TORAH PORTION

Leviticus 23:6,7 And on the fifteenth day of the same month is **the feast of unleavened bread** unto the LORD: Seven days ye must eat unleavened bread. In the first day ye shall have an holy convocation: Ye shall do no servile work therein. But ye shall offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD seven days: In the seventh day is an holy convocation: Ye shall do no servile work therein.

Exodus 12:17 And ye shall observe **the feast of unleavened bread, for in this selfsame day have I brought your armies out of the land of Egypt**: Therefore shall ye observe this day in your generations by an ordinance **forever**.

Exodus 12:40,41 Now the sojourning of the children of Israel, who dwelt in Egypt, was four hundred and thirty years. And it came to pass at the end of the four hundred and thirty years, even the selfsame day it came to pass, that **all the hosts of the LORD went out from the land of Egypt**.

Exodus 13:17-19 And it came to pass, when Pharaoh (sent the people away), that God led them not through the way of the land of the Philistines, although that was near, for God said, Lest peradventure (the people) repent when they see war, and they return to Egypt: But **God led (the people)** about, through the way of the wilderness of the Red sea: And the children of Israel went up **harnessed out of the land of Egypt**. And Moses took the bones of Joseph with him: For he had straitly sworn the children of Israel, saying, God will surely visit you; And ye shall carry up my bones away hence with you.

Exodus 14:10-13 And when Pharaoh drew nigh, the children of Israel lifted up their eyes, and, behold, the Egyptians marched after them, and they were sore afraid: And the children of Israel cried out unto the LORD. They said to Moses, Is it because there are no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us in bringing us out of Egypt? Is not this what we said to you in Egypt: Leave us alone that we

may serve the Egyptians? For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness. And Moses said to the people, Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the LORD, which he will work for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall never see again.

Exodus 14:15,16 And the LORD said unto Moses, Wherefore criest thou unto me? Speak unto the children of Israel, that they go forward: But lift thou up thy rod, and **stretch out your hand** over the sea, and divide it: And the children of Israel shall go on dry ground through the midst of the sea.

Exodus 14:19-22 The angel of God, who went before the camp of Israel, moved and went behind them, and the pillar of cloud moved from before them, and stood behind them. It came between the camp of Egypt and the camp of Israel, and there was **the cloud and the darkness**, yet gave it **light by night**: And the one didn't come near the other all the night. Moses **stretched out his hand** over the sea, and the LORD caused **the sea to go back by a strong east wind all the night, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided**. The children of Israel went into the midst of the sea **on the dry ground**, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand, and on their left.

Exodus 14:23 And the Egyptians pursued, and went in after them to the midst of the sea, even all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen.

Exodus 14:26-29 The LORD said to Moses, **Stretch out your hand** over the sea, that the waters may come again on the Egyptians, on their chariots, and on their horsemen. And Moses **stretched forth his hand** over the sea, and the sea returned to his strength when the morning appeared; and the Egyptians fled against it, and the LORD overthrew the Egyptians in the middle of the sea. And the waters returned, and covered the chariots, and the horsemen, and all the host of Pharaoh that came into the sea after them, there remained not so much as one of them. But the children of Israel **walked on dry ground in the middle of the sea, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand, and on their left**.

Exodus 3:20 And I will stretch out my hand, and smite Egypt with all my wonders

Exodus 7:5 And the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I **stretch forth mine hand** upon Egypt.

Exodus 7:19 And the LORD spake unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Take thy rod, **and stretch out your hand** upon the waters of Egypt.

Exodus 9:15 For now I will stretch out my hand, that I may smite thee and thy people.

Exodus 10:12 And the LORD said unto Moses, **Stretch out your hand** over the land of Egypt for the locusts.

Exodus 10:21 And the LORD said unto Moses, **Stretch out your hand** toward heaven, that there may be darkness over the land of Egypt.

Exodus 12:34 The people took their dough before it was leavened, their kneading troughs being **bound up in their clothes on their shoulders**.

Exodus 15:1-3 Then sang Moses and the children of Israel this song unto the LORD, and spoke, saying, I will sing unto the LORD, for he hath triumphed gloriously: The horse and his rider hath he thrown into the sea. **The LORD is my strength and song, and he is become my salvation:** He is my God, and I will prepare him an habitation, my father's God, and I will exalt him. The LORD is a man of war: The LORD is his name.

Matthew 2:27,28 And he said unto them, The sabbath was made for man, and not man for the sabbath: Therefore, the Son of man is Lord also of the sabbath.

Matthew 12:8-14 For the **Son of man is Lord** even of the sabbath day. And it came to pass also **on another sabbath**, that he entered into the synagogue and taught: and behold, there was a man whose

right hand was withered. And the scribes and Pharisees watched him, whether **he would heal on the sabbath day**, that they might find an accusation against him. And they asked him, saying, **Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath days?** And he said unto them, What man shall there be among you, that shall have one sheep, and if it fall into a pit **on the sabbath day**, will he not lay hold on it, and lift it out? Is it **lawful to do good on the sabbath days**, or **to do evil?** To **save life**, or **to kill?** But they held their peace. And when he had looked round about on them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts, he saith unto the man, which had the withered hand, **Stretch forth thine hand.** And he **stretched it forth**, and it was restored whole, like as the other. Then the Pharisees went out, *filled with madness*, and held a council against him, with those Herodians against him, how *they might destroy him*.

Psalm 118:14-16 The LORD is my strength and song, and is become my salvation. The voice of rejoicing and salvation **is in the tabernacles** of the righteous: ***The right hand*** of the LORD doeth valiantly. *The right hand* of the LORD is exalted: *The right hand* of the LORD doeth valiantly.

Isaiah 12:2-6 Behold, God is my salvation, I will trust, and will not be afraid, **for the LORD GOD is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation.** With joy you will draw water **from the wells of salvation**. And you will say in that day: Give thanks to the LORD, call upon his name, make known his deeds among the peoples, proclaim that his name is exalted. Sing praises to the LORD, for he has done gloriously, let this be made known in all the earth. Shout, and sing for joy, O inhabitant of Zion, **for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.**

Exodus 15:22-24 Then Moses made Israel set out from the Red Sea, and they went into the wilderness of Shur. They went **three days in the wilderness and found no water**. When they came to Marah, they could not drink the water of Marah because it was bitter, therefore it was named Marah. And the people grumbled against Moses, saying, What shall we drink?

Exodus 16:2,3 And the whole congregation of the children of Israel **murmured** against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness: And the children of Israel said to them, **Would to God we had died by the hand of the LORD** in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the flesh pots, and when we did eat bread to the full, for ye have brought us forth into this wilderness, to kill this whole assembly with hunger.

Exodus 16:4 Then said the LORD unto Moses: Behold, I will cause to rain bread from heaven for you, and the people shall go out and gather **a day's portion** every day, that I may prove them, whether they will walk in My law, or not.

Matthew 6:19-21 Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

Psalm 62:9,10 Those of low estate are but a breath, those of high estate are a delusion, in the balances they go up, they are together lighter than a breath. Put no trust in extortion; set no vain hopes on robbery, **if riches increase, set not your heart on them.**

Exodus 16:25-29 Moses said, Eat that **today**, for **today** is a Sabbath to the LORD. **Today you shall not find it in the field.** Six days you shall gather it, but on the seventh day is the Sabbath. In it there shall be none. It happened on the seventh day, that some of the people went out to gather, and they found none. The LORD said to Moses, How long do you refuse to keep my commandments and my laws? Behold, because the LORD has given you the Sabbath, therefore he gives you on the sixth day the bread of two days. Everyone stay in his place. Let no one go out of his place on the seventh day.

Exodus 17:1b-3 And there was no water for the people to drink. Why the people did chide with Moses, and said, Give us water that we may drink. And Moses said to them, Why chide you with me? Why do ye tempt the LORD? And the people thirsted there for water, and the people murmured against Moses, and said, Why is this that you have brought us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our cattle with thirst?

Exodus 17:4-8 And Moses cried unto the LORD, saying, What shall I do to this people? They be almost ready to stone me. And the LORD said unto Moses, Go on before the people, and take with you of the elders of Israel, and thy rod, with which you smote the river, take in your hand, and go. Behold, I will stand before you there on the rock in Horeb, and you **shalt smite the rock**, and there shall come water out of it, that the people may drink. And Moses did so in the sight of the elders of Israel. And he called the name of the place Massah, and Meribah, because of the chiding of the children of Israel, and because they tempted the LORD, saying, **Is the LORD among us, or not? Then came Amalek, and fought with Israel in Rephidim.**

Exodus 17:15,16 And Moses built an altar, and called the name of it Jehovahnissi: For he said, Because the LORD has sworn that the LORD will have war with Amalek from generation to generation.

2 KINGS

1 Kings 22:51-53 Ahaziah the son of Ahab began to reign over Israel in Samaria the seventeenth year of Jehoshaphat king of Judah and reigned **two years** over Israel. And he did evil in the sight of the LORD, and walked in the way of his father, and in the way of his mother, and in the way of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin: For he served Baal, and worshipped him, and provoked to anger the LORD God of Israel, according to all that his father had done.

2 Kings 1:1,2 Then Moab rebelled against Israel after the death of Ahab. And Ahaziah fell down through a lattice in his upper chamber that was in Samaria, and was sick: And **he sent messengers**, and said unto them, Go, enquire of Baalzebub the god of Ekron whether I shall recover of this disease.

2 Kings 1:3,4 But the angel of the LORD said to Elijah the Tishbite, Arise, go up to meet **the messengers** of the king of Samaria, and say unto them, Is it not because there is not a God in Israel, that ye go to enquire of Baalzebub the god of Ekron? Now therefore thus saith the LORD, Thou shalt not come down from that bed on which thou art gone up, but shalt surely die. And Elijah departed.

2 Kings 1:9 Then the king sent unto him a captain of fifty with his fifty. And he went up to him: And, behold, he (Elijah) sat on **the top of an hill**. And he spoke unto him, Thou man of God, the king hath said, **Come down**.

2 Kings 1:10 And Elijah answered and said to the captain of fifty, If I be a man of God, then let fire come down from heaven, and consume thee and thy fifty. And there came down fire from heaven and consumed him and his fifty.

2 Kings 1:11,12 Again also he sent unto him another captain of fifty with his fifty. And he answered and said unto him, O man of God, thus hath the king said, Come down quickly. And Elijah answered and said unto them, If I be a man of God, let fire come down from heaven, and consume thee and thy fifty. And the fire of God came down from heaven and consumed him and his fifty.

2 Kings 1:13 And he sent again a captain of the third fifty with his fifty. And the third captain of fifty went up, and came and fell on his knees before Elijah, and besought him, and said unto him, O man of God, I pray thee, let my life, and the life of these fifty thy servants, be precious in thy sight.

2 Kings 1:17 So he (Ahaziah)died according to the word of the LORD which Elijah had spoken.

2 Kings 2:1,2 And it came to pass, when the LORD would take up Elijah into heaven by a whirlwind, that Elijah went with Elisha from Gilgal. And Elijah said unto Elisha, Tarry here, I pray thee, for the LORD hath sent me to Bethel.

2 Kings 2:4 And Elijah said unto him, Elisha, tarry here, I pray thee, for the LORD hath sent me to Jericho.

2 Kings 2:6 And Elijah said unto him, Tarry, I pray thee, here, for the LORD hath sent me to Jordan.

2 Kings 2:8,9a And Elijah took his mantle, and wrapped it together, and smote the waters, and they were divided hither and thither, so that they two went over on dry ground. And it came to pass, when they were gone over, that Elijah said unto Elisha, Ask what I shall do for thee, before I be taken away from thee.

2 Kings 2:9b-11 And Elisha said, I pray thee, let a double portion of thy spirit be upon me. And he said, Thou hast asked a hard thing: Nevertheless, if thou see me when I am taken from thee, it shall be so unto thee, but if not, it shall not be so. And it came to pass, as they still went on, and talked, that, behold, there appeared a chariot of fire, and horses of fire, and parted them both asunder; and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.

2 Kings 2:13,14 He took up also the mantle of Elijah that fell from him, and went back, and stood by the bank of Jordan, And he took the mantle of Elijah that fell from him, and smote the waters, and said, Where is the LORD God of Elijah? And when he also had smitten the waters, they parted hither and thither: and Elisha went over.

2 Kings 2:19-22 And the men of the city said unto Elisha, Behold, I pray thee, the situation of this city is pleasant, as my lord seeth: But the water is naught, and the ground barren. And he said, Bring

me a new cruse, and put salt therein. And they brought it to him. And he went forth unto the spring of the waters, and cast the salt in there, and said, Thus saith the LORD, I have healed these waters, there shall not be from thence any more death or barren land. So the waters were healed unto this day, according to the saying of Elisha which he spoke.

2 Kings 2:23,24 And he went up from thence unto Bethel: And as he was going up by the way, there came forth little children out of the city, and mocked him, and said unto him, Go up, thou bald head, go up, thou bald head. And he turned back, and looked on them, and cursed them in the name of the LORD. And there came forth two she bears out of the wood, and tare forty and two children of them.

2 Kings 3:1 Now Jehoram the son of Ahab began to reign over Israel in Samaria the eighteenth year of Jehoshaphat king of Judah, and reigned twelve years.

2 Kings 3:4,5 And Mesha king of Moab was a sheep master, and rendered unto the king of Israel an hundred thousand lambs, and an hundred thousand rams, with the wool. But it came to pass, when Ahab was dead, that the king of Moab rebelled against the king of Israel.

2 Kings 3:6,7 And king Jehoram went out of Samaria the same time, and numbered all Israel. And he went and sent to Jehoshaphat the king of Judah, saying, The king of Moab hath rebelled against me: Wilt thou go with me against Moab to battle? And he said, I will go up: I am as thou art, my people as thy people, and my horses as thy horses.

2 Kings 3:10,11 And the king of Israel said, Alas! That the LORD hath called these three kings together, to deliver them into the hand of Moab! But Jehoshaphat said, Is there not here a prophet of the LORD, that we may enquire of the LORD by him? And one of the king of Israel's servants answered and said, Here is Elisha the son of Shaphat, which poured water on the hands of Elijah.

2 Kings 3:14,15 And Elisha said, As the LORD of hosts lives, before whom I stand, surely, were it not that I regard the presence of Jehoshaphat the king of Judah, I would not look toward thee, nor see thee. But now bring me a minstrel. And it came to pass, when the minstrel played, that the hand of the LORD came upon him.

2 Kings 3:22,23 And they rose up early in the morning, and the sun shone upon the water, and the Moabites saw the water on the other side as red as blood: And they said, This is blood: The kings are surely slain, and they have smitten one another: now therefore, Moab, to the spoil.

2 Kings 3:26 And when the king of Moab saw that the battle was too sore for him, he took with him seven hundred men that drew swords, to break through even unto the king of Edom: But they could not.

2 Kings 3:27 Then he took his eldest son that should have reigned in his stead, and offered him for a burnt offering upon the wall. **And there was great indignation against Israel:** And they departed from him, and returned to their own land.

2 Kings 4:1 Now there cried a certain woman of the wives of the sons of the prophets unto Elisha, saying, Thy servant my husband is dead, and thou knowest that thy servant did fear the LORD: And the creditor is come to take unto him my two sons to be bondmen.

2 Kings 4:2-4 And Elisha said unto her, What shall I do for thee? Tell me, what hast thou in the house? And she said, Thine handmaid hath not anything in the house, save a pot of oil. Then he said, Go, borrow thee vessels abroad of all thy neighbors, even empty vessels, borrow not a few. And when thou art come in, thou shalt shut the door upon thee and upon thy sons, and shalt pour out into all those vessels, and thou shalt set aside that which is full.

2 Kings 4:7 Then she came and told the man of God. And he said, Go, sell the oil, and pay thy debt, and live thou and thy children of the rest.

2 Kings 4:8 And it fell on a day, that Elisha passed to Shunem, where was a great woman, and she constrained him to eat bread. And so it was, that as oft as he passed by, he turned in thither to eat bread. And she said unto her husband, Behold now, I perceive that this is a holy man of God, which passes by us continually.

2 Kings 4:10,11 Let us make a little chamber, I pray thee, on the wall, and let us set for him there a bed, and a table, and a stool, and a candlestick: And it shall be, when he cometh to us, that he shall turn in thither. **And it fell on a day**, that he came thither, and he turned into the chamber, and lay there.

2 Kings 4:14-17 And he said, What then is to be done for her? And Gehazi answered, Verily she hath no child, and her husband is old. And he said, Call her. And when he had called her, she stood in the door. And he said, About this **season**, according to the time of life, you shall embrace a son. And she said, Nay, my lord, you man of God, do not lie unto thine handmaid. And the woman conceived and bare a son at that **season** that Elisha had said unto her, according to the time of life.

2 Kings 4:18 And when the child was grown, **it fell on a day**, that he went out to his father to the reapers. And he said unto his father, My head, my head. And he said to a lad, Carry him to his mother. And when he had taken him, and brought him to his mother, he sat on her knees till noon and then died.

2 Kings 4:22,23 And she called unto her husband, and said, Send me, I pray thee, one of the young men, and one of the asses, that I may run to the man of God, and come again. And he said, Wherefore wilt thou go to him today? It is neither **new moon, nor sabbath**. And she said, It shall be well.

2 Kings 4:25,26 And it came to pass, when the man of God saw her afar off, that he said to Gehazi his servant, Behold, yonder is that Shunammite: Run now, I pray thee, to meet her, and say unto her, Is it well with thee? Is it well with thy husband? Is it well with the child? **And she answered, It is well.**

2 Kings 4:27 And when she came to the man of God to the hill, she caught him by the feet: But Gehazi came near to thrust her away. And the man of God said, Let her alone, for her soul is vexed within her: And the LORD hath hid it from me, and hath not told me.

2 Kings 4:29 Then he said to Gehazi, Gird up thy loins, and take my staff in thine hand, and go thy way: If thou meet any man, salute him not, and if any salute thee, answer him not again: And lay my staff upon the face of the child.

2 Kings 4:31,32 And Gehazi passed on before them, and laid the staff upon the face of the child, but there was neither voice, nor hearing. Wherefore he went again to meet him, and told him, saying, The child is not awaked. And when Elisha had come into the house, behold, the child was dead, and laid upon his bed.

2 Kings 4:40,41 So they poured out for the men to eat. And it came to pass, as they were eating of the pottage, that they cried out, and said, O thou man of God, there is death in the pot. And they could not eat thereof. But he said, Then bring meal. And he cast it into the pot, and he said, Pour out for the people, that they may eat. And there was no harm in the pot.

2 Kings 4:42-44 And there came a man from Baalshalisha, and brought the man of God bread of the firstfruits, twenty loaves of barley, and full ears of corn in the husk thereof. And he said, Give unto the people, that they may eat. And his servitor said, What, should I set this before an hundred men? He said again, Give the people, that they may eat: for thus saith the LORD, They shall eat, and shall leave thereof. So he set it before them, and they did eat, and left thereof, according to the word of the LORD.
