (Ahab) the king died, and was brought to Samaria, and they buried the king in Samaria. And one washed the chariot in the pool of Samaria, and the dogs licked up his blood, and they washed his armor, according unto the word of the LORD which he spoke.

1 Kings 22:40-42 So Ahab slept with his fathers, and **Ahaziah** his son reigned in his stead. And Jehoshaphat the son of Asa began to reign over Judah in the fourth year of Ahab king of Israel. Jehoshaphat was thirty and five years old when he began to reign, and he reigned twenty and five years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name was Azubah the daughter of Shilhi.

1 Kings 22:51 Ahaziah the son of Ahab began to reign over Israel in Samaria the seventeenth year of Jehoshaphat king of Judah and reigned two years over Israel.
